

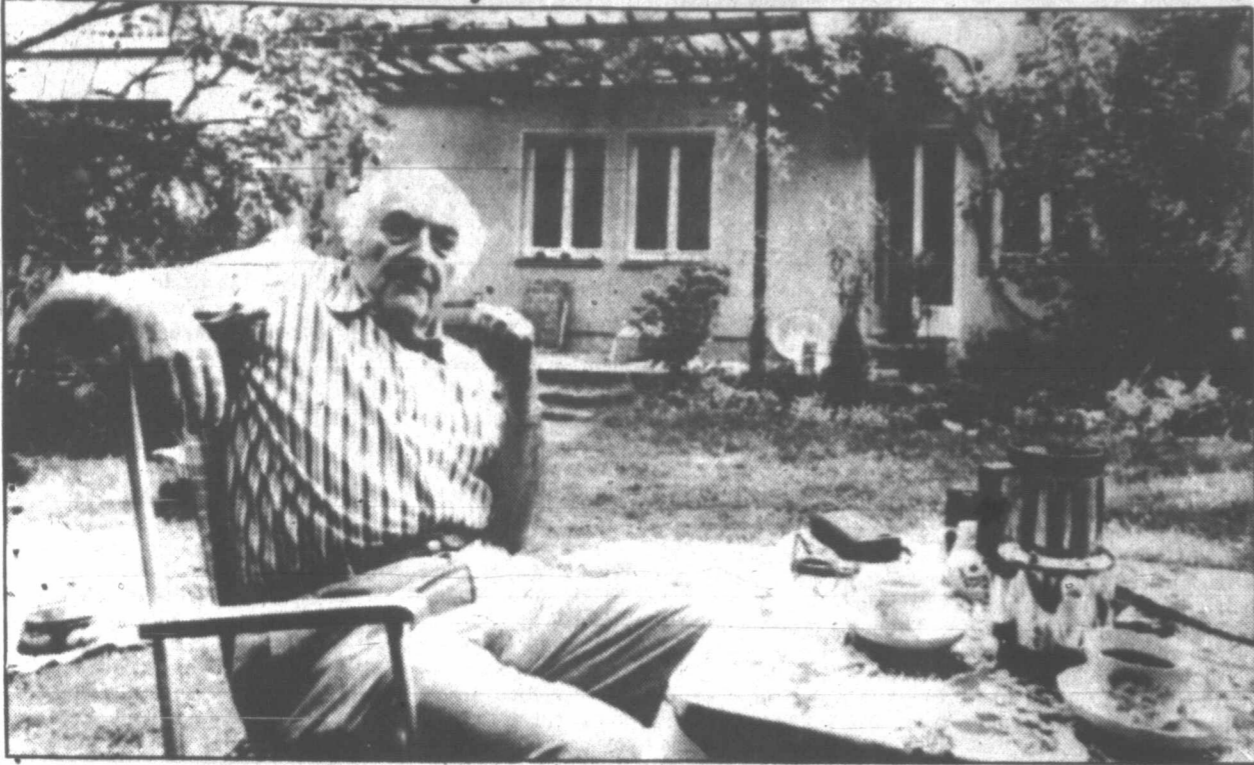








**Banned in East Germany**

**Writing in a country forbidden to read any of his latest books**

BERLIN (AP) — In a small house in the woods outside East Berlin, a noted German author and former American citizen writes busily for a public that is forbidden to read his latest books.

It has been 10 years since anything new written by Stefan Heyn has seen a printing press inside Communist East Germany. Still, he keeps at it, saying the "stupidity" of government censors "cannot last forever."

In the meantime, three of his novels have been best sellers in West Germany, and the 70-year-old Heyn enjoys the rare status of living in the East while publishing criticism of the East German government and society in the West.

His recent books are banned in East Germany, but the public reads his works in volumes smuggled by visitors from West Germany.

Heyn, a committed socialist, was lionized by authorities when he moved to East Germany in 1952 after 17 years in the United States, where he had become a naturalized American citizen. At the time, he denounced American society as "war-like" and "fascist."

