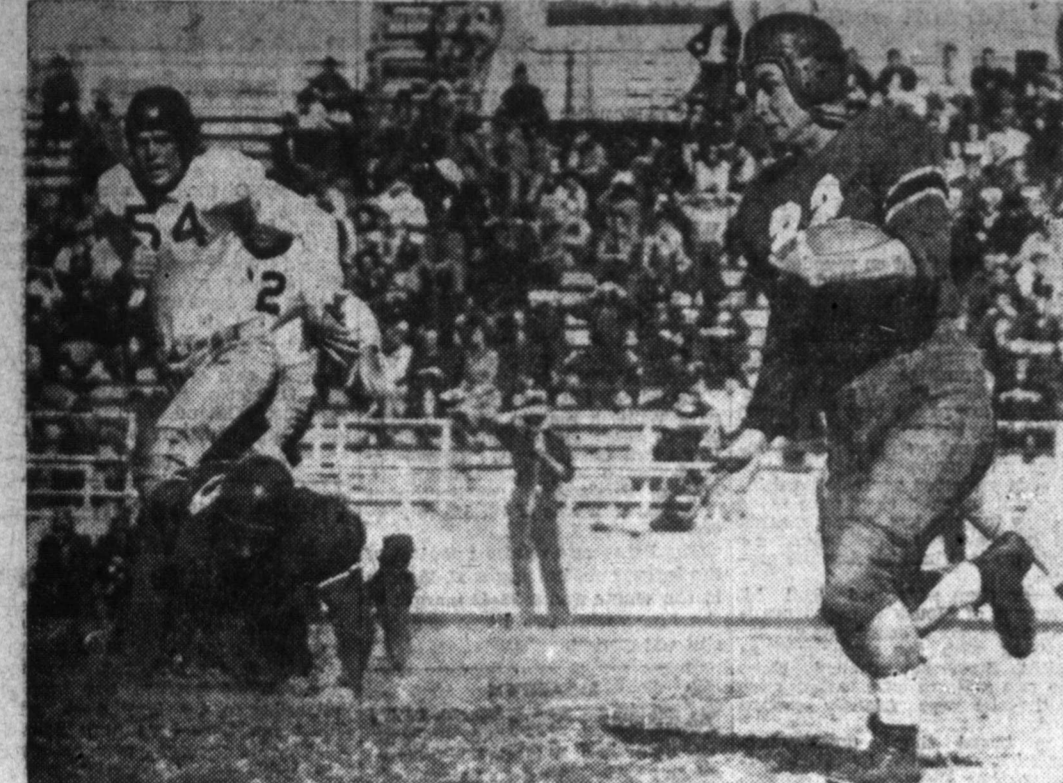

DALLAS, Nov. 8.—(AP)—Basketball practice has begun at Southwest conference schools although new games will be played before the football season ends. With the start of the case sport comes work that Baylor plans to return to intercollegiate athletics by placing a team in the race. Baylor dropped out of football this year.

Practice at the conference schools has been mostly of the informal variety and the squads won't get down to brass tacks for another week. Experienced men from last year are scarce but four of the schools—Arkansas Methodist, Rice, Texas and Texas Christian—expect helpful material from the naval training program. Texas A. & M., Arkansas and Baylor do not have trainees.

Rice, which tied Texas for the championship last season, comes up with the most lettermen with Center Bill Henry and Guard Russell Darling. Texas doesn't have any lettermen but has Roy Cox, squadman who was a sensation in the national collegiate tournament last winter when the Longhorns beat Washington. Also on the Texas roster will be Slater Martin all-state guard with the Jeff Davis High school team of Houston that won the Texas championship last season.

Southern Methodist has one letterman, Guard Alec Cannady, and two squadmen, Forward Dennis Hayden and Center Harry Tenk. Arkansas has one letterman, Forward Ben Jones, and one squadman, Charles Jolliff, center. Texas Christian also has one letterman and one squadman—Floyd Chronister and Douglas Kinney, respectively.

Five Titles On Line In School Football Race

By HAROLD V. RATLIFF Associated Press Sports Editor Championship days are here in Texas schoolboy football. Five district titles go on the line this week while other sectors push toward showdowns that will name winners by Thanksgiving day.

Out in the Panhandle Amarillo's Golden Sandies meet the only team considered as a serious challenger to the District 1 title—Lubbock's West-erners. In the Ft. Worth district North Side's unbeaten Steers engage Amon Carter-Riverside, once defeated in conference play and having to win to prevent the Steers from clinching the title.

In District 9 Breckenridge meets Brownwood in a battle between unbeaten leaders. In the Houston district Jeff Davis has to get no more than a tie with weak San Jacinto to sew up the championship. In District 4 Goose Creek tangles Galveston with the winner to take the title.

There also are important games in other districts. For instance Sherman and Paris, two of the top teams of District 5, get together. Highland Park plays McKinney to eliminate one of three leaders in District 6.

District 10 features the Waco-Temple game, the winner to meet Bryan for the title. District 11 has Tyler and Longview battling it out with the winner due to meet Marshall for the championship. The schoolboy field rumbles into its final three weeks with 12 teams still undefeated. Nine of them are unbeaten and untied. These are Amarillo, San Angelo, Sweetwater, Yale-va, Highland Park, Longview, Lufkin, Goose Creek and McAllen. Unde-feated but tied are North Side, Edin-burg and Denison.

There are 49 games on this week's schedule with 40 of them conference affairs.
