 place finisherAs the 1998-99 school year comes to a close hoped to and senior Jeff Dennis and Borden County. He hoped sophomore Trent Pepper to improve on his 1998 traveled to Austin to finish of $4^{\text {th }}$ place in the represent Borden County High School as the only remaining Coyotes competing in UIL athletics for the school year. These two young men represented the first Borden County Boys State Track Qualifiers since 1972. These young men put the finishing touches to a break though track season for the Coyotes. Jeff and Trent put together a fantastic year as they traveled to Austin representing the best athletes Borden County has ever had in their respective events. Jeff holds the school record in the Discus, 153 '5", while Trent holds three school records, but competed in only two of those events, the 3200 (10:01.91) and the 1600 meter run (4:34.29).

These two young Coyotes began the year not knowing what the season might bring. Trent Pepper moved to Gail from Sabinal and had already made one appearance in the State Track Meet as a
freshman last year and hoped to repeat that feat at to improve on his 1998
finish of $4^{\text {th }}$ place in the 3200. Jeff on the other hand, began the season just hoping to set a new school record in the discus. As the season progressed, with the hard work and dedication that both of these two young men showed throughout the season, their paths took a similar journey as they both qualified for the 1999 State Track Meet.

Jeff started the meet for the Coyotes as he competed in the discus Saturday morning. After three throws, Jeff found himself in unfamiliar territory, at sixth place. Showing the composure that he has all season long, Jeff put together two very solid throws at $150^{\prime} 8^{\prime \prime}$ to move him up to 4th place, and then he followed that throw with a very impressive $152^{\prime} 0^{\prime \prime}$ throw to actually move into the bronze medal slot. Just when it seemed as through Jeff was going to make school history in receiving the first medal for the

Borden County Boys Team at State, on the next to the last throw of the competition, a young man from Meadow hit a 154' throw to knock Jeff to fourth place. Fourth place, this means that Jeff finished fourth out of approximately 900 other discus throwers across the state of Texas in class 1 A , what a tremendous accomplishment.

Now, the focus turned to Trent as he stepped to the line to begin the 3200 meter run. This is an event in which Trent carried the fastest qualifying time. As the gun sounded, it began just like any other 3200 Trent had run, as he moved into his familiar front position. It looked as though the field might just allow Trent to carry them around the track as a pack of six runners stayed close behind. After four laps the pack remained tight, with one of the competitors being the defending state champion in this event right on Trent's right shoulder. As the race hit the sixth lap the field was trimmed to four. At this point, Trent made his

As he began his final lap, all that separated Trent from a Gold Medal and the claim of the 1999 State Champion was a few meters. The field had fallen way off the pace, and Trent just had to stay on his feet, and not have a completed melt down (which could happen in the Austin humidity). This feat would allow Trent to be the first male Track State Champion in Borden County History. As he neared the finish line you could see the smile peering from his face as he knew that he was now the best of the best in class 1 A . Trent crossed the line in a very impressive time of 10:07.80 to claim the 3200-meter run State Championship Honors. What a fantastic accomplishment for this young Coyote.

As the day progressed, Trent attempted to pull off a very difficult double by winning the 1600 -meter run. As luck would have it, with the use of the new facility, the 3200 -meter run and the 1600 -meter run were on the same day, within 3 hours of each other. That was the case for Trent, as he found the humidity, just too much to overcome as he finished4th in the 1600 meter fun as he was nipped at the line for the bronze medal. ## Bluebonnets have colorful history in Texas

Since the early days of Texas, the bluebonnet has held a place in history Texas folklore tells of Spanish priests growing bluebonnets at their missions. In 1901, selection of the official state flower sparked a lively debate One legislator nominated the cotton boll since cotton was king in Texas. John Nance Garner suggested cactus, extolling the durability and orchid-like beauty. The platform earned Garner the name "Cactus Jack," a moniker he carried all the way to the vice presidency. But it was the bluebonnet that garnered the majority of votes. Extension floriculturist Don Wilkerson says there are actually five species of our native bluebonnet, all of which are considered the state flower. They even include white, pink, red and maroon bluebonnets. All occur naturally and have been selected and bred so they are now popular as bedding plants. The newest varieties are the long-stemmed bluebonnet. A\&M horticulturists experimented with it until they produced a richly-colored, long-lasting cut flower. It's expected to become a standard in the floral

industry. Bluebonnets are planted in the fall and bloom best following mild winters. Wilkerson says they hug the ground during the winter as a natural means of protecting themselves. Once the weather warms its leaves, the plant springs to life. It produces a cluster of awe-inspiring blue blooms. One historian wrote that the bluebonnet is not only the state flower, but also a kind of floral trademark almost as well known to non-Texans as cowboy boots and the
