A Stitch in Time Renews Old Togs

Reinforce new clothes at seams, hems, plackets, pockets and necklines before they're worn, and you can usually save yourself the chore of tedious mending later on and give many garments a much longer life.

For that reason, clothing specialists of the U. S. Department of Agriculture suggest over-stitching edges of seams. Or better still, machine-stitching near the edges before overcasting. This advance stitching, the experts point out, saves seams that have been cut too close from fraying or coming apart.

A stitch in time suggested for carefully made buttonholes, which never look the same after they tear, is a simple reworked blanket stitch used before the button goes in.

2 American MPs Shot in Vienna

VIENNA—(AP)—Russian and American investigators, working in close cooperation, were near to a solution today of the shooting of two American military policemen Saturday night.

The Americans, both recovering in an army hospital, were shot when they attempted to stop a stolen American jeep in which three Russian soldiers were riding.

Russian police and investigators worked with the American provost marshal on the case from the beginning. A number of Russians were still under questioning today and one of the occupants of the stolen jeep was in custody.

A Russian lieutenant was shot while resisting arrest by American military policemen ordered to pick up suspects in the case. He was in serious condition, with a bullet wound in the stomach.

The two Americans were shot when they pulled their jeep beside the stolen jeep. A Russian reached out and fired at close range, hitting both soldiers in the face.

The Russians have given assurances that all the men involved in the shooting would be found and that they would be turned over to American authorities.

The names of the two wounded Americans were withheld pending notification of their families.

CAMPIONE, Italy—(AP)—This tiny gambling-supported European playground, where king and commoner are equal at the roulette table, wants to free itself from mother Italy's apron strings.

Campione is one of the strangest communities on the continent. It is a pimple on the shore of Lake Lugano, surrounded by Swiss territory. Less than two miles square, its population of 1,000 is almost completely dependent upon the large gambling Casino which nets \$1,000,000 annually.

King Boris of Bulgaria once played there. Queen Wilhelmina of Holland was the only member of royalty who visited and never tried her luck.

The Casino is owned by a private syndicate in Rome, but it has been a municipal Bonanza to Campione, which is debt free and has only two percent unemployment.

Six members of the municipal council work for the Casino and supposedly see that it pays its proper share of taxes. Mayor Felzi Tagliarini is secretary of the Casino and is one of the leaders of a movement to obtain complete administrative freedom for Campione while leaving the community still under Italian political shelter.

"If we could get our independence we could make Campione greater than Monte Carlo," he said.

This ambitious program crystallized after Campione's citizens revolted against the German puppet government in northern Italy in January, 1944.

It was the least bloody revolution in history. They simply locked up six government policemen and created their own army of seven men. Hitler was occupied with more important problems at the time—and because any uninvited foreigners must have a Swiss visa to reach Campione—the flaming patriots won their rebellion.

Campione now wants to keep its liberty because it has its own postal system and its currency in the Swiss franc, the soundest money in Europe. It therefore is refusing to pay taxes to Italy.

During the tests four Helicats, each with two control planes, will be launched from the USS Shangri-la and will be controlled first from the carrier's deck, then from a mother plane in the air, and finally from the ground control operator on Bal Island where they will land.
