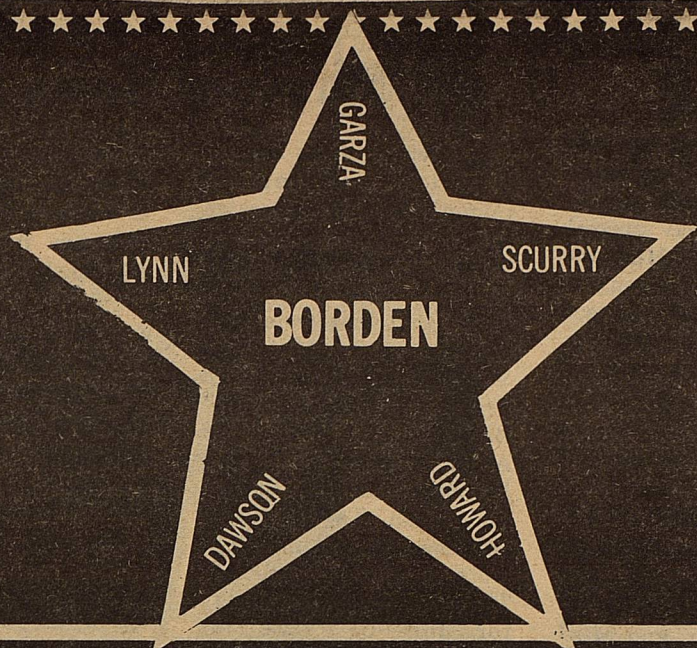

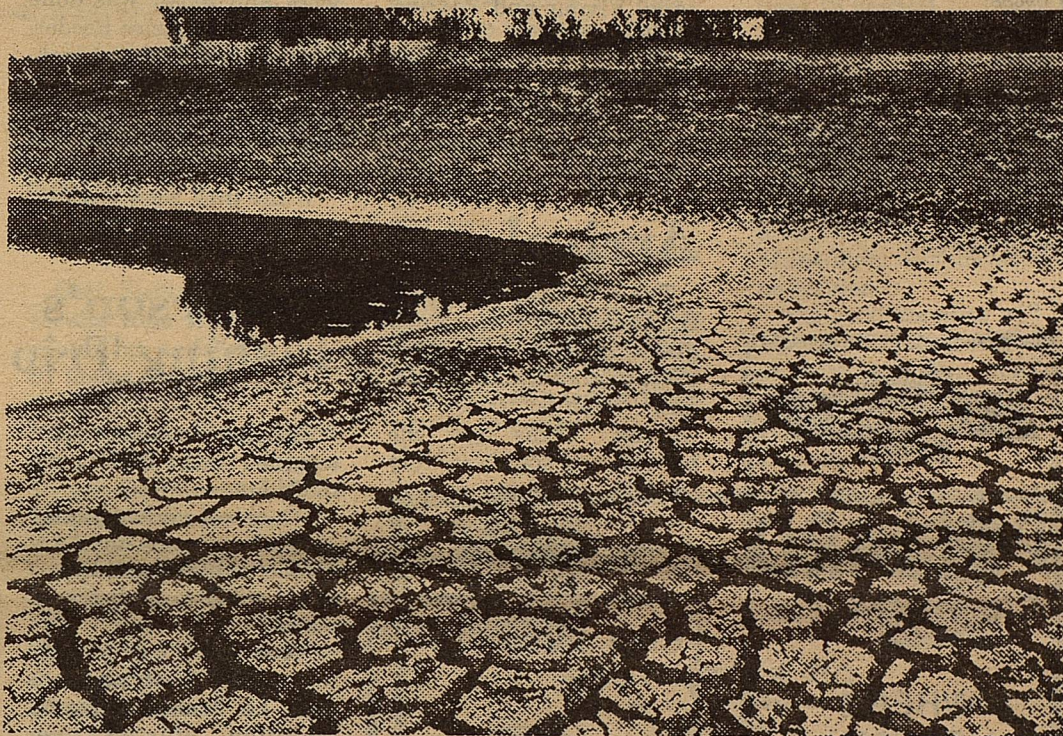
Age groups will be Pee Wee - 8 years old and under;

