



Do not have the birds cut up when you buy them from the butcher. Wipe each chicken thoroughly inside and out with a damp, clean cloth. Then cook up the liver, heart and gizzard in a little water until tender when pierced with a fork. Drain Cook rice according to directions on the package. Drain thoroughly and add the liver, etc. Next chop up onion and cook in 2 tablespoons butter or margarine. Chop up parsley fine and margarine that at the circumstance with salt papers and seasoning

mix both of these into the rice with salt, pepper and seasoning. Fill cavities of birds but do not pack stuffing in. Sew up openings and dust birds lightly with flour. Heat remaining butter or margarine in a deep, heavy pan that has a tight lid. Brown chickens well on both sides, then add ½ cup water. Cover tightly and cook over very slow heat 45 minutes or until tender.

Sagging Beams House Ailments

Everyone knows the ominou sound and feel of creaky, wrapped floor boards. Maybe you've noticed that when you walk across a certain patch of floor the bookcase rocks a bit or the lamp on the corner table rattles. Or perhaps you wonder why the doors on the ground floor stick. while those above do not. Or that the wall plaster is cracking.

All these symptoms generally mean that the floor beams have sagged and that you're in for trouble unless you do something about it. If the floor isn't too much out of level, you can raise it by using wedges between the girders and the joists. Use two wooden wedges under each joist and tap them into place from opposite directions.

Repeat this at each joist under the low area until the correct level has been reached. Secure the wedges so that vibration wil not loosen them. A nail through each one will do the trick. It is natural for wood to shrink

a little as it dries in a house, especially in a new one, and usually the use of wedges is all that is necessary.

In the event that the wooden girder has sagged so far as to make the use of wedges impractical, you will have to raise the girder to its original posi This is best done with metal column jacks which are available at many builders' supply firms and the larger mai order houses.

The column jack is a hollow metal column with a large screw in the lower end. When this is turned with a metal bar or ro it forces the upper end agains the girder, gradually pushing the latter back into place.

Girders should have a support at least every 10 feet, so that you may need more than one column to return the sagging girder to its original straight position. After this is done, metal column must be left position.





He started out with the same kind of propaganda that Robsevett did, like being for "the common man" and redistributing the wealth, etc. Like Roosevelt, he didn't actually give anyone any-thing, either. He just took it away from one man and handed it to another and the Romans who got something for nothing were telling other Romans whom Diocletian had

robbed what a great man he was and what he had done for the people-"Mah friends." The old emperor pulled the usual majarkey on the people, too, telling them that the whole empire should take part "in the blessings of that peace for which we have laborious-

ly striven." That sounds almost exactly like F. D. R. who, like Diocletian, talked a lot of peace while deliberately double-crossing the people into internationalism and war, from which we Americans to this very day have been unable to extricate ourselves.

Diocletian, you will note in history, told the Romans that it had become necessary for the government to take over the welfare and social security of the people, since they had not obtained very good results by their own free action, free business, free labor and individual independence, in general. In short, he made them forget that the whole mighty Roman empire had been built by following that exact formula of freedom which exact formula of freedom which he condemned, while offering his states exact proposal including welfare state proposal, including

price-fixing. The people were told that they needed protection against greedy capitalists and monopolies and eco-nomic royalists and reactionaries and that letting the government fix prices and "plan" the economy would be just what the doctor or-dered. Unfortunately the Romans weren't any smarter than a majority of us and they believed old Diocletian's fireside chats as implicity as a Pendergast gangster pelleves in the man who hit the

jackpot, Mr. Truman. The Mike Di Saile of the Roman Empire was one Maximianus, whom Diocletian put in charge of the Roman OPS. And sure enough, it wasn't long until, as one historian "The number of ministers, has it. of magistrates, of officers and of servants who filled different departments of the state, multiplied beyond the example of former






