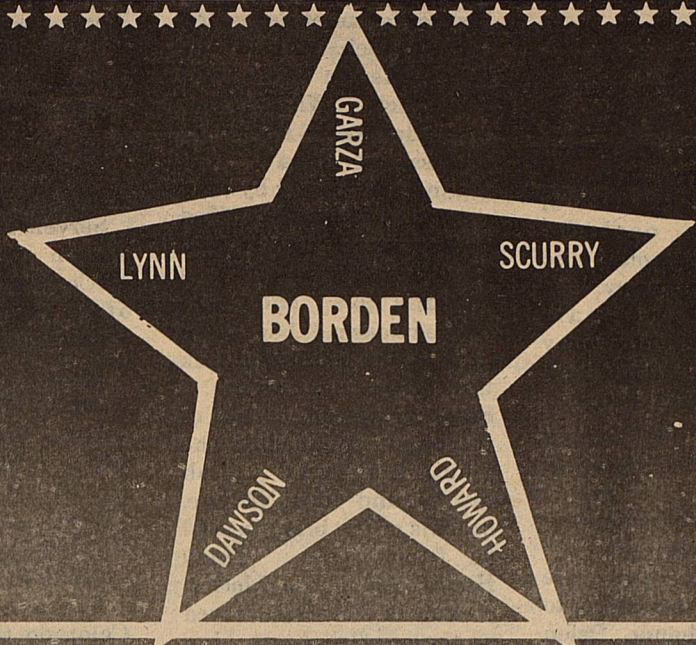

The Borden County 4-H Five-Man Trap Team won the District 2 4-H Trap Shoot Wednesday, July 8th. The shoot was held at the South Plains Gun Club in Lubbock.

The team members included Jym Rinehart, Maurice Herridge, Jibber Herridge, Darrell Green and Charles LaRue. Jym was high individual in the senior division, hitting 69 of 75 birds and Maurice was

second high individual, hitting 68 of 75. Overall team score was 302 with second place at 295. Castro County 4-H, which scored the 295, were Texas State Champions last year.

The Borden County 4-H Five-Man Sub-Junior Team placed second in their division. Team members were Mickey Burkett, Michael Murphy, Harold Barnes, David Holmes and Wayne Daugherty. Mickey was third high individual in

the division, breaking 40 of 50 birds.

These same teams also competed at the Second Annual Howard County 4-H Invitation Shoot held in Big Spring, Thursday, July 9th. We will not know the results until later this week.

These young men should all be congratulated on a fine showing for Borden County. They all will be competing at the State Skeet and Trap Shoot in San Antonio, August 6-8.

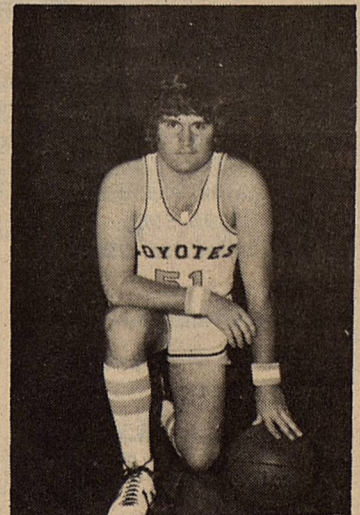

TIMESAIVING TECHNIQUES FOR SEWING CHILDREN'S CLOTHING

When sewing children's clothing, consider some timesaving techniques.

Here are the techniques:

Use the same pattern several times and vary the views, fabric, and trim. This will save time in alterations and the more familiar you are with a pattern, the faster the construction time will be.

Stitch as much as possible while the garment pieces are flat. For example, hem the sleeve or stitch on trim before stitching the under arm seam together. Also some sleeves can be sewn to the garment before stitching side seams.

Use the free arm of machine when stitching small areas such as sleeves.

Use 'he sleeve board for press' these small areas

also.

Use fabric that has body. This if more furable and easier to handle.

Select patterns that are simple with few seams. This will not only take less time to construct but also will be easier to care for.

Decorate only the front or back of farments. This will mean less construction time and it will assist a child in learning the front from back of the garment.

When constructing pants, build in knee reinforcements, to prevent having to do it after all the seams are sewn.

Reinforce all pockets, use double seams to cut down on mending time later.

Add "growth features," such as tucks and deep hems so the garment can be worn longer.

Use elastic waistbands instead of fitted ones to each garment can "grow" with the child.

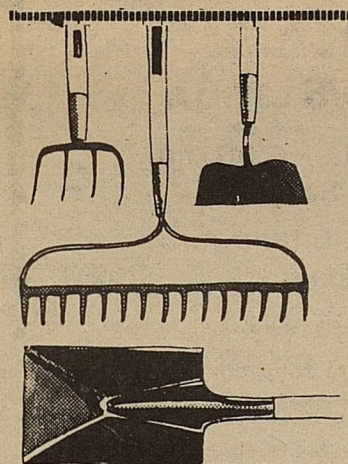

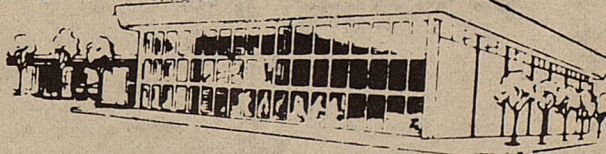

FINAL CERTIFICATION DATE

August 3 is the final date to certify 1981 cotton, grain sorghum and other NCA crops. To be eligible for disaster payments, a timely and accurate certification is very important. Failure to certify will make you ineligible for program benefits. Remember August 3rd is the final date to certify.

DISASTER PROTECTION

To become eligible for disaster protection you must:

1. Make a timely and accurate crop certification.
2. Apply for disaster credit before plowing or making any other use of failed acres.
3. For harvested acres, file your application for disaster credit within 15 days after harvest is complete.

WHEAT DISASTER

If your wheat made less than 60 percent of the farm yield, you need to file your request within 15 days of harvest.

PAYMENT LIMITATION

The 1981 program has a restriction that limits all entities to \$100,000 for disaster payments and \$50,000 for deficiency payments.

MEASUREMENT SERVICE

Measurement service is available to all those producers who are unsure of their crop acreages. There will be minimal charge for this service and requests for this service should be filed by August 3rd.

Eligibility for participation in all programs administered by ASCS is established by law without regard to race, color, creed, sex, or National Origin.

COTTON INSECT IDENTIFICATION WORKSHOP

There will be a county-wide cotton insect identification workshop at the Plains Community Center on Monday, July 27th, beginning at 8:00 a.m.

Jim Leser, Area Entomologist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, will be on hand to present the program. His main emphasis will be on cotton insect identification and management. Bollworm

and tobacco budworms will be covered extensively at the meeting.

The meeting will start at the Community Center and will then move out into local fields for actual practice on field scouting insect identification.

Make your plans to attend this important meeting. The meeting should conclude between 12:00 and 1:00 p.m. This workshop was planned by the Field Crops Program Area Committee in conjunction with the County Extension Office.

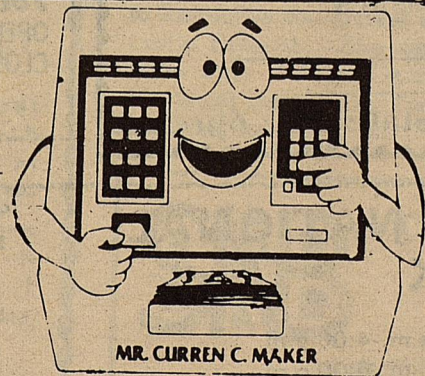
