Revamped water proposal



goes to individual districts

AMARILLO – Members the water in storage in 50 of Groundwater Management Area 1 will be returning to their individual groundwater district boards with another proposal concerning how much water they want to retain in the aquifers beneath the Texas Panhandle for future generations.

In December, Groundwater Management Area 1 board members voted to send a proposal back to its member groundwater districts that would keep 40 percent of

years in Dallam, Hartley, Sherman and Moore Counties on the western side of the panhandle.

The proposal would allow Hemphill County on the eastern side of the panhandle to keep 90 percent of their water in storage for 50 years, while the remaining 13 counties - Gray, Carson, Wheeler, Roberts, Randall, Armstrong, Donley, Hansford, Ochiltree, Lipscomb, Hutchinson, Potter and Oldham Counties - would have 50 percent of their

water left in storage in 50 years.

In action taken at their meeting here Friday afternoon, the Groundwater Management Area 1 board, which consists of representatives of the White Deerbased Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District (the groundwater district in which Pampa resides), the Dumas-based North Plains Groundwater Conservation District. High Lubbock-based Plains Underground Water District and Canadian-

Texas health department takes over recall

DALLAS (AP) - The Texas Department of State Health Services is taking over the recall of products shipped from a peanut processing plant that shut down amid nationwide salmonella fears.

The state agency is stepping in because the Peanut Corp. of America plant in Plainview has been unresponsive, state officials said Friday.

The Lynchburg, Va.-based Peanut Corp. of America filed for Chapter 7 bankruptcy Feb. 13.

The day before, Texas health officials ordered an initial recall of all products ever shipped from the Panhandle plant after inspectors found dead rodents, feces and bird feathers in a crawl space above a production area.

"When you order a recall and don't get a response you've got to do something to protect the public," Doug McBride, a spokesman for the Texas Department of State Health Services, said Friday. "They weren't going to do it, so we are doing it."

State health safety workers are now notifying manufacturers, distributors and retailers believed to have received products from the Plainview plant and asking them to take appropriate action to protect consumers.

Some companies who did business with PCA have already issued recall notices in response to news coverage last week. Notices are also posted online at www.fda.gov.

CAPE CANAVERAL. Fla. (AP) — NASA delayed the launch of space shuttle Discovery for a fourth time on Friday amid valve concerns, and managers are uncertain when the flight will take place.

Following a 13-hour meeting at Kennedy Space Center, shuttle managers decided against launching next week. The launch had been targeted for no sooner than Feb. 27; no new date was set. Officials said they believe they have a realistic shot at launching

Discovery to the international space station before mid-March. After that, the shuttle would have to get in line behind a Russian Soyuz launch with a new space station crew, and the next opportunity for Discovery would be after April 6.

NASA originally hoped to send Discovery to the broke during the last shuttle launch in November.

Shuttle program manager John Shannon said "we were really, really close" to approving the launch. But some of the test data were not available until late in the week and did not allow for full scrutiny, and a few small mistakes were found

in the data.

He said more tests will likely be needed.

NASA wants to make sure if another valve breaks, Discovery and its seven-man crew will be safe. Officials said they're still not certain why the valve cracked on the last flight.

The three valves are located in the shuttle engine compartment and route gaseous hydrogen into the fuel tank to keep it pressurized properly. Only nine space shuttle flights remain.

Woman blames copter maker and operator for son's death

BEAUMONT, Texas (AP) - A woman whose son was killed when a helicopter headed to an oil platform crashed in the Gulf of Mexico is suing two companies in the death.

Gayle Spikes filed a lawsuit against helicopter transportation company Rotorcraft Leasing Co., LLC and Fort Worth, Texas-based Bell Helicopter Textron, Inc., the craft's manufacturer.

Her son James Cody Smalts, 23, of Conroe, was one of five men who died Dec. 11 when the air taxi helicopter they were in crashed south of Sabine Pass.

According to the lawsuit, Smalts' he had been in the water for about 4 1/2 before his body was found. He

died from asphyxia due to drowning, with complications from hypothermia, the Beaumont Enterprise reported.

Before the helicopter crash, snow fell over Southeast Texas for the first time in decades. The lawsuit said "the helicopter sat outside, uncovered, in an ice and snowstorm and was covered with ice and snow" before the flight left.

The lawsuit alleges that Bell Helicopter was negligent by designing the helicopter to be "susceptible to engine failure caused by ingestion of snow and ice." Rotorcraft was negligent in the maintenance and operation of the helicopter, the suit contends.

A man who answered the telephone at Rotorcraft on Saturday declined to comment. Bell Helicopter did not return a message left by The Associated Press on Saturday.

A preliminary report from the National Transportation Safety Board said pilot Joseph Laugelle of Quincy, Mass., filed a flight plan with the company's communication center. But it did not receive a status report 15 minutes later, which was company policy.

Spikes seeks to recover funeral and burial expenses plus damages for the mental anguish and pain and suffering her son experienced while waiting to be rescued.

