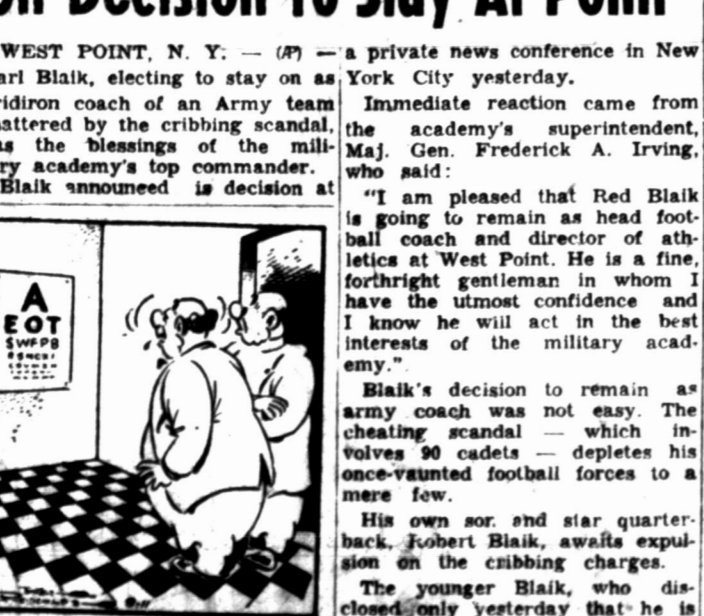

Retail Trend Seems Mixed As Industries

NEW YORK — (AP) — Retail business seems to be running as mixed as industry as a whole. On July sales figures, some merchants seem cherry, compared to the blues other merchants have.

Many merchants are having little luck moving some lines in which consumers have bought all they want. Department stores are now comparing their sales figures with last summer's lofty totals, when a war scare sent record crowds on buying sprees. They can't hope to equal last year's sales volume.

The figures on July sales of chain stores show 19 having higher dollar volume this summer than last, with gains ranging as much as 15 percent. Eight of the chains show July sales figures lower than a year ago, the biggest drop being 45 percent.

Most chains say this July their sales were running well ahead of July, 1949, a summer which merchants now like to think of as normal.

Dollar volume is no longer a comparative guide as to how much goods a merchant is selling. Prices are up on almost everything he has in his store, and price rises have been highest in some lines than in others.

Scare buying last summer also befuddles this summer's figures for comparison purposes. Department store sales look particularly bad just now, because so many of these stores carried the goods on which the customers were making a run in the days when they feared war would cut off supplies of such things as sheets, nylon, refrigerators, furniture, carpets and the like.

Egyptian Queen Expecting Baby

SAN REMO, Italy — (AP) — Queen Nouriman of Egypt, bride of King Farouk, is expecting a baby, members of her entourage have announced.

The beautiful queen, a commoner before she married Farouk May 6, has been honeymooning in Italy.

The king left aboard his royal yacht, the Far-Eh-bar, for the French Riviera. She remained in Italy because of her condition.

Recently in Venice the teenage queen Nouriman attended a fashion show, and a model presented her with a pair of baby's shoes. The queen's face lighted up with pleasure.

Farouk has been gambling spectacularly at the San Remo Casino. Before he left for the French Riviera, he stayed up until 4 a.m. at the tables. He has won \$35,000 or more during his stay, it is reported.

Acheson Predicts Red Try To Block Japanese Treaty

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Secretary of State Acheson has predicted Russia will try by a series of moves to disrupt the Japanese peace conference. It is to be held at San Francisco next month. He made this forecast at a news conference in answering questions on Soviet publication of President Truman's recent friendship letter and Soviet President Nikolai Shvernik's reply.

At the same time, Acheson declared that all the "peace" objectives which Shvernik stated—including the purposes of a five power pact—could be accomplished through the United Nations.

Ancient Statue Found In Egypt

CAIRO — (AP) — An 18-foot high sandstone statue of a monkey symbol animal of the ancient god Thoth has been unearthed near Mallawi in Southern Egypt. It is the biggest statue of its kind the department has dug up. Thoth was the scribe of the Egyptian gods, and himself the god of wisdom, or magic.

PITTSBURGH — (AP) — Senator Duff (R-Pa.) says traitors in this country who plot with Russia to destroy the United States should be hanged.

