soil. The soil structure should be crumbly or granular so as to allow for deep root and water penetration and air circulation within the soil.

In some soils the particles "run together" to such an extent that little or no water or air can get into them. Planting deep rooted legumes such as sweet clover and alfalfa on such soils will and alraira on such soils will materially improve this condition. The use of legumes like vetch, winter peas, annual yellow sweet clover, and crimson clover add materially to the organic matter and nitrogen content of soils but do not necessive. tent of soils, but do not neces-sarily open subsoils, say the

agronomists.
Some soils have a poor-plant soil moisture relationship. soils at a shallow depth. These subsoils restrict the movement of subsoils restrict the movement of air, water and plant roots which also limits the activity of life in the soil. Growing of deep rooted legumes or grasses will punch these heavy subsoils full of holes and cause better movement of air, water and plant roots through the soil. roots through the soil.

Soil life, say the agronomists is made up of small animals and plants such as earth worms, and plants such as earth worms, bacteria and fungi. These organisms are a lot like plants for they too must have food, air and water to grow. Their food comes from legumes and other plant residue that is plowed under, as well as from the roots of these plants. Since air is a necessity, these small organisms are much more active at greater depths in soils that have been punched full of holes by deep rooted legumes. Growing deep rooted legumes such as sweet clover not only improves the soil home for the small organisms, but also increases the water penetration as well as water holding capacity and aeration of the soil. All are needed to maintain and increase the productivity of cropland soils.

Legumes, especially when plowed under as a green manure

crop, increase the organic matter in the soil. This organic matter helps hold together the small soil helps hold together the small soil particles and improves the soil structure by making it granular. Soils high in organic matter have better air circulation and air space and will absorb and hold water that is needed by the plants and soil life. Growing deep rooted legumes, pointed out the agronomists puts the organic matter from decaying roots deep in the soil and thus improve soil conditions.

"Those whom McCarthy accused and those who sympathized with them were successful in obscuring the vital distinction between the ules of evidence established to protect those accused in a court of law and the criteria which must be applied with regard to security risks. The Constitution safeguards individual rights and freedoms, but it loes not give anyone an inalienable right to government employment, no matter what his antecedents and associations may be, Unless a state has the right to demand loy-alty from its public servants, if must soon cease to exist. So that whereas the concept of guilt by association is rightly regarded as a preversion of justice, it is absurd to insist that no matter how questionable the associations of a government employe, or how manifestly disloyal his conduct he is entitled to continue to hold a position of trust. For example, whereas it would be unjust to condemn a bank clerk to prison merely because he has associated with thieves, it is only common prudence not to give him the key of the safe.

"In his indictment of Philip Jessup, Senator McCarthy made clear the vital distinction between 'guilt by association', and 'security risk by association', when he said: "'Since the beginning of this in-

quiry I have noted that there are those who contend that membership in communist front organizations and association with communists, is not a serious matter. There are sincere people who are disturbed because they think this is an attempt to establish guilt by association. They forget that we are dealing here with extremely sensitive positions where the individual has access to top secret material, the disclosure of which might well shove us into, or cause us even to lose a war. They forget that it is not a question of guilt by association, but a question of bad security risk by association,
"'I cannot emphasize too strong-

ly that a naive or gullible person who associates with the wrong people constantly, and thereby discloses-perhaps even unknowingly -secret information, has done the country the same damage as the party agent who divulges or obtains the same information." When the Administration refused