AUSTIN (AP) - The fatal capsizing of a Texas A&M University sailboat last June was due in part to the school's inability to keep adequate records and examine and repair its fleet, according to a report



The 52-page report provides a more detailed look at the Texas A&M fleet than a summary of the Coast Guard's findings released in December, according to the newspa-

"Vessel's hull failed after multiple groundings, improper storage of the

vessel on its keel in the marina and inadequate repair to known damage," the report stated.

Only 15 of the 65 boats at the Texas A&M-Galveston campus survived Hurricane Ike, and those vessels are still grounded, Cook said.

based Hemphill County Underground Water Conservation District, changed the proposed water storage amount, or desired future condition of the aquifer, for Hemphill County from 90 percent to 80 percent.

The new resolution has been sent back to the member districts for their boards approval or disapproval before a public meeting of GMA1 on March 13, to decide the desired future condition of the aquifer and submit that decision to the state for water planning purposes.

The decision to lower the amount of water in storage in Hemphill County was made following a computer model report from the Texas Water Development Board that indicated if the surrounding counties Hemphill County all pumped 50 percent of their water, Hemphill County could not pump any water if they were to meet their 90 percent goal

Mesa Water, which is seeking buyers for the some 200,000 acres of water rights it holds in three different groundwater districts in the panhandle, has complained to state lawmakers and the Texas Water Development Board over the differing desired future conditions across the Groundwater Management Area.

Mesa said that the landowners in Hemphill County are being prevented from pumping and selling their groundwater at a

At the same time, at least one lawsuit has been filed because the North Plains district has a policy of allowing the western portion of their district - Dallam, Hartley, Sherman and Moore Counties - to pump up to 60 percent of their water while restricting the eastern counties - Ochiltree Hansford, Lipscomb and Hutchinson Counties - to pumping only 50 percent of their water resources. With the Canadian

River Municipal Water Authority, of which Pampa is a member, negotiating to buy some of Mesa's water rights, including some in Ochiltree, Lipscomb and Hemphill Counties, the value of that water and the amount that can be pumped could be crucial to Pampa's future water supply.

The Plainview plant operated unlicensed and uninspected for nearly four years.

Andrew Goldstein, the bankruptcy attorney for the peanut company, did not immediately return a phone message left by The Associated Press.

Federal investigators last month identified a Georgia peanut processing plant operated by Peanut Corp. as the source of the salmonella outbreak that has sickened more than 600 people and been linked to nine deaths.

More than 2,000 possibly contaminated consumer products have already been recalled in one of the largest product recalls ever.

At the Texas plant, inspectors found a ventilation system was pulling debris from the infested crawl space into production areas. The plant, which voluntarily closed Feb. 9 after preliminary tests showed possible salmonella contamination, was also ordered by the state to stop producing and distributing food products.

McBride said he did not know the volume of peanut products produced by the Plainview plant since its opening in March 2005.

State officials said they will try to force Peanut Corp. to pay for the cost of the recall.

Jackson: GOP governors "posturing" on stimulus

ATLANTA (AP) - The Rev. Jesse Jackson accused GOP governors who are considering turning down some money from the federal stimulus package of "political posturing" and said such a move would hurt everyone, especially the South.

Though none have flatly rejected the money available for education, health care and infrastructure, the governors of Texas, Mississippi, Louisiana; Alaska, South Carolina and Idaho have all queswhether the \$787 billion bill signed into law this week will help the economy. Texas Gov. Rick Perry said earlier this week he would accept the money available under the package and South Carolina Gov. Mark Sanford said being against the plan doesn't preclude taking the money. Louisiana Gov. Bobby Jindal said Friday he doesn't want his state to tap into \$98 million in stimulus money for expanding unemployment benefits for thousands of people who wouldn't normally be eligible to receive them. He

said accepting the money would require a permanent change in state law that would force businesses to pay higher unemployment taxes once the federal dollars run out in a few years. U.S. Rep. James Clyburn, D-S.C., was especially critical of southern Republican governors who might reject stimulus funds, calling such a move "slap in the face of African-Americans." Clyburn, the highest-ranking black congressman, said Texas, Louisiana and

put their interest for people over any kind of ideology or political dispute."

Jackson said the govershould follow nors President Barack Obama's example of bipartisanship.

"People in the South and in the rest of the country need the money," he said. "To say you don't want the money, but to receive it is to posture. The stimulus will help all Americans. The governors should welcome that gladly."

Sanford spokesman Joel Sawyer said South officials are Carolina reviewing the bill to determine whether to reject part ing to Louisiana." or all of the money. He took issue with Jackson's comments, saying rampant

lus bill will devalue the dollar, hurting the poor.

"We would certainly challenge the premise," Sawyer said. "We think this bill is ultimately going to hurt the very people Mr. Jackson's talking about."

Kyle Plotkin, Jindal's press secretary, also dismissed Jackson's comments.

"Nonsense," he said. "The governor was elected to serve the people of Louisiana and he's fulfilling that obligation by taking a close look at the bill to see what strings are



South Carolina "are in the proverbial black belt" and for the governors of those states to decline dollars would hurt black residents. Those governors have rejected Clyburn's com-

ments as absurd and divisive. On Friday, Jackson, head of the Rainbow PUSH Coalition, said the poor who are disproportionately located in the South cannot afford to be left out

of the stimulus plan. "It would be hurtful to the region," Jackson said. "The governors themselves are living quite comfortably, living in public housing. They should





Boomers love a challenge and believe in the common good. It's a powerful mix. We are constantly looking for balance but with the idea that life is




Benson reported to camp as a non-roster invitee. The Rangers, who are looking to add depth to their rotation, worked out Benson earlier in the week.

