WALL STREET

NEW YORK, Sept. 7 (AP)—The stock market today opened an indecisive start. Most prices were at or near their tops for the day at the close of trading.

Leadership was provided by U. S. Steel and Chrysler which gained around a point or better. Bethlehem, Republic, General Motors and steelmaker added fractions.

Other sections also improved. The rails remained quiet with soft areas appearing here and there. The rubber group, particularly Goodyear, was active. Petroleum, against the higher trend, in the inactive motion picture. Paramount stood out with a fractional gain.

Total transactions were at the rate of around 30,000 shares, considerably higher than Friday's session and well above most of the half days of the past week.

On the higher side of the market were American Express, Southern Railway, Union Pacific, Southern Bell, Johns-Manville, General Electric and Eastman-Kodak. Commodities and Southern gained on the sale of one block of new issues.

Lower were Great Northern, United Standard Oil, U. S. Steel, Republic, Kennecott and Consolidated Edison.

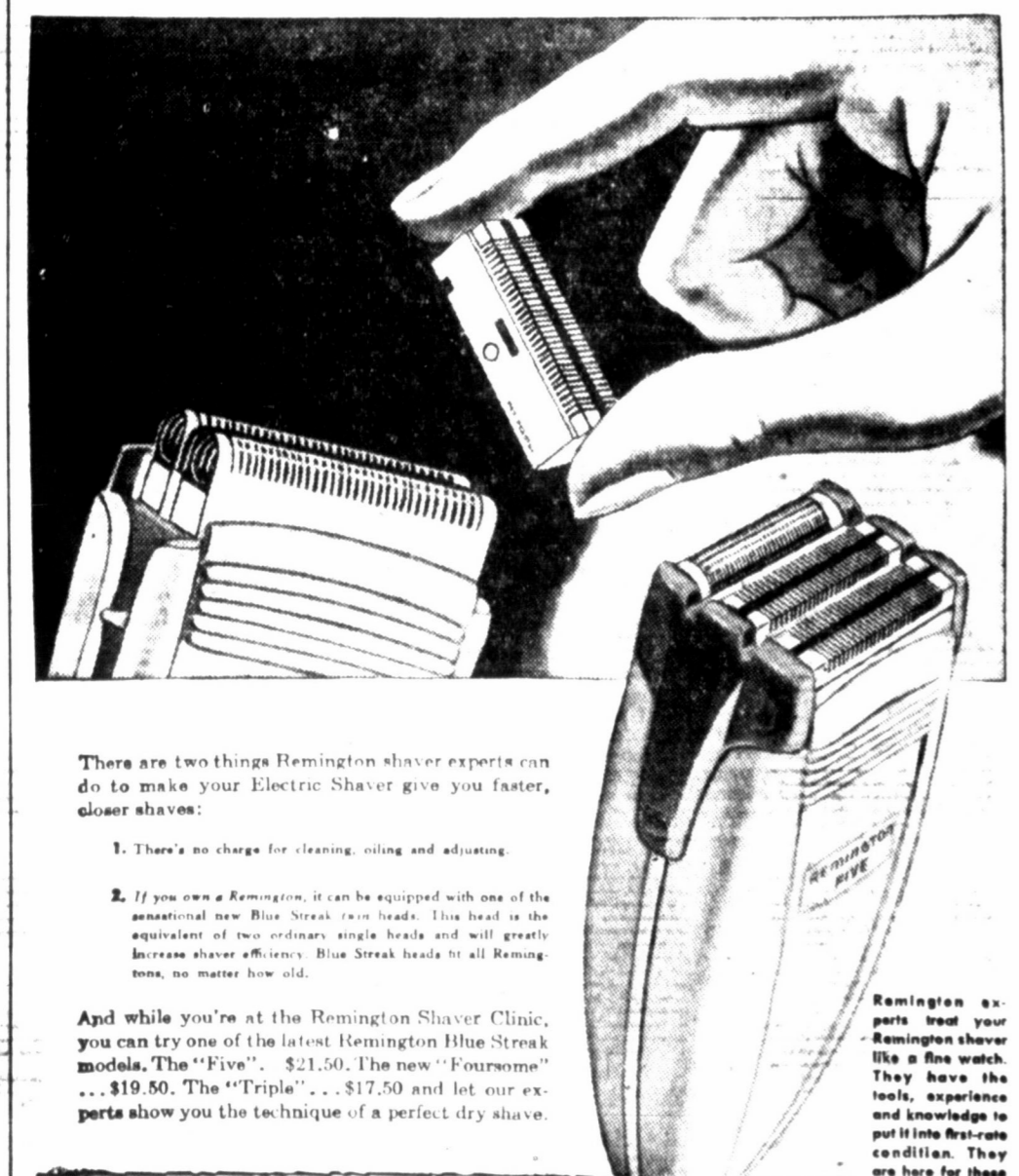

## Pirates Move Into Second by Whipping St. Louis Cards 6-2

Pennant fever is spreading in Pittsburgh today for the first time since 1938. Not since the Pirates blew the pennant to the Chicago Cubs ten years ago in the last week of the season has a Pirate entry been a strong contender for the flag at this stage of the race.

The Pirates are in second place today—four games behind the league-leading Boston Braves.

