Yorkshire Farm Lads, London Truck Drivers Will Lead Assault On Europe During Invasion

ON ENGLAND'S SOUTH COAST, June 17 (AP)—When the hour of invasion strikes, the high name of a navy made famous by men like Drake and Nelson will rest for one climactic moment in the hands of purposeful young Yorkshire farm lads and London truck drivers, who have been building the new naval assault tradition with Dieppe and North Africa for a starter. These recruits—mostly men of last year's draft—have been training by the hundreds at scattered coastal bases to man the swiftly increasing fleet of shallow draft landing craft for men and tanks which is being turned out in both Britain and the United States.

Feed Wheat To Cost \$1.05 In Texas District

WASHINGTON, June 17 (AP)—The war food administration said prices and terms for the sale of an additional 50,000,000 bushels of wheat for feeding livestock will be the same as for the 100,000,000 bushels sold about three months ago. The prices range from 95 cents in north Minnesota to \$1.11 in New England, Florida and southern California.

Chapter 16 THE morning papers of December 26 announced that General MacArthur had proclaimed Manila an open city and by that time I had begun to realize that we did not have the forces to defend Manila and to suspect that the path to the capital was being thrown open to the Japanese in the hope that when they arrived in the city without having to fight, they would be well under control of their officers and would observe discipline; whereas if they came in fighting and overwhelmed our forces they would be more likely to rape and kill and loot. Meanwhile, the communiques said "Lines holding firm on all fronts."

"LOOK," he said, "all I can say is this. If I were in your position I would try to locate headquarters on Bataan. I am leaving Manila myself in a few minutes." "Bataan?" we said. "We thought headquarters were at the Lingayen front. And where the hell is Bataan?" "Look at Mariveles on your maps and you'll find Bataan," the major said.

In your country I would be looked on as an Oriental and a half-caste. There are two worlds. Your white one and the Oriental one."

Planting Late In Panhandle

AUSTIN, June 17 (AP)—Varied progress of Texas crops was reported in the week ended June 13 when insects, moisture and weather played important roles in the agricultural picture.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture noted fair to excellent growth among feed crops and peanut but cotton, the state's biggest field crop, made irregular gains. Field work generally advanced except in a few western and northern Panhandle counties where drought held up planting and in parts of the north central and northeast districts where continued rains and excessive moisture prevented cultivating and churning.

The crop was approaching maturity in the high plains, with some delay resulting from recent rains. Late wheat was helped by scattered rains in a number of plains counties.