Arrest in deaths of Curry ex-girlfriend, her baby

CHICAGO (AP) - Police said Saturday they had arrested a suspect in the slayings of the former girlfriend of New York Knicks' player Eddy Curry and her infant daughter.

Police spokeswoman Laura Kubiak confirmed Saturday that one person was in custody. She said charges were pending.

Kubiak said police believe the person under arrest killed Nova Henry, 24, and her 9-month-old daughter, Ava, who were found dead of multiple gunshot wounds in their apartment on Jan. 24.

Henry was the mother of ex-Chicago Bulls player Curry's 3-year-old son. The boy was found unharmed at the scene.

Knicks spokesman Jonathan Supranowitz said by email to The Associated Press that Curry had no comment.

Kubiak said she could not confirm details of the arrest. The Chicago Tribune reported Saturday that Henry's mother, Yolan Henry, said a detective informed her after midnight that a Chicago man, a more recent boyfriend of her daughter's, was in custody.

MEXIA, Texas (AP) — Stanford Financial Group, which federal regulators say is involved in a massive investment fraud, has described members of its board of directors as seasoned financial minds overseeing the bank's executive team.

In fact, two of those members who live in this dusty Central Texas town are octogenarians who live in quiet retirement. One of them is a stroke victim who hasn't communicated with anyone in almost nine years.

The other is James Stanford, the 81-year-old father of the central figure in the alleged fraud, R. Allen Stanford. The elder Stanford keeps a small office in Mexia (pronounced Muh-HAY-uh) with a sign that says "Stanford Financial Group" outside but who readily acknowledges he just uses it as a place to "hang out."

Richard Goswick Sr. said. And the Texas cattle ranch, whose description conjures up images of vast acreage with thousands of heads of cattle, was about 40 acres and a handful of livestock.

Even before the elder Goswick's stroke, Richard Goswick said neither his father nor James Stanford had the financial knowledge to understand what would have been happening in the company.

"These two gentlemen were so far out of place," he said.

Employees and clients of Stanford Financial were told a different story. Besides the imagery of a gentleman cattle rancher, a 2008 letter to shareholders said the directors, "most of so it's likely he already whom have been with the bank for most of its 22year history, have been instrumental in our prior success and will continue to play a vital role in the bank's future." Goswick said the men were given positions on the board in its infancy and were kept on through the years. A bank's board of directors is responsible for overseeing management's stewardship of deposits and investments. But only two people on the board ----Stanford and James Davis, his college roommate knew how the money was invested, the SEC alleges. Richard Goswick said he has never had a business relationship with Allen Stanford, but did see him socially on occasion, mostly many years ago. In contrast to his son, who is a knight in Antigua and lived an opulent lifestyle with homes in several countries, James Stanford and his wife have a small white frame home

with black shutters. He declined to discuss the contrast between his lifestyle and that of his son's, except to say that he and his wife "choose to live modestly."

"I don't have anything to hide," said James Stanford, who said he would participate in board meetings via teleconference.

James Stanford said the first inkling he had that his company was troubled was when his son called him last week and told him to look at a weekend edition of The Wall Street Journal. "I was totally surprised,"

he said.

His

But Allen Stanford has faced hundreds of millions of dollars in federal tax liens going back to 2007, was aware of the problems.

Allen Stanford was born in Mexia, but left at the age of 9 when his parents divorced. He went to high school in Fort Worth.

Local businessman Dick Flatt said that Allen Stanford is not well-known in Mexia.

"I doubt that a handful of people know who Allen was, older people know James," said Flatt, who owns Flatt Stationers downtown and gained brief fame when then-Sen. Phil Gramm said he considered his constituent Flatt's needs when making decisions in Washington. Several people around

Mexia expressed respect for the elder Stanford, who Flatt said was "a pillar of the community.'

"James has got a very good reputation. He's a good guy," he said. "It's just a sad deal," Flatt said.

Goswick said his mother told him that the elder Goswick wanted to resign, but Allen Stanford wouldn't let him because Goswick deserved the income.

"That is a statement of generosity," he said. He declined to discuss how much his father was paid, but noted his father is not wealthy.

"My parents have a very modest income," he said. 'They don't have a \$1 million retirement account," he said.

Billie Stanford, 73, Allen Stanford's stepmother, said that townspeople had been kind as news broke. A Baptist preacher who they didn't know stopped by and said the church's congregation was praying for them.

James Stanford said he couldn't believe the allegations against his son and would be heartbroken if they were true. But he added his advice: "Do the right thing."

Allen Stanford, who has an offshore banking empire, is accused of perpetuating an \$8 billion fraud by luring investors with promises of high returns. James Stanford, who uses a walker and has difficulty moving his neck, said he was blindsided by the allegations: "I have no earthly knowledge of it," said Stanford, who ran a small insurance company from this town of 6,600 about 100 miles south of Dallas.

