MUNSAN, Korea — (AP) — Truce negotiators signed an agreement on a Korean cease-fire line today-and immediately came up with widely different ideas on how to put a cease-fire into effect.

United Nations delegates presented a seven-point plan for supervising an armistice. It included provisions for joint Allied-Red inspection teams with "free access to all parts of Korea.


