PANMUNJOM, Korea, Friday, June 5 -UP- Communist armistice negotiators gave the United Nations formal counter-proposal for ending the Korean war "extraordinarily" close to latest Allied plan, a source close to the UN truce team said Friday.

All major points in the Red proposal were identical to those in the "final" UN offer for compromising the prisoner of war issue which has deadlocked the truce egotiations, the source said.

The Communist counter-propos al, read to Allied representatives at a secret session Wedneday, apparently brought peace in Ko. rea closer than it has been since ruce talks opened nearly two years ago.

The Red reply was rushed to Washington,







Fishing For Billions

Ever try to untangle a reel-full of snarled fishing line? It's one of the most frustrating experiences known to man, because it only happens when there isn't a spare line for miles around. You either straighten it out, or give up

Congress is faced with just that kind of mess right now, except that they can't give up and go home. And instead of a creel of fish, there are quite a few billions of taxpayers' cold cash involved. When President Eisenhower and the new Congress

took office they discovered that more than a fourth of the non-military portion of the federal budget is spent by agencies and bureaus operating in direct competition with private tax-paying business.

More than 500,000 people are busy in almost 100 such agencies, bureaus, and corporations. They supply such things as "cheap" electricity to the residents of Tennessee, partly paid for by taxpayers in Texas and

One department is even in the business of roasting

Reliable estimates show that the government owns about \$27 billion worth of property and other assets devoted to these competitive endeavors.

If these were sold, the \$27 billion could be applied against the national debt, at an annual saving of more than \$500 million in interest. Billions more could be saved each year by the cut in operating expenses.

Taxes could be materially reduced without endangering the national welfare in any way, both because government expenses would be less, and because that \$27 billion worth of new, private business would become a taxpayer instead of a tax spender.

Overloaded congressional committees are now studying these activities as a small part of an overall survey of the entire government operation. The government-inbusiness phase is getting lost in the shuffle.

Lifting this important study out of the welter of other administrative matters has been suggested by Congressman Fred E. Busbey of Illinois. He has asked both houses to create a commission to study government competition with private enterprise.

Busbey's commission would examine the competing agencies and recommend which activities could be best carried out by private business and which by government, and would also tell Congress the best way of curing this expensive bureaucratic hodgepodge.

Conceivably his suggestion, H. J. Res. 184, could do more for the taxpayers than any bill yet introduced in this session of Congress.

The Williston Story

Up until two years ago Williston, a prairie town in the wind swept northwest corner of North Dakota. seemed if anything destined to sink back into the flat prairie land from which it had sprung. Then came the advance guard of the oil industry, the geologists and siesmograph crews. They were undismayed by the bitterly cold winters or parched summers with their constant threat of howling dust storms. It's an axiom of the industry that oil is where you find it and it is seldom found in a lush or convenient spot.

The oil industry has put about \$20,000,000 into the United States section of the Williston Basin. So far it has gotten back only about 4,250,000 barrels of oil worth \$8,500,000. But in the business of drilling for oil a lot of money has to go into the ground before anything comes out. As a matter of fact, for a new area the Williston Basin has been a pretty good gamble. Since the 1950 strike, 183 producing wells and only 143 dry holes have been drilled. A daily production of 200,000 barrels is predicted by 1963 but there are big problems of transportation and marketing which have to

It's impossible to say for sure what lies beneath the surface of the earth, but one thing is certain, the future of the Williston area is being underwritten by the American oil industry, the most progressive and highly competitive in the world. Fifty companies are now backing their judgement with their money. Of necessity, they will do the best job humanly possible.