In the early 1980s, James Stanford said he and his son bought distressed properties in Austin and Houston during the oil industry bust and the S&L crisis in the 1980s, when prices were precipitously low, upgraded them and sold them when the market got better.





"I thought it was an interesting parallel," he said of the title character in his new ballet "Marie," which holds its world premiere this week in Houston. "She died for the sins of France and all the kings and queens that had gone before her. It wasn't necessarily for her. She was a victim.'



While arts companies around the country are cutting productions, laying off staff and even closing, Houston Ballet is readying the three-act story ballet about the life and death of the woman at the center of the French Revolution.

The production already was on the drawing board and contracts signed before the money crunch hit nationwide, prompting companies like the Sacramento Ballet to cancel the rest of its season, the New York City Ballet to shorten its summer season and the Miami City Ballet to eliminate its live orchestra and trim its dancer roster.

But C.C. Conner, Houston Ballet's managing director, said the nation's fourth-largest ballet routinely provides for new productions in its annual budget.

"We're not one of the companies that only does it if we can go raise specific money for a specific ballet," he said. "It's philosophical for us to know we're going to do new productions on an ongoing basis."

He also noted Houston Ballet, with 54 professional dancers, a \$20 million budget this year and a \$60 million endowment, has a tradition of staging big full-length ballets with original stories.

"Marie" could cost \$1 million, Welch said.

The production is scheduled for six performances beginning Feb. 26 at Houston's Wortham Theater. Then the cast hits the road for New Orleans where "Marie" on March 27 was to be the first dance performance at the newly renovated Mahalia Jackson Theatre.

Welch acknowledges the subject matter isn't without risk, but sees ballet often falling into a habit of marketing the easy sell of "anything Walt Disney did."

'But we're not a kid's art form," the choreographer said. "We deal with entirely adult subjects, although every now and again we might have a child-oriented thing

Melody Herrera, Houston Ballet's 25-year-old principal dancer, has the lead role, playing Marie beginning at age 13 when she learns she's being sent to France until she is executed at age 38.

"To see things like ballets and operas and art can be an enriching experience and certainly Marie Antoinette is a large figure in history," she said. "It's a very emotional story. It's a very complicated story."

Being a new work can be an advantage, she said, "as far as making things your own, making things fresh, making it unique."

"But it's also a little bit more pressure because no one's ever seen it."

At the guillotine, Marie "dies with her dignity, that she served her purposes and stayed strong," Herrera said. "I really like that part."

The music of Russian composer Dmitri Shostakovich, politically persecuted by Stalin, provides the score arranged by Ermanno Florio.

"The melodies are very beautiful, but there's always this harmonic undercurrent of tension and stress," Florio said. "And so the music fits very well."

Almost two years in the making, London-based designer Kandis Cook created the sets and more than 150 costumes ranging from tattered garments for rowdy Parisian revolutionaries to Antoinette's royal wedding gown.

"It's very exciting," she said. "It's an honor to be doing pieces of this scale. It's very rarely done."







Octuplet mom and doc benefited from alliance

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Long before she gave birth to her octuplets, Nadya Suleman delivered for her fertility specialist.

Like clockwork, she had babies every year but one between 2001 and 2006. The six children she had during that period accounted for a big share of the success stories at Dr. Michael Kamrava's clinic. And Kamrava touted his feats with Suleman on the local news.

But that track record - together with the birth of the octuplets on Jan. 26 - has raised eyebrows among doctors and ethicists who wonder whether Kamrava disregarded professional standards and used Suleman to boost his stats and improve his standing in the highly competitive and lucrative field.

"A motivation would be improving his rate of live births," said Alex Capron, a professor and bioethicist at the University of Southern California.

"And for him, that would be a noticeable percentage. That would help to explain his behavior."

CALLED TO SERVE Dallas cardiologist reflects on military service

DALLAS (AP) Within days of the 9/11 attacks, Jerrold Grodin responded in a way thousands of other Americans did: He marched into an Army recruiter's office and enlisted.

But Grodin wasn't your typical fresh-faced recruit. He was a 50-something doctor, a board-certified cardiologist with a longestablished group practice at Baylor Hamilton Heart and Vascular Hospital. And he had three college-age daughters and a wife of 26 years, whom he hadn't yet told of his plans to enlist. At a time when his peers were thinking ahead to retirement, Grodin was about to trade in his blue scrubs for green Army fatigues.

Now, approaching the end of his commitment with the Army Reserve, he is being called a hero for his service, which included two tours in Iraq as an internist and critical care doctor.

But eight years ago, his decision caught even those closest to him by surprise. His family thought he was heedlessly putting his life at risk. Friends and colleagues wondered if he was having a midlife crisis.

What would cause a doctor, with a prestigious and lucrative practice, a family man with deep roots in his community, to willingly turn his life upside down and throw himself into the most dangerous place on earth?

The decision brought a feeling of release from an old burden: Grodin was finally answering a calling avoided for decades. The only thing he wasn't certain of was how the Army would react.

