



Lord, if he thinks he's fighting a circular saw, he should have been subjected to what some of us anti-New Dealers caught back in the Foolish Forties. They used to send the revenue agents and the Labor department gumshoes into a newspaper plant and harass the management until the flame wasn't worth the candle. Who's Oppressed?

A short time ago John L. Lewis of the Mine Workers appeared before the Senate Labor Committee and advocated total repeal of the Taft-Hartley Act. He said that nationalization of the coal mines and other evils will come to pass unless immediate appraisal is given to the "fast rising tide of unrest, discontent, uncertainty and fear arising out of this oppresive legislation."

Mr. Lewis is entitled to his position. But it will be difficult for most of us to see how or where labor has been oppressed under Taft-Hartley.

As an example, since that act became law, the coal miners have received upward wage adjustments, more liberal pension plans, and other important material benefits. They work much shorter hours than used to be the case, under ever-improving conditions, and they receive hourly wage rates which are the highest in mass-Industry. Very remarkable progress has been made in the field of mine safety. Coal miners in most countries would regard conditions in the coal mines here as unbelievably good.

What Taft-Hartley has done has been to help prevent or control labor excesses which gravely threatened the nation's safety and security itself. It has also served to help protect the individual union member from dictation by labor bosses. No one claims it is a perfect law, but it has done infinitely more good than harm to all concerned - the employer, the employee, and the public at large.

An Ex-School Teacher Speaks I have a very interesting letter from an ex-School teacher, Howard D. Selden, Cragmor Road, Colorado Springs, Colorado. He seems to understand what has been taking place for years in taxsupported schools. He realizes how the National Education Association and the brass hats in tax supported schools have taken over the public schools to promote a form of statism and give them almost unlimited power.

Mr. Selden, however, does not seem to realize that public schools are a violation of the Golden Rule and the Coveting Commandment. He does see, however, the results that are taking place in schools that violate the eternal moral laws.

In a letter to my son he writes: "My father fought these present trends ever since they began showing up around the turn of the century, and kept it up until his death three years ago at the age of eighty three or four. By insidious methods over the past fifty years this has been deliberately degraded to nothing more than a well - organized propaganda machine, wasting the time and cheating our youth by compulsory attendance in exchange for a worthless diploma given as a sort of salve and an attempt to convince them that they have received an education! However, this educational oligarhy that has ruined our pubic school system, merely to further its own ends, is so entrenched that I doubt if it ever can be dis-

"It is apparent that an overwhelming percentage of citizens and parents are unwilling even to admit there is anything wrong with present methods of schooling, much less to do anything about it. 
