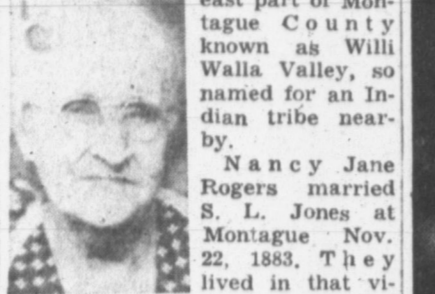

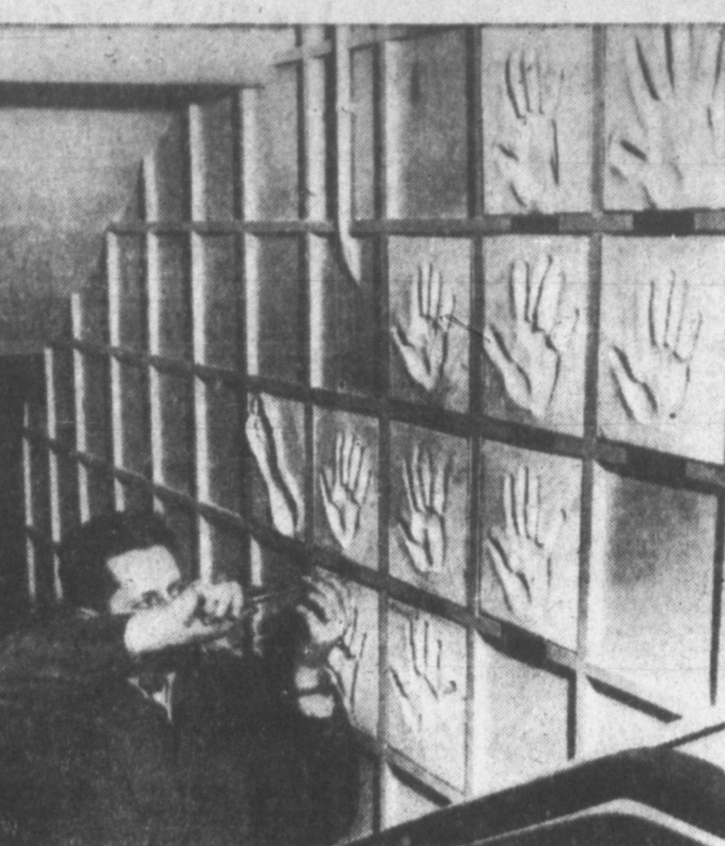

Area Pioneer Dies Sunday

McLEAN (Special) — Mrs. Nancy Jane Jones, long-time resident of the McLean community, died at her home, Sunday, after an illness of about two years. Mrs. Jones, born Nancy Jane Rogers, was born January 1, 1866, in Polk County, Tenn. At five, she came to Texas with her parents in an ox wagon and settled in Montague County, Texas, near Decatur. Later, the family moved to the south-east part of Montague County known as Will Walla Valley, so named for an Indian tribe nearby.



Nancy J. Jones married S. L. Jones at Montague Nov. 22, 1883. They lived in that vicinity until 1914 when they moved to McLean. Mrs. Jones is survived by three sons, Felix and Byrd of McLean and Ernest of Sunray; three daughters, Mrs. Lillie E. Johns, Plainview, Susie B. Jones, McLean and Mrs. Florence Banta of Borger. She is also survived by six grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren and four great-great-grandchildren and two brothers and two sisters, Bob Rogers, Quanah, Mitt Rogers, Duncan, Okla., Mrs. Ella Dickinson, Quanah, and Mrs. Vera Maddox of Marlow, Okla.

I wish I didn't feel this way about the President of my country. It is a tragic thing when men and women would rather laugh at the White House than visit it.

I listened to Mr. Truman talk in New York at his final whistle-junket. I left in the middle of his tirade, ashamed. Ashamed that this country could elect such a small, small, small, and three more smalls, man to its top office.

Korean Politicos In Expense Troubles

TOKYO (AP) — Foreign Minister Katsuo Okazaki refused today for a second time to report to police headquarters to explain his campaign expenses in the Oct. 1 general elections.

He said "Pressure of state affairs" prevented his appearance.

Police Sunday arrested two influential members of Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida's Liberal party, members of the Diet parliament.

Yonezo Maeda, 70, prewar commerce and industry minister, was allowed to go home after nearly 12 hours of questioning. Police doctors said he was ill.

Tomejor Okubo, 65, prewar mayor of Tokyo, was still in custody.

Six other Liberals and one Progressive party Diet member have been arrested on similar charges since.

Japan's election laws limit expenditures to about \$1,000 for each candidate. Okubo and Maeda are accused of spending \$14,000 to \$28,000 each.

Pleads Not Guilty To Reckless Driving

A Pampa man pleaded not guilty in corporation court this morning to a charge of reckless driving, following an automobile collision at S. Cuyler, near Tyng Sunday afternoon.

It was the 290th city car collision of the current year.

Charles M. Huffine, 58, of 315 S. Gray, was parked at a curb, policeman reported, when he backed out into a car operated by Donald J. Taylor, Ft. Worth.

Huffine's case has been set for Oct. 30 in corporation court. Damage on the Taylor vehicle has been calculated at \$50.

