Fight For Freedom

L. R. Boulware, vice president of General Electric, made statements in his talk on the final day of the Rocky Mountain Electric League meeting at Colorado Springs which bear repeating again and again. Boulware's outstanding statements were as follows:

'The collectivists are all opposed to any large degree of individual choice, to individual incentive and initiative, and to the free and competitive market," he

"They all seek control over individual activity, the idea being to eliminate from the field of individual choice whatever they consider undesirable as tending to emphasize the individual," Boulware added.

All this means that collectivists want government to be big and people to be little. They want the government not to exist as a servant of the individual, but the individual to exist for, and as a servant of the government, which the collectivist promoters expect themselves to run, the electrical leader said.

"It's hard to realize that our federal government already owns 24 per cent of all the land in the continental United States, and its holdings are increasing steadily,

"All history teaches us that even any mild form of Socialism simply drives its promoters constantly toward making government the one enterpriser which means shortly the dictator. It is found that one control requires ever another. The losses suffered in government managed or subsidized industries are great, and have to be made up by added taxes on any free industry that still remains," he reported.

"Thus, incentive and new investment in private enterprise are killed. And the officials in power, seeking to maintain their positions, plunge from one experiment to another in order to keep hopes alive and to divert attention from their failures." he said.

Boulware reminded his listeners that we are fighting a final and ultimate form of collectivism abroad with our lives and treasures. "Yet here at home we are happily embracing them step by step — those very things which, taken as a whole, must lead in the end to some kind of collectivism not very much different from that which we are fighting in Korea and the rest of Asia, in Europe and elsewhere," he reported.

We need to learn, in contrast, the opportunities and duties of the free leader and free citizen in doing voluntarily what's sensible and right about working, innovating, saving, spending, risking, competing, profiting and losing," Boulware claimed.

He said that all the citizens of this country need economic education in all of its varied phases as quick-

"Men cannot and will not be free unless they want to be free, will study and work and fight to be free, and will do so voluntarily, spontaneously and continuously and with courage in their public action and public uses of free speech, no matter who is thus challenged or. contradicted," he said.

Silly Budgeting

The United States government budget revision proposal of Beardsley Ruml, inventor of the withholding tax gimmick, is as ill-timed as it is unsound.

Mr. Rumi's idea is to split the annual federal budget into two categories. In one category would be the direct expenditures of running government and its agencies for the year — veterans benefits and pensions, all salaries, interest on the public debt, etc. These are costs that are out in the open and cannot be hidden. But Mr. Ruml would also have, by a weird system of doublebookkeeping, a second budget, in which could be lumped enormous expenditures, such as public works ventures, in form of debt obligations to be paid off, if ever, at some time in the future!

The instant Senator Byrd of Virginia, who qualifies as an expert on government financing, heard of the Ruml suggestion he denounced it as "a combination of threadbare budgetary subterfuges originated as ideas of New Dealers over the past 20 years but cast aside, even by them, as too phony and misleading for serious consideration

The federal budget cannot be varanced by changing the rules and shifting methods of bookkeeping. This is the essence of the Ruml proposal, and the effect would be to hide huge annual expenditures in a debt budget, use trust funds for general purposes, and create endless confusion. In the Federal government, this would be a paradise for political spenders.

"The Keystone Of Liberty"

I want to continue to quote from quarterly magazine called "The Owl" and published in London. I was quoting from an article from this magazine under the general heading of "The Keystone of Liberty." In the last issue I ended by quoting the statement that "Every voluntary transaction gives advantage to both parties." If people could understand that, we would solve most of our problems.

Totalitarianism Is A Counter-Religion

Then the author, Pierre Lhoste-Lachaume, goes on to tell how the counter-revolution has to believe in and worship the proletariat. He explains it in this man-

"Mass alone has worth; while conscience and personal liberty are nothing but illusions, as every man is a temporary result of a series of material phenomena, strictly determined. Man has but one choice open; either to submit to 'the trend of History' or to be destroyed by those who join this

"In brief, Totalitarianism is an act of gregarious pride which affirms the 'mission' of one class. of one party, of its leaders; which explains that its institutions and its political methods incline to make all parts of the social body obey a single brain, as if it were an animal. * *

"However, even when buttressed by a systematic misrepresentation of the facts, myths cannot take the place of reality. Collectivism clashes against the invincible resistance of things and the human mind, as it ignores what Liberalism has proved; to wit: that free work is superior to compelled work; that personal management is better than governmental administration; and that specialization by exchanges in the whole world, is better than autaraty. Moralized Society Or

Terrified Society

Then the author goes on to explain that there are only two kinds of society - one is a moralized society and the other is a terrified society. He explains it in this way:

"If our conclusion points to the necessity of a spiritual liberalism. it is not only in consequence of a metaphysical conception. This choice is the best because it corresponds with the imperative need to febuild our society on such bases as are economically sound and socially stable.

"As the purpose of any economy is the satisfaction of the consumers' needs, economical institutions must be judged primarily on their fitness to that aim; now the best esults are obtained when these nstitutions are based on the principle of freedom. The reason is that, to incite people to produce, no compulsion from outside is as powerful as the freedom to work according to one's leanings, and to exchange the product of one's activity according to one's wishes. Hence the comparatively inferior output of the planned economic systems, as against the regime of

Liberty And Morals Inseparable

"It has been objected unjustly to the latter, that it is not compatible with moral standards. This ncompatibility does not exist and it may be asserted on the contrary that liberty and morals cannot be separated. At first, the fact that an economic system is founded on freedom does not result in exempting individuals from observance of the moral rules in their economic behavior, Economic science shows only what is possible and what is impossible; it remains then for morals to define, among the possibilities, what is good and what is evil,

"Let us emphasize, by the way, that the 'impossible' does not always seem such immediately, as in social phenomena the consequences follow the causes with some lingering. But the social laws are no less rigorous than physical laws, although their automatism appears less directly; every contrivance to evade them fires back. in the long run, against the purposes of its authors; and the event is worse for them, than if they had not opposed the natural course

"To come back now to the moral point: Man if free, precisely because he can use institutions either to do good or to do evil; therefore it rests with him to judge his possible acts on the ground of their consequences upon others, and in consideration of his own spiritual life

"On the other hand it can be asserted that if man was not free to choose his economic acts, they could not be moral, as morality implies a possible choice. It would be nonsense to reduce the economic autonomy of the individuals institutions which would enslave them, if one has the purpose of moralizing them * * *

"A free society, in which individuals lacked professional con-science and failed to observe their agreements, would achieve a bad economic output; misery would then exasperate jealousy; social peace would be impossible. There is no need today to show in detail the evidence for these deductions, "At last we must go further, and, beyond the economic ground, see that morals are properly the internal law of 'free societies. Because every type of social organization has the same necessity: which is: authority can effectively repress the violations of its commands only when these violations are comparatively scarce.