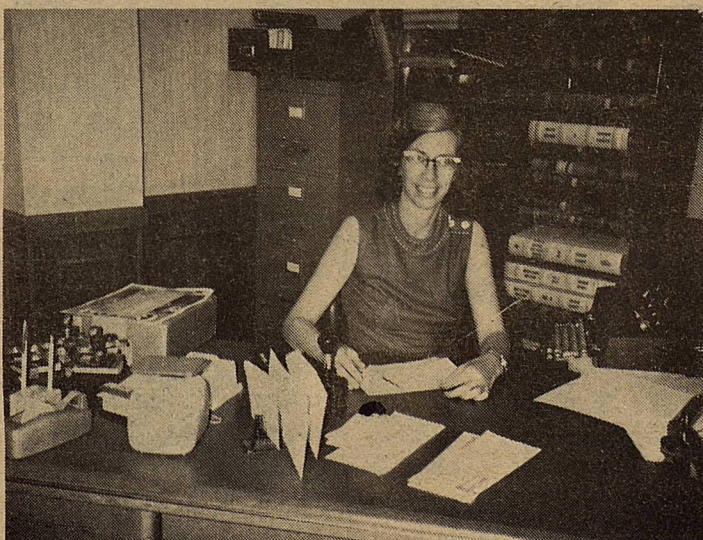
Herridge Appointed New Deputy Clerk

Federal Disaster Programs Offer Drought Aid to Farmer, Rancher

Various Federal programs are available to help farmers and ranchers whose operations have been crippled by the drought, Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown has reported.

"The Texas Department of Agriculture has no responsibility in administering these programs, but many producers have been calling our offices wanting to know what aid is offered," Brown said.

He recommended that eligible persons check with the appropriate county or district office for details. "We want to provide a brief outline of the programs, but each one has its own regulations that must be followed."

The Emergency Livestock Feeding Program is administered by the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS). Ranchers suffering at least a 40 per cent loss on normal feed production can file in any county where they own cattle and land affected by drought.

Payment is 50 per cent, up to two cent a pound of feedgrain equivalent. Each county has set a carrying capacity for various types of pastures and rangeland, and herd numbers must be considered.

A disaster declaration for the entire county is not necessary. During a drought, a county committee will determine the level below normal that

ranges are showing. The concurrence of other agency officials and the district ASCS director is necessary. The report is then sent to the state committee for concurrence.

Any feed produced by an applicant or feed on hand counts against eligibility for assistance. All of a rancher's holdings in the U.S. are considered in computing eligibility. Receipts for purchased feed are necessary for emergency payments.

Two types of low-interest, long-term loans are available from Federal agencies. Farmers and ranchers not operating as businesses are eligible for loans under the Farmers Home Administration



A film entitled "Burn Emergency" was shown by Jim Mac and Frances Burkett. The film gave several steps in providing care for the burn victim. Remember the 3 B's and 3 C's when treating a person suffering from a thermal burn: (1) Burning stopped (2) Breathing maintained (3) Body examined (4) Cool (5) Cover (6) Carry
DON'T (1) Leave victim unattended.
DON'T (2) Remove material that is stuck to burned skin.
DON'T (3) Over cool. Cool only until skin temperature returns to normal.
DON'T (4) Apply

ointments. Only water.
DON'T (5) Give anything by mouth.
DON'T (6) Break blisters or remove dead skin.
DON'T (7) Delay transport.

The following percentages can be used in estimating the percentage of body surface damage an individual has sustained in a burn.

ADULT

Head 9 percent
Arms 9 percent each
Front of trunk 18 percent
Back of trunk 18 percent
Legs 18 percent each
Genital area 1 percent

SMALL CHILD

Head 18 percent
Arms 9 percent each
Front of trunk 18 percent
Back of trunk 18 percent
Legs 13.5 percent each
Genital area 1 percent

A burn covering the hands, feet, face, genital area, or 10 percent or more of the body is considered to be serious.

The next meeting will be Monday, September 8, 1980, at 8:00 p.m. The program will be given by Steve Hillhouse and Lisa Ludecke.

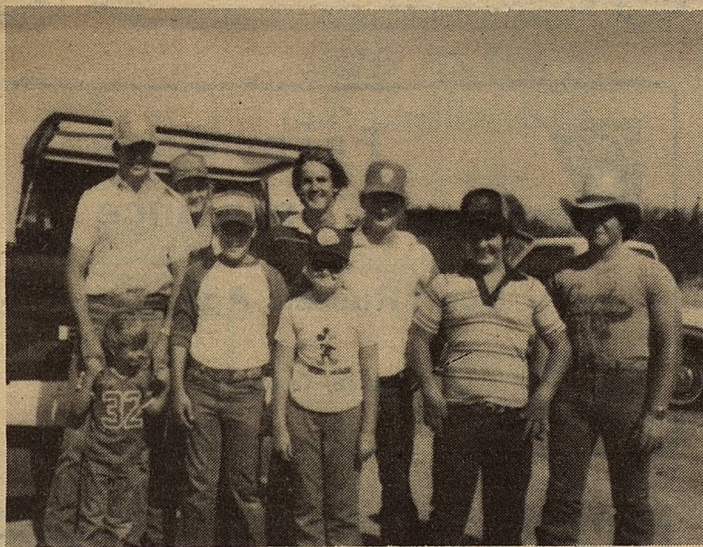



"FAMILY LIVING COMMITTEE"
2nd in a Series

After reading last weeks article - you may wonder "How does a Family Livnig Committee Work?"

remember when you first learned to drive a car? 1st you had to know what makes the car go. Then came the steps in starting the motor. And finally, after some practice, you learned how to drive. You also learned certain procedures to follow to be a good driver. In a way, committee work is like learning to drive a car because you must know how the committe works and wqat it must do to accomplish its mission.