"I wasn't sure they would take a 52-year-old guy," he said. "And I wasn't in the best shape.

molded me. We'd look at photos of my dad during the war, shirtless, standing by his plane. Brave Men was my Dad," Grodin said. Grodin said he's always "felt a debt of obligation to repay this country for

keeping our family from being made into soap by the Nazis." And he felt that military service was the definitive way to repay that debt.

His first chance to serve was during the Vietnam War. He was in medical school, however, and a high lottery number in the draft allowed him to finish his studies. "I never felt well about that," he said. His second chance came

during the first Gulf War in late 1990. Again, Grodin thought about enlisting. But his children were too young.

That was that. Until Sept. 11, 2001.

Time to choose

Grodin's second daughter, Shoshana, was a senior at New York University and lived three blocks from the World Trade Center. After the second plane struck the Twin Towers, the Grodins could not get through to her. Anxious passed hours until Shoshana called. She had escaped by foot across the Brooklyn Bridge.

The next day, just weeks after celebrating his birthday, Grodin called a recruiter who told him to report to the Federal Building in downtown Dallas.

Grodin showed up at the appointed hour, 5 a.m., waiting in line with kids more than half his age to undergo a battery of tests and physical exams. At the registration desk, he recalled, a sergeant asked: "Are you here about your son?"

tered. "I'm here to serve my country."

For several weeks, he didn't tell anyone about his visit to the Army office. He knew his wife, Julee, would be angry, and he didn't want to tell her until he was certain the Army would take him.

When he finally broke the news, Julee let him have it.

"I was not happy," she said on a recent Sunday afternoon at the Grodins' home in North Dallas. "I was in shock and devastated and, 'How dare you do something like this big without consulting me? This is a family thing, and for you to do this without, vou know, talking to the family about it.' I was very angry and resentful. It took a while to get over that."

Others were mystified. "I'm sure some people thought, 'Is he crazy? What the heck is he doing?' " said Dr. John Schumacher, a founding partner with Grodin of Cardiology Consultants of Texas. "I'm sure people were going, 'My God, what's he thinking?'"

Schumacher, however, saw something in the impulsive move by his longtime associate that made sense.

"Jerry has always been a very passionate man and always very patriotic and very committed to his Jewish faith," he said. "It isn't surprising to me that he would run out and do this."

Grodin didn't see his act as impulsive, but a long time developing.

Just as Pyle's "Brave Men" had influenced him, Grodin had been inspired as an adult by Theodore Roosevelt, often re-reading the famous speech called "The Man in the Arena."

"No," Grodin said, flus- He memorized the quote in which Roosevelt describes a man "whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly ... who spends himself in a worthy cause" and who, "if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly."

> Another favorite quote was one attributed to Rabbi Hillel, a Jewish leader who lived around the time of Christ: "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am not for others, what am I? And if not now, when?"

In the aftermath of 9/11, Grodin said, "I was very aware that I was at a crossroads, that if I was going to do this, I had to do it now. There was no question there was a national emergency. I knew in terms of my age that I was pushing the envelope (and) that they might not even take me. And I knew that if not

now, then when?" He was commissioned a major on Dec. 23, 2001, and assigned to the 807th Medical Brigade, in Seagoville, southeast of Dallas. By the time he was activated, the war on terror had shifted to Iraq, mired in a bloody insurgency.

Operating under fire

In early 2004, Grodin deployed to Kuwait and then transferred to the 67th Combat Support Hospital at Forward Operating Base Diamondback in Mosul, Iraq. That spring saw a violent uprising among the Iraqi Shiite population.

His first night in camp, Grodin awoke to explosions and a loud voice over the base intercom shouting: "Bunkers! Bunkers! Bunkers!"

In the dark, as he staggered into the concrete bunker, he stubbed his foot and fell. "Who's that?"

someone asked, shining a flashlight and revealing a shelter crammed with nurses and doctors. "Oh, that's the new guy, Major Grodin," someone answered. He realized with a jolt that he was the only one stripped down to his skivvies.

The heaviest action came the nights of April 8 and 9, 2004. A stream of casualties came into the hospital. Because of nearby sniper fire, the medical staff was in "full battle rattle," wearing body armor and heland carrying mets weapons.

triaged the Grodin wounded and provided post-operative care. He worked 48 hours straight. Most of the casualties were American soldiers, but the medical staff also treated Iraqi locals and enemy combatants.

"You're talking about combat trauma, which is primarily high-velocity projectiles, gunshot wounds, very destructive," Grodin said. "You're talking about blast injuries from mortars and rockets. You're talking about burns."

In one case, his cardiology training helped saved a life. A special forces soldier had been shot through the back and the bullet had

deflated his lung. What the medical staff didn't know was that the bullet had also + nicked his heart.



Noticing the soldier's bulging neck veins, Grodin realized the sac around the heart was filling with fluid - squeezing the heart and causing pressure to back . up into his jugular veins. He quickly drained fluid in ; the sac, lowering the blood pressure, and sent the soldier into the operating room. He survived his . wounds.

"It was a good thing he had a cardiologist working in the ER that day," Grodin said.

After Grodin returned from his first deployment, . his wife noticed a difference. "He had a hard time ., relating to the simple, everyday things, like going to a movie, going to lunch, going out to dinner, the things I was used to doing," she said.