But Heyn has since earned the anger of East German authorities because of his outspoken criticism of the communist regime. Officials have denounced him, fined him, and finally tried to silence him by ignoring him. "Today I am absolutely a non-person," he said.

unmentionable, an untouchable," he said in an interview. "Of course everybody finds that ridiculous, and it doesn't hurt me, I must say."

The gray-haired, stoop-shouldered Heyn, who has written 22 books, was born in 1913 in Chemnitz, which was renamed Karl Marx-Stadt after the formation of East Germany.

While he was a writer-in-exile in New York, Heyn helped expose the activities of Nazis in America. His 1942 book about the Nazi regime, "Hostages," was an American best seller and made into a film.

Today he is a particular embarrassment to the East German government although he does not oppose its economic system. He is critical of intolerance on the part of "the boys who run this country."

"I often wonder what Marx and Engels would say if saw this setup," he grumbled. "They would probably be moved to write another 20 volumes."

"Socialism does not mean censorship. Nobody, not Marx or Engels or anybody, ever said socialism means a muzzle," he said.

After he moved to East Germany, Heyn moved into the house where he still lives today, in one of the special housing colonies built for the fledgling country's "artists."

In 1953, he was quoted as saying it was "impossible for an honest man to be an author in America," and he mailed the Bronze Star he had won fighting in the Battle of the

Bulge to President Eisenhower.

But in 1956, he got into a public argument about the development of cultural life in East Germany with former Communist party chief Walter Ulbricht.

Then in 1959, the East German government refused to publish what later became a best seller in the West — "Five Days in June," a novel based on the workers' 1953 uprising in the Soviet sector of Berlin.

In 1979, Heyn published another best-selling novel, "Collin," which deals with an East German author's guilt about his silence during Communist Party purges.

The East German government slapped Heyn with a \$4,000 fine for violating foreign currency regulations by publishing in the West.

He was also denounced as a traitor and an American, even though he gave up his U.S. passport when he became an East German citizen.

After all his troubles, Heyn says he does not regret his return.

"The situation is hard, but it is bearable," he says. "I am not an opponent (of the East German system) ... I am critical."

"I stay here because it is a fascinating place to be for a writer. There are a lot of contradictions."

Another reason he stays in East Germany, Heyn says, is to provide encouragement for other cultural rebels.

"If I leave, that is one less independent thinker here," he said.

**Names in the News**

OXFORD, England (AP) — Princess Diana's 19-year-old brother has been banned for life from an Oxford nightclub, accused of being rowdy, swinging a champagne bottle and warning that he could have the club closed down.

Manager Mike Mackin said Sunday he banned Viscount Althorp — Charlie to his friends — from Boodles Club in Oxford.

"After that experience of young Charlie and his pals he's banned for life," Mackin said.

The manager said Althorp and five friends were "jumping around" and ignored two warnings from bouncer Dennis Noble to make less noise.

"He had the cheek to tell Dennis: 'Don't you know who I am? We can get you closed down.' Suddenly he blurted out: 'I'm Princess Diana's Brother.' It made no difference," said Mackin.

Althorp also complained about the price of champagne, claimed he had no money and let an unidentified young woman companion pick up the tab, Mackin said. He left a tip

worth 5 cents, he added. "I felt sorry for the young lady because she'd forked out over 100 pounds (\$150) that night, but young Althorp claimed he didn't have a penny on him," Mackin said.

HOUSTON (AP) — Heart surgeon Dr. Michael DeBakey, who has performed tens of thousands of operations and written over a thousand medical articles, chapters and books, shows no signs of slowing down as he prepares to celebrate his 75th birthday on Wednesday.

DeBakey, chairman of surgery and chancellor of the Baylor College of Medicine, will supervise a multiple organ transplant center to be established at Baylor and The Methodist Hospital.

"Probably 40 to 50 physicians and scientists will be involved in the transplant center when it is fully operational sometime next year," says DeBakey, noting that surgical teams for transplanting heart, lungs, liver pancreatic tissue and bone marrow will be added to an already existing kidney

transplant program at Baylor.

In addition to medical writing and treating patients, DeBakey has designed 60 operating instruments. Commenting on his activities, DeBakey says, "Man was meant to work hard."

NEW YORK (AP) — Former late-night talk show host Tom Snyder has been suspended for a week without pay from his local TV newscasting duties because he made an obscene gesture while on the air, the New York Post says.