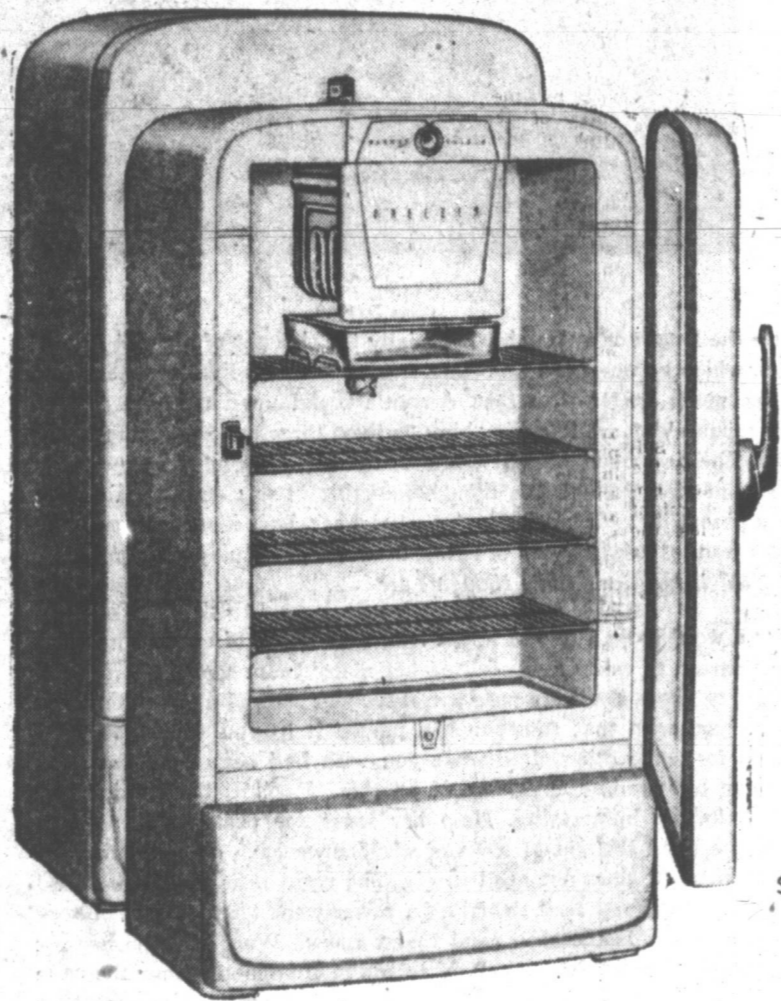
Duff also declared Russia has proposed "a fake cease-fire" in Korea and this week offered a "fake peace proposal."

The former Pennsylvania governor said it would be a "fatal mistake" for America to let up in its defense mobilization because of these Communist moves.

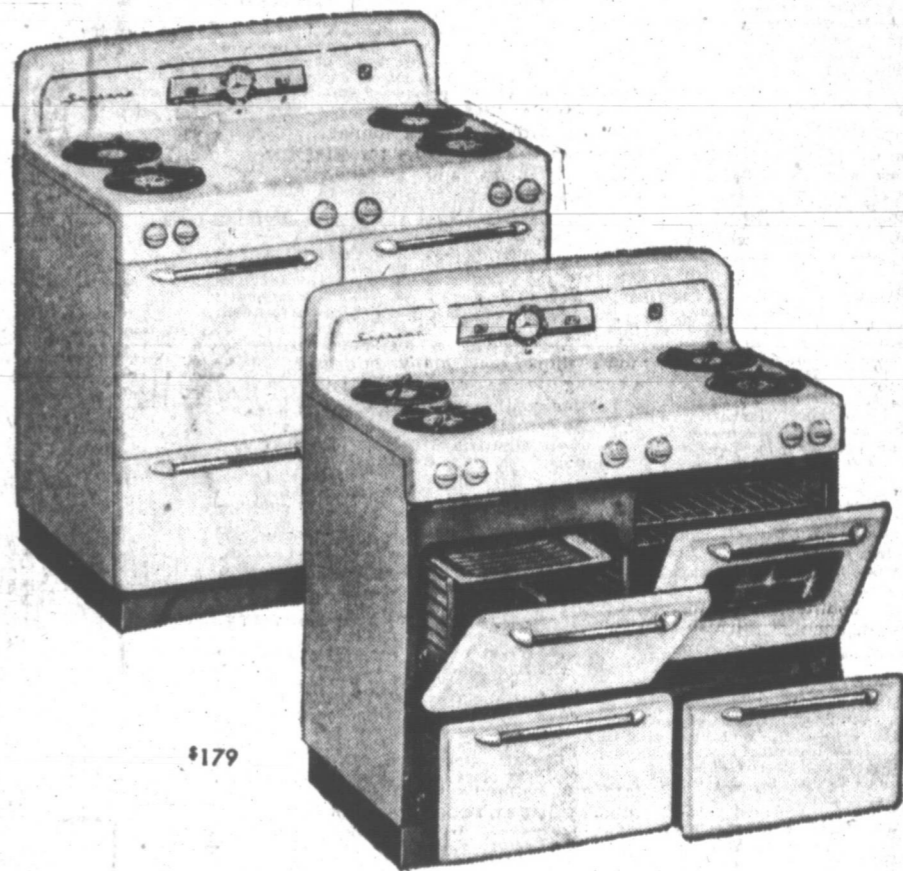
He said Americans "have fallen for enough Communist propaganda in this country since the end of World War II."