Manager Billy Meyer's hustling crew wrested the runner-up slot from the Brooklyn Dodgers last night, beating the floundering St. Louis Cardinals, 6-2. The Dodgers, who were idle, trail the Pirates by .007 of a percentage point.

The venerable Fritz Ostermuelier stopped the Cardinals on seven hits last night as the Pirates made it three in a row over the Cardinals.

Ostermuelier held the Cards scoreless until the ninth when Don Lang followed a single by Stan Musial with his fourth home run of the season.

## Oilers, Dukes Clash Tonight In First Play-Off Encounter

The Pampa Oilers and Albuquerque Dukes clash tonight in the first game of the West Texas-New Mexico League Shughnessy play-offs.

Beginning at 8:15 (9:15 Pampa time) little Roy Parker, diminutive Oiler southpaw, will take to the mound and attempt to stifle the big Duke bats that have pounded out 55 victories in the 1948 campaign.

Parker will be striving for his 11th triumph of the season as compared with 12 setbacks. Manager Herschel Martin has not yet released his starting pitcher although it is believed that either Frank Shone or Virgil Butcher will toss for the initial tilt. Whichever one does start, the other will probably draw the assignment Thursday night.

At the same time the Dukes and Oilers clash, the Amarillo Gold Sox will be playing host to the Lubbock Hubbers in the second half of the play-off round. The Gold Sox then move on to Lubbock after their game with the Sox Park and engage the Hubs for three games, if necessary, in Rosenthal Park in Lubbock.

In the opening game, Skelly broke the ice for four runs in the fourth inning to whitewash Cabot as both teams were held scoreless up to that point.

The Phillips club jumped to an early 3-0 lead over Furr and managed to stave off a fifth inning rally to triumph in a well-played contest.

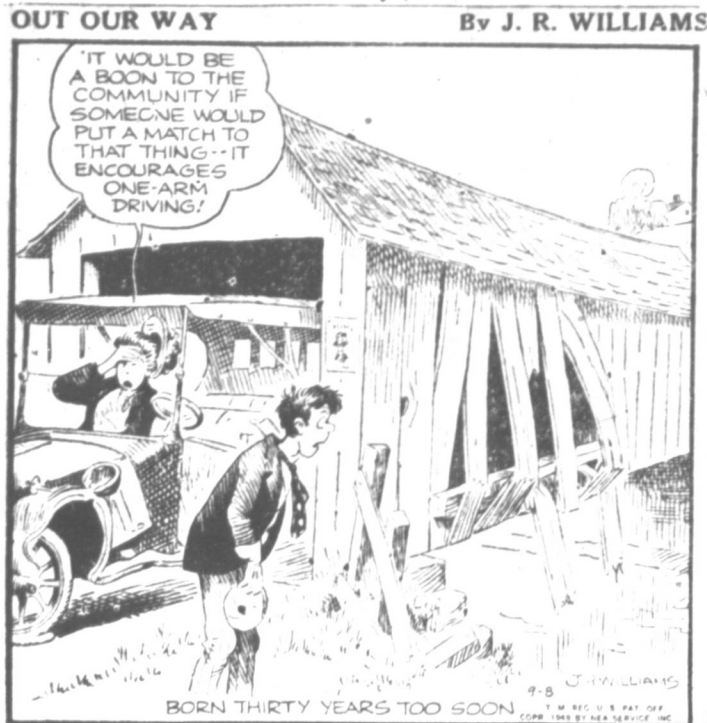

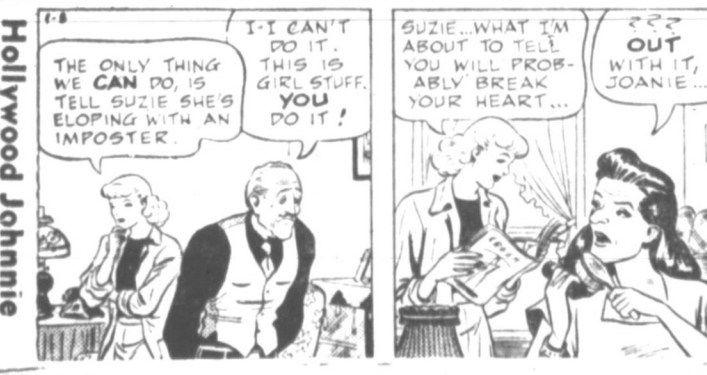
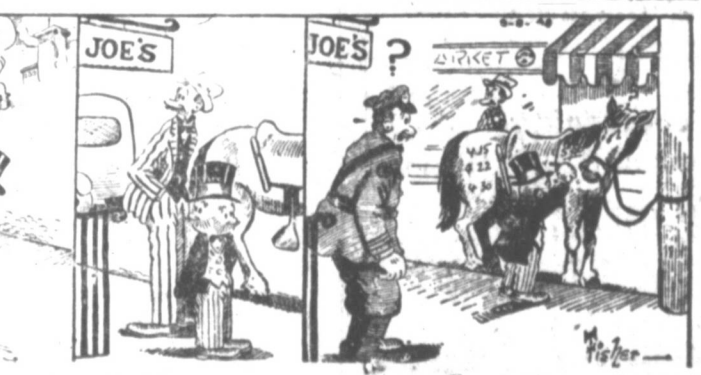