The Post says the suspension, to begin Monday, will cost Snyder \$13,000.

Snyder, 47, a newscaster on WABC-TV, described himself as "embarrassed" and "ashamed" over making a finger gesture to someone off camera as he fiddled with his earphone during coverage Friday of the shooting down of a South Korean airliner, according to the newspaper.

News personnel at WABC referred all queries about the incident to a public relations spokeswoman who could not

be reached at home or at work for comment.

Jack Bonanni, WABC-TV's station manager, said he could not say whether the Post report was accurate because he had been away from the station Friday.

The Post quoted Snyder as saying, "I was not aware I was on camera. But that does not excuse it in the slightest."

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Actress Shelley Duvall, who has made a name for herself in movies including "Nashville" and "The Shining," finds an agreeable element of make-believe in her latest endeavor, producing television programs.

The 34-year-old Miss Duvall has just completed filming 15 50-minute episodes of "Faerie Tale Theatre" for the pay-TV service Showtime.

Aided by such stars as Vincent Price, Elliott Gould and Jean Stapleton, Miss Duvall has been turning out "fairy tales with a sophisticated sense of humor."

"I've been told I inspire trust in others," says Duvall.

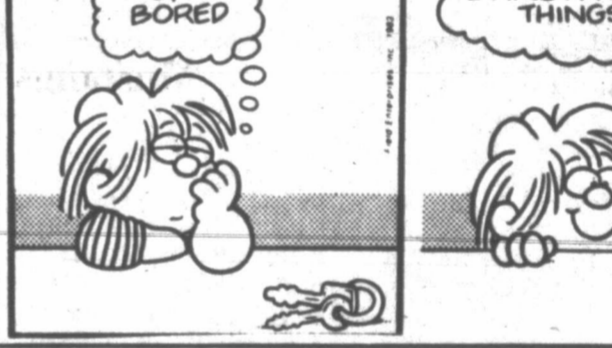

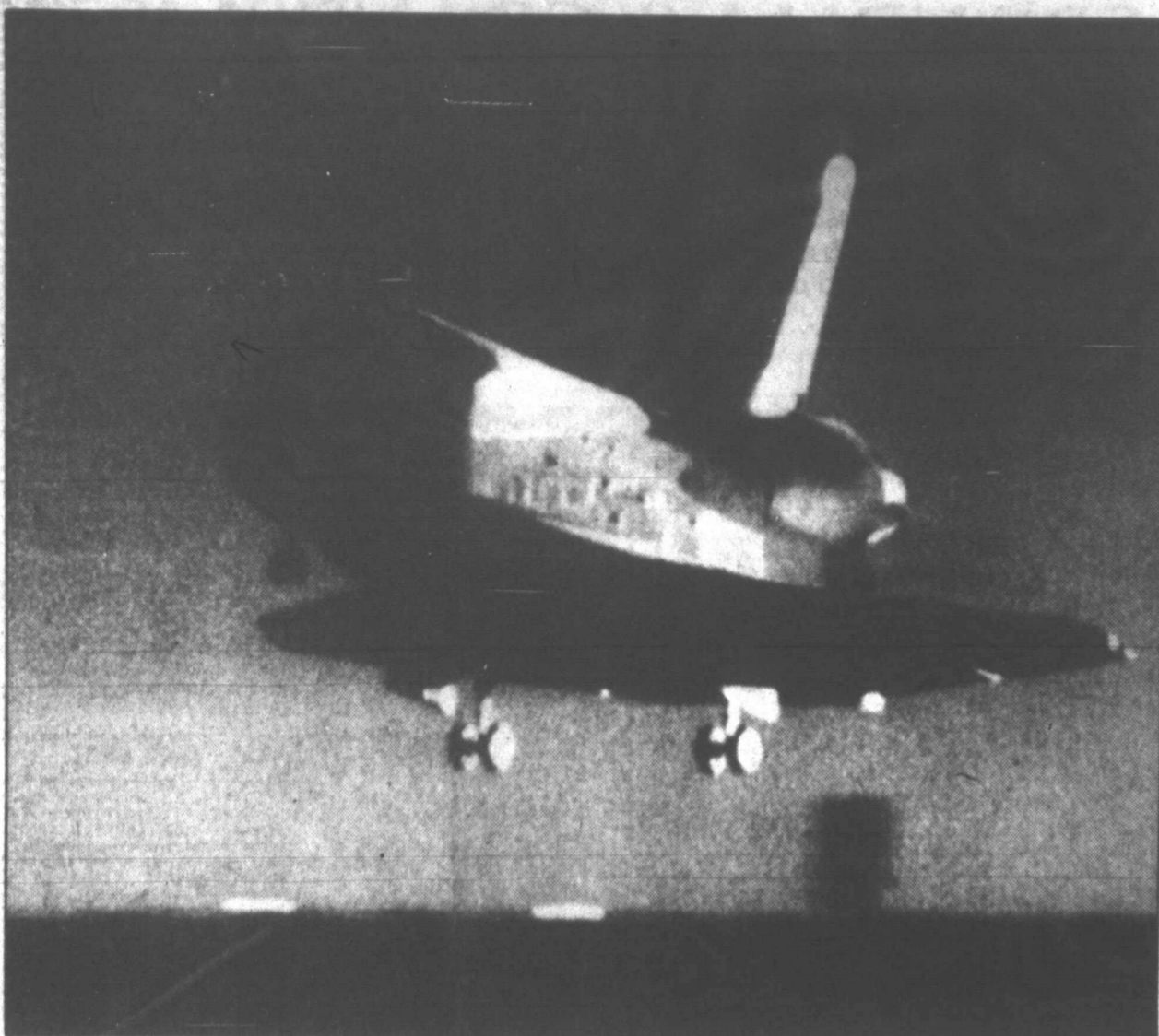

Rebels attack third largest city

SAN MIGUEL, El Salvador (AP) — Leftist guerrillas unleashed an artillery barrage on the country's third largest city and killed or wounded at least 60 government troops in possibly the heaviest rebel offensive in three months.

