# Civil War Is **Swiftly Killed**

By President tina -(AP) - The official state radio announced today a revolt was staged by two former army generals against the government of Juan D. Peron and was swiftly put

The radio, a short time after announcing civil war had broken out in Argentina, declared the government quelled the rising headed by former Gen. Arturo Rawson and former Gen. Benjamin Menendez. Rawson was a leader of a 1943 rebellion which placed him in the presidency just

There was no information available from other sources. The capital has been closed down ightly, with business establishments shuttered.

There were many rumors of troop movements, but these, too, ould not be confirmed.

No fighting was observed in the streets of Buenos Aires ex-cept for sporadic fist fights. But large crowd was pouring into the Plaza de Mayo in front of Peron's offices, shouting "La vida or Peron" four lives for Peron.) 





CROSS-FILING Now that California's crossfiling system of election, whereby a candidate can run on all party tickets, is getting favorable ticians in

thought by polistates, we might see what evil it has done to California. The moral idea alone -that a man can be a Republican a n d Democrat and Socialist all at one and the same time-is re-

prehensible and can only be justified by gutter politics. Two pages of the Kefauver Committee crime report were devoted to the amazing power of lobbyists in California's capital. Almost everyone knows who Artie Samish is. Yet, the state chamber of commerce, pretending to fear "bossism," has plously come out against repealing cross-filing in November, 1952.

California already has bossism in a big way and because of crossfiling it can't get rid of its plague.

The ARGONAUT, of San Francisco, recently published an interesting item on cross-filing in this connection, pointing out that when a candidate cross-files he can accept campaign funds from individuals with their many selfish interests and is indebted to them, not his party. By cross-filing he has washed his hands of party responsibility—or, for that matter, of any definite principles. Parties have to go before the people to be accepted or rejected on their programs. Lobbyists do not. When lobbyist buys a cross-filer he owns the legislator. And it is a matter of record that under the system it is next to impossible to get a man out of office once he gets in Consequently, the present gang exercises what am to a near-monoply on California's

Many voters just can't figure out the tangled mass of cross-filing handed them as a "ballot." If you are a Democrat you naturally suppose the names on the Democratic ballot are those of good Democrats with party responsibility and loyal to the party platm. And vice versa if you are a Republican. But under crossfiling Republicans' names are on the Democratic ballot and Democrats on Republican ballots. If I am a Republican I can file on every ballot. It's very confusing and the chances are that if I'm in office I'll stay there for a long long time, responsible only to the lobbyists who paid my freight and most difficult to get rid of. Crossfiling is just a slick way to protect a monopoly. How about a little decency? By the way, nere's a tip to readers in other states should the cross-filing issue come up: KEEP A FREE VOTE.

FORT WORTH — (P) — An estimated 25,000 oil wells and 4,-590,000 tons of steel would be required to develop the "million-acre Spraberry trend of West Texas under the 40-acre spacing plan," a Fort Worth oil operator

Archer Rowan addressed several hundred oil operators called to discuss how to develop the area. A committee was named to handle recommendations,

Discussion mainly was on methdespite tight steel allocations. Rowan, who called the meet-ing, placed the total wells in the rend on Sept. 22 at 522, scattered among 16 separate areas and with a calendar day allowable of 48,560 barrels.

Rowan said if the remaining undrilled area could be drill ed 80-acre spacing, about 2,250,-000 tons of steel would be saved. He said this was one and one fourth times the total oil field requirements of Texas in 1950 and represents enough steel to supply West Texas' normal needs for over 3 1-2 years. "It is believed." Rowan said,

"that the productive area may cover more than 1,000,000 acres; in fact, a million acres is now regarded as semi-proved with 500,000 acres already believed