Jack Benny Says GI Morale Terrific

HOLLYWOOD — (AP) — "The morale of our men in Korea is terrific," reports Jack Benny, returned this week from entering troops in the front lines. "They know what they're fighting for," added the middle-aged comedian. "Naturally, they want the right kind of peace, and they're willing to continue fighting until they get it. "The one thing that nearly every one of them asks is: 'do the people back home know we're a war on?' I told them, 'you're darned right they do.' "In his six weeks absence from Hollywood, Benny figures he traveled between 25,000 and 30,000 miles with his entertainment troupe. They played before troops and wounded veterans in Hawaii, Japan, Okinawa and throughout Korea. It was a thorough job, virtually every possible audience of U.S. soldiers in the Orient has reached, with one exception, that was a group at Pusan who could not be reached because of landing conditions for aircraft.

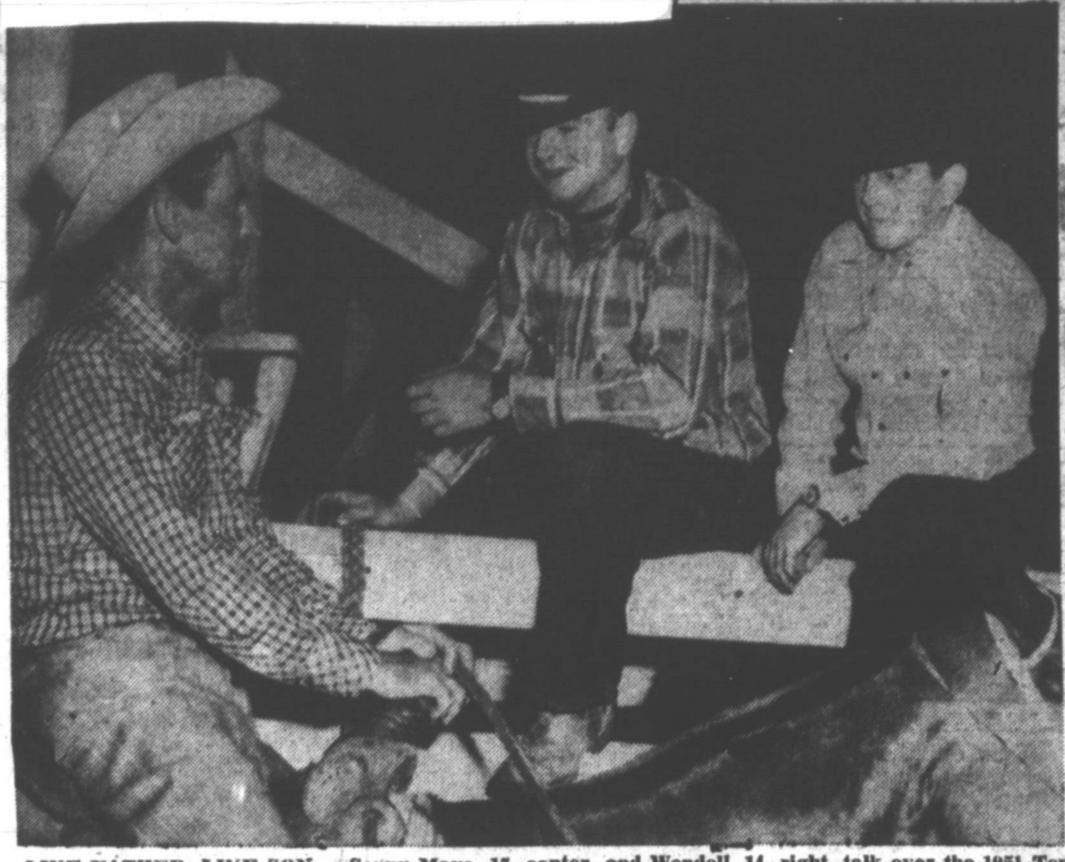
Hope Fades For Crops

AUSTIN — (AP) — One of the two largest Texas cotton crops since 1937 could be realized this year, the U. S. Department of Agriculture estimates. The agency, analyzing its prediction that Texas would produce 5,000,000 bales, said the figure could be achieved if average conditions prevailed after Aug. 31. State Agriculture Commissioner John White said he doubted the estimate would hold up in view of the August heat wave. He predicted a decline of one-half to one million bales under the forecast. A 8,000,000-bale crop would be 2,000,000 bales larger than last year and the 1940-49 average. The indicated yield per acre of 187 pounds of lint is 24 pounds below the 211 pounds harvested last year but is six pounds above the 1940-49 average. Assuming average abandonment on the 13,125,000 acres under cultivation July 1, acreage for harvest would be 12,810,000 acres, nearly double that of last year and the largest since 1932, when over 13 million acres were harvested.