Grodin said it was hard to leave the war behind at ... first. After treating soldiers with gaping chest wounds, routine tasks like tracking his patients' cholesterol levels seemed almost superfluous. "It's very hard ... when you leave your men and women behind in your units and you know they're , still doing all that."



His calling

To understand Jerry Grodin's calling, you have to know where he and his family come from.

His grandfather, David Kaplan, was born in Poland. He studied to become a rabbi. But he repeatedly got in trouble for reading U.S. history instead of doing his lessons. He'd read the Federalist Papers and other books by American political thinkers, hiding them inside his Talmud, a collection of texts on Jewish law.

Kaplan arrived in El Paso in the 1930s after fleeing Poland to escape the Holocaust. Turned away from Ellis Island because of immigration quotas, he came ashore at Veracruz, Mexico, made his way to Juarez and crossed the Rio Grande into El Paso.

During World War II, Grodin's grandfather took in Jewish soldiers from nearby Fort Bliss, offering home-cooked meals. "They called it Kaplan's USO," Grodin said.

Grodin's father, from Brooklyn, N.Y., met his mother, one of Kaplan's daughters, over one such meal. Irwin Grodin fought in World War II, flying a B-29 bomber on missions over Guam.

Jerry was born in El Paso in 1949, the oldest of six children. After synagogue, Jerry often walked home with his grandfather, listening to his stories. The old man would talk about how he felt the day he. crossed the Santa Fe Bridge from Mexico into downtown El Paso to become a U.S. resident. "He'd say that to everybody else, the streets of El Paso may be just dust and mud. But to him, they were streets of gold!"

Grodin still treasures a book that his father, who died in April, gave him --"Brave Men," by legendary war correspondent Ernie Pyle. "That book

Ryan's influence on Rangers evident after year

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — When Nolan Ryan became president of the Texas Rangers, he promised an extensive evaluation of the organization that has never won a playoff series.

Only after that would he start making changes.

A year later, there still has been no drastic overhaul of the roster. Both the general manager and manager still have their jobs. And Texas had its eighth losing season in nine years.

Yet under Ryan's influence these really don't seem like the same old losing Rangers.

The Hall of Fame pitcher known for toughness and an unmatched work ethic during his 27 seasons emphasized harder offseason workouts for every pitcher, from youngsters in the low minors to veterans in the major league rotation. Then, on the first day of spring training this month in Arizona, they all threw live batting practice.

Ryan endorsed the plan the team already had in place to build from a minor league system recently tabbed by Baseball America as the best in baseball, a ranking certainly boosted by several top pitching prospects.

And Ryan helped smooth things with Michael Young, the fivetime All-Star shortstop who initially demanded a trade when told of the team's plan to switch him to third base and make room for a 20-year-old prospect.

Ryan still isn't predicting when the Rangers will win again (their last playoff appearance was in 1999), but what he's seen in a year on the job has given him confidence that they will.

"I'm convinced we're going to get there," Ryan said. "I couldn't say that last year because I hadn't seen enough to make me

"We signed the best pitcher out there, and he flunked the physical," Rangers owner Tom Hicks said. "I saw Nolan recruiting him. Nolan was a big part of why Ben Sheets wanted to come here. Hopefully that will be true when he's healthy."

The pitcher known as the Ryan Express for his 100 mph-plus fastball knew there couldn't be any quick fixes as team president.

Pitchers need time to develop, and not all of them are flame-throwers. Ryan still wants them to approach the game the same way he did.

"We are at the point now where we have some arms and we want to make sure that we develop these arms in the proper manner and teach the things that it takes to be a winner out there," manager Ron Washington said, "And that's what Nolan brings."

While easy to characterize Ryan's approach as old school, player development director Scott Servais prefers to call it a baseball mentality.

"It's about winning," Servais said. "It's about having a feeling for what goes on in a player's mind. What's happening in the dugout, the clubhouse, watching and getting a feel for the competitiveness of our players. He has very good takes on our players."

Ryan's most important offseason move may have been dealing with Young, the face of the franchise and longest-tenured player going into his ninth season.

Young was upset when general manager Jon Daniels told him before Christmas that the Rangers wanted to move him to third base so they could promote Elvis Andrus, who has never played above Double-A.

When Young's trade demand became public in January, Ryan called him and they talked several times. Within a few days, Young announced he would make the move even though he still didn't agree with it.

"My conversations with Nolan were especially productive because I think he knew were I was coming from," Young said.

t Ryan agreed with t Daniels' assessment that Andrus was ready to get his chance. But there was a difference in Young hearing that from Ryan, who won 324 games in the major leagues. Daniels never played and is still the youngest GM in the majors

at 31, a year shy of Young. There was admittedly a learning curve for Ryan when he became Rangers president, even though he has helped run two minor league teams, owns a bank and cattle ranches and has his own line of beef.

The timing of his hire, just before spring training last year, prevented Ryan from having much influence on the start of the 2008 season. Plus, he was initially more involved in the business side than the pitching staff, something that he changed this offseason.

Ryan showed early patience last season, not making a managerial change when Texas was 7-16. The team then won seven straight series and was six games over .500 in early August.