Civilian and military sources said at least 80 mortar rounds fell on the barracks of the army's 3rd Infantry Brigade and other buildings in San Miguel — the rebels' first major mortar attack on a city. In most instances the guerrillas have used automatic rifles, machine guns and hand-held rocket launchers.

U.S. military sources here said Sunday they had expected such an attack for months, because rebels want to turn the tide of an aggressive military campaign over the last three months.

Guerrilla commander Joaquin Villalobos, talking over the clandestine Radio Venceremos, said two battalions from a crack rebel brigade were involved in the attacks, with an estimated force of 500 guerrillas.

The mortar barrage was accompanied by an incursion into

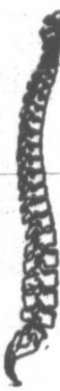
the city on all four sides by the rebels, the destruction of a coffee plantation and three large bridges, and the shelling of a major sugar mill south of the city.

It began Saturday night, when rebels opened a barrage of 81mm and 120mm mortars against the 3rd brigade and garrisons of the treasury police, national police and national guard located in the heavily fortified city.

One shell made a direct hit on a barracks in the brigade, killing six people and wounding 35. Other shells destroyed parts of the bus terminal, treasury police barracks and two private houses, killing two elderly women.

In other fighting at least 12 troops and five guerrillas died.

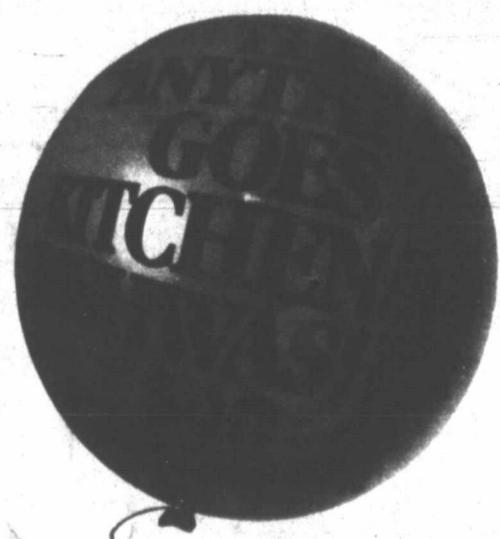
