## House Okays **Federal Pay** Increase Bill

WASHINGTON - (AP) than a million and a half postal employes and government white collar workers can each look forward today to around \$400 a year more in their pay envelopes from now on.

Three pay increase bills re-troactive to July 1 and totaling \$670,000,000 annually were shouted through by the House rapid-fire order late yesterday.

The Senate had approved almost similar measures earlierone of the biggest pay boosts given federal employes at one time - and a Senate-House compromise committee now must iron out the differences.

The big salary hike even had the House talking about more money for its own members, now getting \$15,000 a year in salary and expenses.

Democratic Leader McCormack of Massachusetts told the House he hoped that before the next session ends 15 months from now, Congress would have "the \$25,000 a year. Members applauded. McCormack said the present

pay of senators and representa-"unfortunate" and thought their constitutents vored more money for hardworking congressmen.

## Tanks Strike In Triangle

EIGHTH ARMY, Korea AP) — Allied armored columns jabbed into the north corner of the old Communist fron Triangle in central Korea Friday, shot up every-thing in sight and then withdrew for the night.

It was perhaps the heaviest armored thrust of the war. Infantrymen followed

According to Truman

President Truman in his speech dedicating a new building in Washington said that those who are talking of the threat of bankruptcy of our Country are spreading a pack of lies, Then I am a liar if President Truman's statements are true. Then he went on how much stronger economically we are now than we were 1939. I don't have the figures at hand, but the federal debt then was about 200 billion dollars less than it is now. Of course debts do not mean very much to a man who has never paid his honest personal obligations, as President Truman never has, A mere little 200 billion dollars extra debt hanging over the earnings of every American doesn't seem to bother

Truman. As a matter of fact, for 150 years the per capita production in creased about 3 per cent a year, and President Truman starts with 1939, when there were 8,000,000 or 9,000,00 people out of work.

Our prosperity is a counterfeit prosperity. Any man could be prosperous if he could counterfeit money and spend it. And that is what we are doing now in a national way. Certainly the man who has a life insurance policy or bonds or preferred stock or a fixed income or a pension is not as well off as he was 11 or 12 years ago.

Truman was just repeating what Secretary of the Treasury Snyder had said on August 10. What the President, and those people like him, who will not answer questions, fail to see is that we are living on capital. That is, on money that would go into capital. The President talks about corporations making more money. evidently does not even know that the profits as shown by corpora-tions as required by the federal government are false profits. As a matter of fact, lots of corporations are showing a profit, but in reality they are losing. They are losing because they are wearing out the tools and there is not enough depreciation set up to replace the