In the front office, however, Ryan made several key hires.

Longtime Rangers catcher and fan favorite Jim Sundberg, former baseball Hall of Fame president Dale Petroskey and former Astros and Tigers executive Rob Matwick became executive vice presidents working closely with Ryan.

"Nolan's changed our culture, which is one of the things I knew we needed," Hicks said. "We had gotten away from kind of a baseball culture for lots of reasons. ... The team he's brought in, our management team, they love baseball and they understand the game. That was an important step."

feel that way."

Everybody knows that for the Rangers to become playoff contenders, they will have to depend on the development of pitching. Texas led the majors in scoring and batting average last season, but had the highest ERA (5.37) and most overworked bullpen.

The 62-year-old Ryan, who threw a record seven no-hitters with 5,714 career strikeouts, still looks fit enough to take the mound. But his role is much different from what it was when he ended his playing career with the Rangers (1989-93).

Now Ryan shares his knowledge and experience while providing quite an example to follow.

"If anybody's got credentials and credibility, it's Nolan," said Mike Maddux, the new Rangers pitching coach.

The Rangers had two offseason pitching camps, mostly for up-and-comers. Among those in the second one last month, with Ryan closely watching, were hard-throwing 20-year-old Neftali Feliz and four of the team's first-round picks since 2004.

"When you see the caliber of kids that are here and where they are in their development, you feel pretty good," Ryan said. "That still doesn't equate to a winner. They have to execute once they get here, but I feel good about where they are and what I'm seeing."

Those are the future arms. The Rangers expect to go into this season with a familiar rotation: led by Kevin Millwood and Vicente Padilla, with Scott Feldman, Matt Harrison and Brandon McCarthy.

Texas tried to add free agent right-hander Ben Sheets, but a two-year deal with the NL starter in last year's All-Star game fell through because of a torn flexor tendon in his elbow.







Texas fundraiser receives 10 years probation

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas (AP) — A South Texas Democratic fundraiser convicted of impersonating a lawyer dodged prison time Friday when a jury sentenced him to 10 years of probation.

A day after convicting Mauricio Celis, 37, of 14 counts of falsely representing himself to be a lawyer, the jury deliberated for an hour before returning the sentence, which included the 10-year suspended prison sentence and a \$10,000 fine.

Celis' family and friends applauded when the verdict was read as Celis hugged his defense team. Later, he tearfully embraced his wife, Rosa, before posing for a photograph with lead defense attorney Tony Canales.

In his closing argument Friday, Canales had asked jurors what good it would do to send Celis to prison and requested probation.

"You think anybody in Corpus Christi or the state of Texas is going to touch Mauricio Celis?" Canales said. "This was not a crime of violence. This was not a crime of passion."

But Nueces County District Attorney Carlos Valdez asked the jury to send a message with the maximum of 10 years in prison for each count.

"This is a crime of greed — unlimited, insatiable greed," Valdez said. "Anyone who tampers with the judicial system tampers with the most serious thing we have."

After the sentence, Valdez said he was not disappointed.

"Any time you have a jury decide a case, then justice is done," he said.

He suggested a poorly drafted state law created

enough confusion for the jury to lead to the original conviction on only 14 of 22 counts.

Celis did not comment, but co-defense counsel Hector Canales called the sentence "just and fair."

"We're happy that Mr. Celis is going to be able to be with his family tonight," Canales said.

Earlier Friday, Bishop Edmond Carmody, head of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Corpus Christi, testified that Celis was a generous man who had given \$100,000 toward opening a Catholic high school serving underprivileged children.

"He would do the right thing because it was the right thing to do," Carmody said. Sending him to prison "would be of no benefit to society."

That testimony contrasted with prosecution witnesses Thursday who painted Celis as a hot-tempered playboy with a habit of flashing an expired reserve law enforcement badge when confronted by police.

Celis plans to file an appeal of his conviction as early as next week, Hector Canales said.

That could create the sticky situation of landing Celis in front of judges who took his political contributions.

Two justices on the 13th Court of Appeals, a sixjustice panel that hears appeals from 20 counties including Nueces County, received campaign contributions from Celis.

Justice Linda Yanez, who accepted a \$2,000 contribution from Celis in 2004, said through her secretary she could not comment Friday.

"She's not able to talk

because the case could possibly come up in her court," Sandra Benavidez said.





AP writers pick 'Slumdog' to win best picture

LOS ANGELES (AP) -Associated Press movie writers David Germain and Christy Lemire would like to agree to disagree more often so they could make fun of each other's Academy Awards picks, but they're in general consensus this time.

Among the top six categories, they diverge only on one: best actor.

Here are their predictions, with both sounding off on best picture and actor, Lemire offering their take on director and supporting actress, and Germain giving their opinion on best actress and supporting actor.

BEST PICTURE

Nominees: "The Curious Case of Benjamin Button," "Frost/Nixon," "Milk," "The Reader," "Slumdog "Milk," Millionaire.'

GERMAIN:

"Slumdog Millionaire" is a wildly different story than "Trainspotting," one of my favorite modern films, yet both showcase director Danny Boyle's remarkable ability to present equal parts humor and horror on screen and deliver an energy-burst of a movie that people walk away feeling good about.