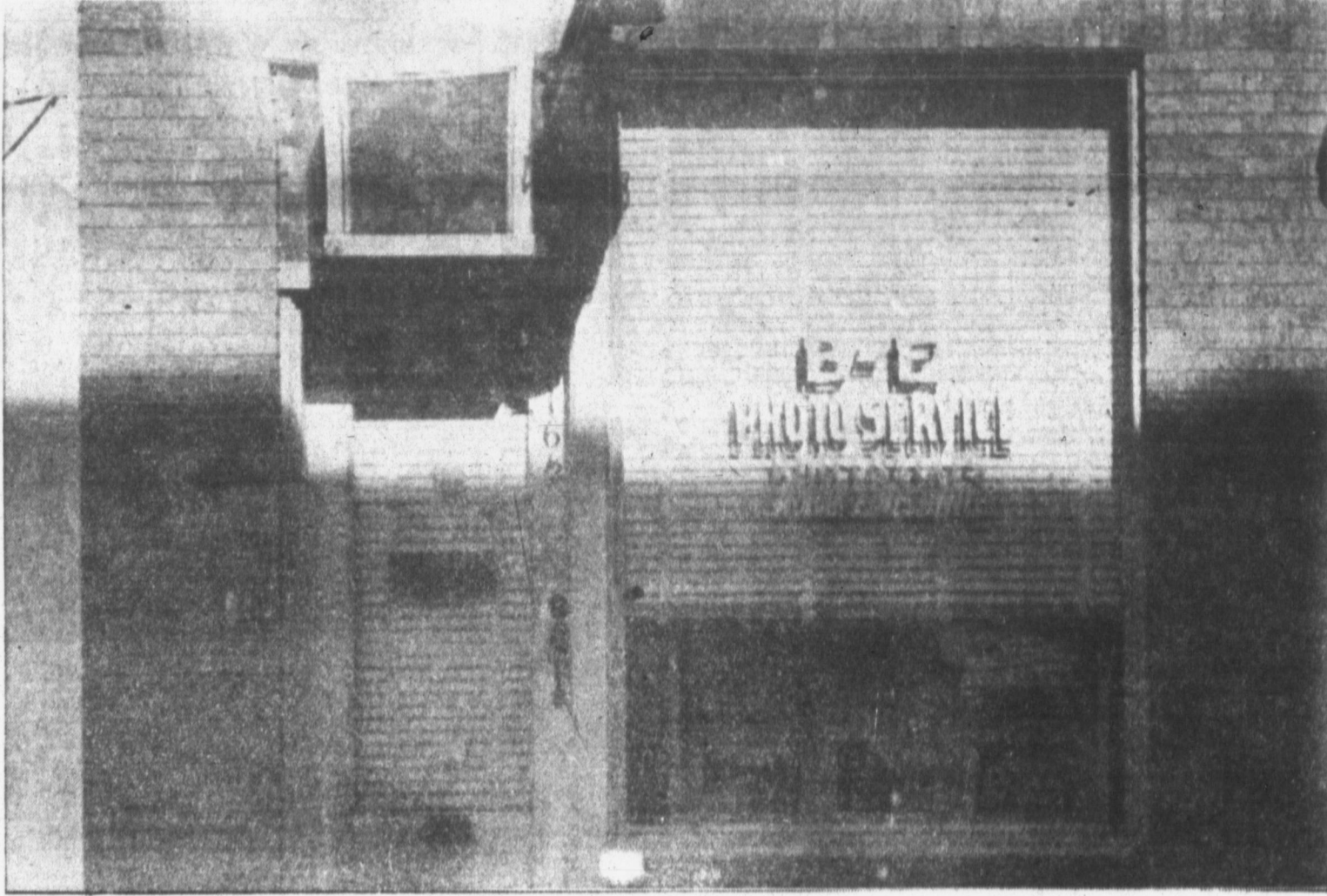

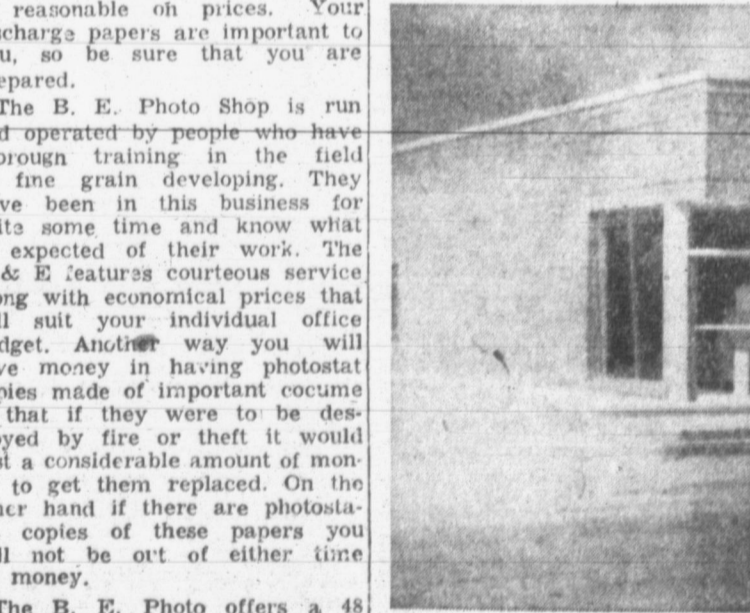