Production in each crop reporting district except No. 7, was expected on Aug. 1 to be considerably above last year and also above the average for recent years. Poor prospects in district 7, generally covering the southern low rolling plains, the southern blacklands and south central counties, point to a crop somewhat below last year but above average. Production in districts in figure 1, the Northern Panhandle, 6, the Trans-Pecos area; and 10, the Valley, was expected to be at record high levels.

JACOBY ON BRIDGE Double High Bid Is A Good Rule

We have been discussing penalty doubles this week, and yesterday we got around to the late penalty double when both sides are in the auction. The general principle when both sides are competing is to double a high bid to show good defense. It follows that you take pains not to double when your values are as good for offense as for defense. Before we get tangled up in a web of words let's look at an example. West's double of three spades is a cooperative double. He asks his partner to bid any long suit, but to pass with balanced distribution. West should have had a stronger hand for his double. He would have enjoyed holding a stronger hand, but he had to do the best he could with what North dealt him. West knew that South was out stealing with his shutout bid of three spades. Therefore West took a chance on a flimsy double in the hope that his partner could find a bid. If West fails to double, South gets the hand for three spades and romps home with the rubber. North realized what was going on and was afraid that East

A Good Producer Necessary If Rodeo Is To Be Successful

No matter how much color and excitement there is about a rodeo, it takes the producer to make a good show. Goat Mayo, who is furnishing the stock in this year's show, is arena director and producer of the local show which is his sixteenth straight year. He started performing rolling Jan. 17 in the March of Dimes show in Oklahoma City and will go from here to Post, Texas, for the Southwestern Championship All Junior Rodeo. Mayo has 225 head of stock in the show here including horses, calves, bulls, yearlings and white face cattle used in the cutting horse contest. The stock was shipped to Pampa in trucks and arrived a day ahead of the first rodeo performance from Mayo's ranch in Petrolia, Texas. Mayo produces some of the top shows in Texas every year. He and his father-in-law, Bill Lyon, are partners and furnish stock for other outstanding shows as the Jarden Simmons college rodeo, Stanford Cowboy Reunion, the Seymour show and many others. They furnished stock for the first Stanford Reunion in 1930, and provided stock for a movie last spring. He makes his engagements sometimes a year in advance, but usually schedules performances in January, February and March. Mayo has never had a serious accident in his years of rodeo work. But he loses stock frequently; he had two horses killed last year when they ran into fences. He has lost two bulls this year, one broke a back in Archer City, and another broke its neck at Stanford. Putting on a fast moving show is one of the primary aims of Mayo. He has four men working behind the bucking chutes. The stock is cut out and drawn for each performance, and the men feed the stock into the chutes as the event comes up. Nat Fleming, announcer of the 1951 show, is associated with Goat Mayo in putting on rodeo performances. He started as a sports announcer, and saw a lot of rodeos before he began announcing the shows. He is employed at a Wichita Falls boot company when not traveling the rodeo circuit with Mayo. Mayo once performed in rodeo events, but now leaves that up to his sons, Sonny, 17, and Wendell, 14. Sonny is entered in the bareback bronc riding and roping events in this year's rodeo. Wendell, who was hurt in the Stanford show, is helping out in the production of the show. Mayo has produced the junior rodeo at Post the last two years, and will go there this week for the 1951 event. Mayo, who has seen lots of rodeos in his time, likes the saddle bronc riding event best. He believes it's the oldest and most original event and holds more of the old cowboy spirit than any other contest. He has lots of cowboys who follow his shows. Some of them don't miss a one. Mayo and other rodeo producers watch a lot of cowboys come and go. Their advice to a new cowboy is to get the equipment and then get lots of rosin. A bull rider needs a rope and a bell, a bareback rider needs bareback rigging, then cowboys need spurs and chaps — all this, and the rosin to rub on leggings, ropes and saddles. Stock contractors furnish some halters, saddles and other equipment, because there are always contestants who don't have the necessary equipment. But that's as far as they go — furnishing the stock and a little equipment. It's up to the riders and ropers to provide the action.