I confess I doubted the instant best-picture buzz surrounding the movie after it debuted on the film-festival circuit six months ago.

I get paid the big bucks to be wrong. "Slumdog" has steamrolled through awards season, dominating virtually every at Hollywood honor that matters, while steadily climbing toward \$100 million hit status.

The movie has four worthy opponents. In some parallel universe where "Slumdog Millionaire" went straight to DVD (as it nearly did in our world), "Frost/Nixon" or "Milk" easily could have emerged as the film to beat. "The Reader" is a high-class drama in every sense. while I admire the technical prowess that went into "Benjamin Button," even though it smothered the story. But the breathless drive and romance of "Slumdog Millionaire", with its noname ensemble and unshakable optimism in the face of terrible hardship, will carry it through to one of the great diamond-in-the-rough triumphs ever at the Oscars.

blending graphic images with unexpected hope. "Frost/Nixon" is probably Howard's strongest work but he's won a best-director Oscar recently for 2001's "A Beautiful Mind." Van Sant managed to make a biopic ("Milk") that's rich and full and never feels like a paint-bynumbers depiction of a famous person's life, but this unfortunately isn't his year. Daldry has made a prestigious picture in "The Reader" but doesn't have a

shot against Boyle.

formance as Richard Nixon, a role he manages without a trace of caricature. His Nixon is everything you imagine the man was, brilliant, fumbling, two-faced, autocratic, terrified, terrifying.

Now that Langella has one, it's a short step for his peers to seize the opportunity to give him the highest film prize, since you never know when he'll come off the stage and do another movie again.

She changes everything in just a few minutes, and considering Judi Dench's win for a brief appearance in "Shakespeare in Love," a win for that kind of performance wouldn't seem unprecedented, or unmerited.

LEMIRE:

It's not the best movie of the year. It didn't even make my top 10 list, my choice for the year's best film, "The Wrestler," sadly is not among the best-picture nominees. But "Slumdog Millionaire" is the unlikely, undeniable juggernaut. And so, after winning every other top prize week after week throughout awards season, "Slumdog" will win the Academy Award for best picture.

What's intriguing about "Slumdog," though, is that it's not the most traditional best-picture pick. Not by a long shot. That would be "Benjamin Button," a huge technical achievement with both sweeping scope and intimate heart. In its own small, vibrant way, though, "Slumdog" is exceptionally well made.

BEST DIRECTOR

Nominees: David Fincher, "The Curious Case of Benjamin Button"; Howard, Ron "Frost/Nixon"; Gus Van Sant, "Milk"; Stephen Daldry, "The Reader"; Danny Boyle, "Slumdog Millionaire.

LEMIRE:

"Slumdog" wins and Danny Boyle wins. The story, based on the novel "Q&A" by Vikas Swarup, is set in the slums of Mumbai but the result on screen is very much in keeping with the British director's tradition of

LEMIRE:

A ha, finally the category on which we differ.

I love Rourke in "The Wrestler" but, admittedly, much of the allure of his performance comes from the art-imitating-life nature of it. As physically demanding as the role obviously was, Penn did something more difficult from the inside with the transformation he underwent to play slain gay rights leader Harvey Milk. He deeply loses himself in the part, there's a charm and softness to it that makes you forget you're watching an actor whose off-screen brashness is as well known as his onscreen intensity. And actors, the largest voting bloc in the academy, may find that more impressive than Rourke's moving

comeback. Langella is, of course, completely great as Richard Nixon. He very easily could have lapsed into caricature in playing such a widely parodied figure and he never does, instead presenting a multifaceted portrayal of the disgraced former president. Pitt's performance is wide-ranging but "Benjamin Button" is primarily a technical feat. And so, after winning for 2003's "Mystic River," Penn should win the bestactor prize again.

GERMAIN:

I never thought I'd say it, but I'm voting for Nixon.

Yes, Penn is enormously deserving as another fallen '70s political leader. His Harvey Milk is arguably the warmest character Penn has created (save for party dude Spicoli in "Fast Times at Ridgemont High"). And Penn very well might walk away with his second Oscar.

But Frank Langella has crafted a monumental per-

GERMAIN:

Kate Winslet has the Sean Penn thing going. All that finest-actress-of-hergeneration talk. Nominated a bunch of times but never won an Oscar. And now she has two films back-to-back ("The Reader" and "Revolutionary Road") that could have gotten her a nomination.

Penn was in the same boat five years ago when he had "21 Grams" and "Mystic River" out, winning best actor for the latter.

But as with Penn, the Winslet back-story amounts to talking points. He deserved to win, and so does she.

This was not just a comic-book villain; this was an Olympian force of evil whose bad makeup job accentuated the fact that a real demon lurked beneath. Ledger made this repellent madman magnetic, enthralling, even perversely joyous.

The Joker was a force of nature, and as revealed here for the first time in a career that had been spiraling steadily upward, so was Ledger.





There is no fee to file a property-tax homestead exemption. You might receive letters, though, on official-looking stationary offering to file your homestead exemption for you for a fee. Even some people who have lived in Texas their entire lives confuse these letters as a form from a state agency requiring a


