ON THE 18th DAY OF JANUARY, 1944, FIXING THE RATE OF TAX ON CERTAIN COIN OPERATED MACHINES, DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY TAX COLLECTOR TO SEAL UNLICENSED MACHINES, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO REMOVE FROM LOCATION A COIN OPERATED MACHINES, PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE, REPEALING ALLAWS THAT CONFLICT WITH THIS ACT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

SE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PAMPA, TEXAS:

That Part A of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 235 as passed and approved by the City Commission of the City of Primas, Texas, on the 18th day of January 1944, is amended to read as follows:

"(a) For each music coin operated machine, the term as hereinahove defined, a fee of \$2.50 where the coin, fee or token used or which may be used in the operation thereof is one of the value of 50 or more or represents the value of 50 or more."

It makes the pupil unlearn what he has been taught in order to learn these commandments, these natural laws, these eternal principles that govern peace, good will and the general welfare. These laws are just as immutable and eternal as the physical laws that govern the body to produce health. They are just as immutable and eternal as the laws that govern the move-

counterfeit education? It results in counterfeit money, that we have meaning of words - in a distortion of their true meaning, that we have now. Our administrative counterfeit educators cannot define the most important word in the Engish language to an American—they cannot define liberty. They do not believe in liberty — that is, self-control, no more, no less. They believe in a double standard and that the majority has a moral right to take away from an individual his liberty to the degree that the ma-jority sees fit to plunder the individual. 





Newspapers, magazines and radio stations were freed from government control and familiarized with the responsibilities and opportunities of a free press. In 1945 there were 52 general daily newspapers; a year-later, 132. SCAP guidance also resulted in adoption by the Japanese press of a code of ethics modeled after that of the American Newspaper Publishers' Association



At the war's end, millions of Japanese school children received their lessons in abandoned barracks, shrines and out of doors. Though lacking funds to create adequate facilities for Japan's 19,000,000 pupils and 650,000 students. SCAP has made tremendous progress in completely reorganizing Japanese education. Aggressive nationalism has been removed from curriculums and replaced by democratic ideals and principles.