The committee's role is divided into the following parts: 1. planning the program, 2. carrying out the plans, 3. evaluating results and 4. reporting accomplishments. Let's take a closer look at each of these:

PLANNING THE PROGRAM

Good things don't happen—they are planned. Long-range plans should be made. Where do we want our county to be in 5 or 6

years? After this is determined, then the committee should set some goals about what and how much it will try to achieve within a year.

The Family Living Committee is made up of people from the county that would include differents interests and different locations in the county.

After goals have been set, the committee would then select the educational methods and activities that would best to teach the people in the county. Here are a few examples of the different methods: short course, tour, result demonstration, workshop, arts & crafts fair, field day, etc.

The purpose of the Family living Committee is to work with Extension in order for Extension to best meet the needs of the people in the county and its communities.

(FmHa). They should contact the county FmHa director. Upon approval by the state office, and if funds are sufficient, loans can be processed without waiting for approval from Washington.

Small Business Administration (SBA) loans are available to agricultural producers, even those who operate as a business. Interest rates are 5 per cent for marginal producers; 8.5 per cent for those in better financial position who can get financing elsewhere. Losses are based on a formula including normal yields and recovery. Farmers and ranchers should first apply to the FmHa for loans. SBA will end its loan service to agricultural producers this fall.

Farmers participating in Federal programs for cotton, wheat, sorghum, peanuts, soybeans, and other grains are eligible for disaster payments as prescribed by law. ASCS county officials are the first stop for filing applications.



The world's largest operating windmill sits on a 150-foot tower on a North Carolina mountain. Built for the Department of Energy, it uses wing-shaped blades 200 feet in diameter to generate up to 2,000 kilowatts of electricity. It provides enough power for about 500 homes.

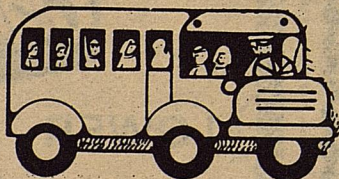

CALFHOOD VACCINATION URGED IN BRUCELLOSIS PROGRAM

Livestock producers are urged to begin a vaccination program against brucellosis as soon as their calves are eligible.

Vaccination with Strain 19 vaccine is an excellent tool in the control of brucellosis, and suggests that all dairy and beef producers contact their veterinarians and set up a schedule as part of their regular vaccination program.

According to the National Brucellosis Technical Commission, Strain 19 has proven to be about 95 percent effective against brucellosis under average field conditions. The state will pay for the vaccine as part of the revised brucellosis control program.

For best results, and to decrease the number of false reactors in later tests, dairy heifer calves should be vaccinated at four to six months of age, and beef heifer calves at four to eight months of age.

Calfhood vaccination is an important element of the revised Texas brucellosis control plan and should be considered as routine as vaccination for other diseases.

Also in the area of Livestock - there will be a Sheep Producers meeting Monday, August 18, 7:30 p.m. in the School Conference Room. Dr. George Ahlschwede, Sheep and Goat Specialist, will be the speaker. This program will be of interest to commercial operations and small flocks, including club lamb producers. Everyone with an interest in sheep production is invited to attend.

EMERGENCY FEED PROGRAM

Just a reminder that the Emergency Feed Program is available at all times to livestock producers. To be eligible for payment under the program, a livestock producer must have suffered a 40 percent loss in livestock feed. In addition, the producer must not have sufficient feed for eligible livestock and must be buying feed in quantities larger than normal.

To implement the feed program due to drought, the Texas State ASC Committee must concur with the County Committee request.

Producers who have suffered a loss of at least 40 percent in production of feed normally produced, including native pasture, and have begun purchasing feed, should make application at this time. The feeding period starts the date the application is filed.

Don't wear those "highest" heels too long.

Vary heel heights daily to exercise all muscles in leg and foot, says Nancy Brown, clothing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

Also, the higher the heel, the farther forward your body center of gravity shifts -- and the greater the tendency to fall.

Usual rights reserved.

Notice

Any person wishing to claim any statutory exemption under Article 2135 in counties employing the jury wheel system may do so by filing a sworn statement stating the nature of and claiming such exemption with the sheriff, the tax assessor-collector, or the district or county clerk of the county of his residence, in which event no card for such person shall be placed in the jury wheel for the ensuing year.

A person who is exempt from jury service on the ground of being over 65 years of age may establish a permanent exemption from jury service on that ground by claiming the exemption as provided by this article.

A person may claim the permanent exemption by filing with the county tax assessor-collector at any time a signed statement affirming that he or she is over 65 years of age and desires a permanent exemption on that ground.

The statement may be filed by mail or by personal delivery.
