







Onions! What a boon they are to the homemaker who wants to give a dull, winter meal that extra flourish that makes it both interesting and appetizing.

Fresh shallots served in a salad or as a side dish, mature onions cooked with other vegetables or meats, take the drabness out of many a wintry meal.

Homemakers will find supplies of onions somewhat tighter than they were this time last year, according to the Production and Marketing Administration which keeps up with fruit and vegetable market news.

Here's why. Current stocks of onions from the late 1952 crop are 11 per cent smaller than a year ago and 23 per cent smaller than the average for the six years between 1946 and 1951.

Between now and the new spring onion crop, consumers will have a supply of slightly more than 6 million, 50-pound sacks of onions to meet their needs.

But there's a bright side to the picture. South Texas, the only source of early spring onions, has planted 20 per cent more acreage than last year. This crop will start rolling in March.

Also, the late spring crop, which is harvested next, is estimated to be about 16 per cent larger than it was last year so far as acreage is concerned.

**HEAVENLY HAM LOAF**

A glamorous entree for company feasting or family fare is this ham loaf which is shaped like a ham, then scored and studded with cloves for its trip to the oven. The ham mixture itself is extra special. The usual good ingredients of meat, crumbs, eggs, evaporated milk and seasonings are amplified with a can of condensed tomato soup for extra flavor and ruddy color. The meat mixture browns beautifully, retains a nice inner moistness and slices splendidly either hot or cold. Whipped horseradish sauce is a pleasing partner for this heavenly ham loaf.

1 pound ground leftover cooked or baked ham (4 cups, lightly packed)

- 1 pound ground veal
- 1-2 cups fine dry bread crumbs
- 1-2 teaspoon salt
- 1-4 teaspoon pepper
- 1-4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1 tablespoon prepared mustard
- 1-4 cup minced onion
- 1-4 cup minced green pepper
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 3-4 cup evaporated milk
- 1-10 1-2 ounce can condensed tomato soup

Whole cloves  
Combine ground ham and veal. Add other ingredients in order, except the whole cloves. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in center of a lightly buttered large shallow baking pan. Shape mixture with hands to resemble a ham. Score

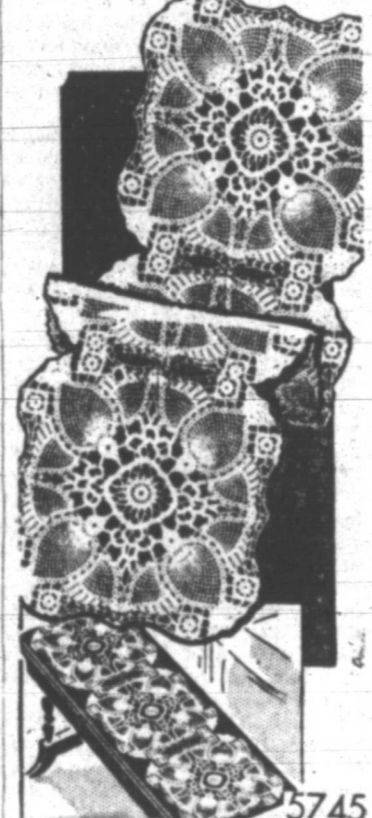

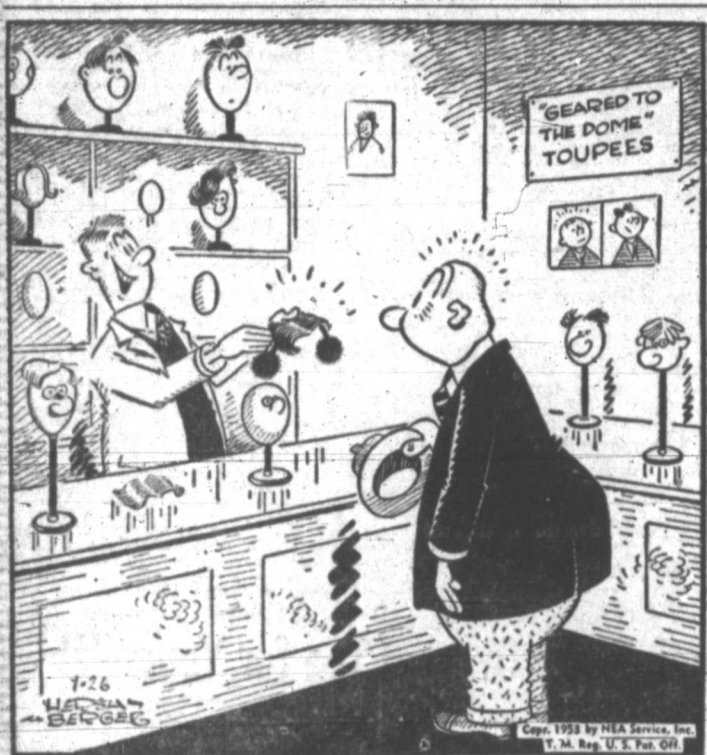

The disease was discovered last week and the ministry distributed 100,000 doses of vaccine.

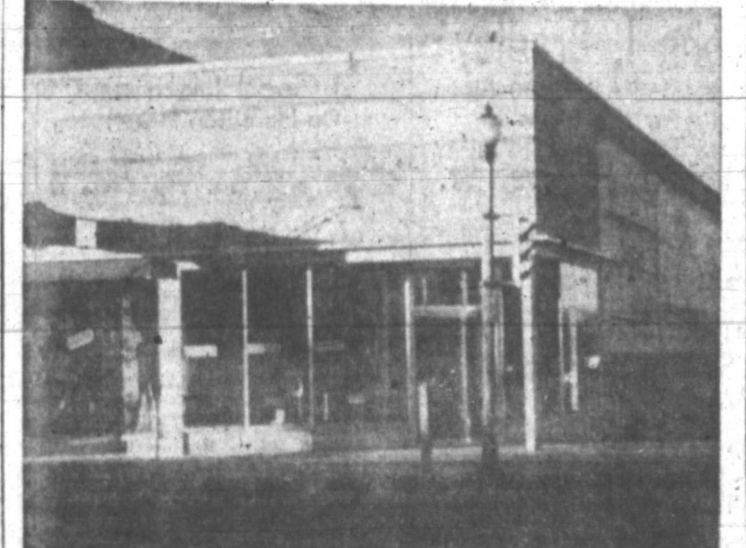

### Death Of Mental Patient Probed

SAN ANTONIO, Jan. 25—UP—A full-scale investigation was opened Saturday into the death of a mental patient who was fatally injured in a fight in the maximum security ward of the San Antonio state hospital.

Dr. J. S. Scarborough, hospital director, warned meanwhile of a "potentially dangerous" situation in the jam-packed, under-staffed wards of the hospital.

A Bexar county year-end grand jury attacked conditions at the San Antonio hospital as "deplorable." Justice of the Peace B. B. Brothman, the investigating coroner, sharply criticized the hospital for moving patient's body to a funeral home before notifying him, and for failing to report the death to police.

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
