## Basic Threat

One of the foundation stones of our Republic, if it still is a Republic - a moot point - is that civilian power should at all times be superior to military power.

There is a distinct threat to this principle in an amended section of the U.S. Code of Military Justice that provides a discharged serviceman can be taken into custody by military authorities and tried by court martial for certain crimes committed outside the jurisdiction of the U.S. civilian courts.

This amendment was enacted after a sensational wartime crime in Italy had been uncovered following dischage of the principals from the service.

And its first use was against one Robert Toth, a Pittsburgh steel worker. He was honorably discharged from the Air Force last December, was arrested by military police in May and was flown to Korea to stand trial before a court martial on a charge of murdering a Korean a tew months before asscharge. A week ago a writ or nabeas corpus was issued by a rederal court in Pennsylvania ordering the Air Force to bring 10th home again, but the writ has been held in abeyance while the issues are submitted to higher tederal courts for a determinution of the constitutionality of the amendment.

To us this is a clear case of a clash of military and civilian authority with the interests of all citizens vitaily dependent upon a judicial decision defining the suooraination of the military to civil power.

We suspect that no such constitutional crisis was anticipated or intended by the amenament drafters who moved without much skill or foresight to correct a loophole in our laws, the result of the widespread dispersal or our armed rorces around the world.

There is no question here of the justice of punishment of those guilty of crimes. The legislators are required to work out the technique of such punishment within a framework that guarantees protection of individual citizens from threat or harassment of government agencies.

In an age when one-third of the male population of the United States has had some association with the non-military personnel to be subjected to court martial.

It is not beyond the realm of possibility that an exofficer or ex-si whose activities irritated the administration could be picked up by military police on a trumpea up charge and left to stew in a disciplinary camp for weeks or months pending a court martial action. I.e tunctioning of military courts is not subject to the bright shining light of publicity that contributes to the integrity of our civilian courts.

The solution of jurisdictional problems is a simple challenge to the lawmakers.

There can never be any rightness to a power for the military itself to reach into the civilian population to sit in judgement on a citizen before or after he is a member of the armed forces. Even the draft law provides that those drafted shall be so selected by fellow citizens, and laws set fixed terms for service.

The courts martial are procedures of justice designed and adapted for affairs within the military establishment. Their limitations should be fixed there, and no power that can be denied the government or its agencies must ever be granted if we are to continue as a free

In short, the people in the Tennessee Valley are being subsidized by taxpayers all over the country, including Texas.

People in Gray County would like to attract some industry to bring down local tax rates and provide a firmer base for their own long-range prosperity. One way to help accomplish that end would be to disregard the letters from Tennessee and write one's own Congressman instead urging that Tennessee Valley communities be made to compete for industry on the same basis as Texas com-

Hence, by treaties, they can subvert the Constitution, disregard the House of Representatives, override our State and local governments, and tell you where to get off.

"Mr. Dulles himself said in 1952 before the election, that 'treaty law can override the Constitution'; treaties 'can take powers from the tates' (reserved in Article 9 and 10 of the Bill of Rights) and 'give them to some international body and cut across the rights given the people by the Bill of Rights.' But when Mr. Dulles agreed that this was so he was not Secretary of State. 'Potomac fever' had no yet smitten him.

These clever lads in the U. N. who would do the world over, believe the duck case is the perfect gimmick to be around the Constitution. 


