Water districts need consensus

When the Hemphill Underground County Water Conservation District board of directors meets Tuesday evening, they will vote on the same resolution that the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District approved last week.

That resolution, proposed by Groundwater Management Area 1, the

four groundwater districts in the Texas Panhandle, calls for three different goals for conserving the aquifer beneath the region.

The Texas Legislature established groundwater Management Areas earlier this decade in an effort to get neighboring groundwater districts to cooperate in their rule making and plan-

While the initial concern were new single county

groundwater downstate, no one predicted that GMA 1, with three of the oldest groundwater districts in the state that cover most of the largest aquifer in the state, would have disagreements with their joint planning, but

The 16 Groundwater Management Areas around state are to determine the desired future conditions of their various aquifers

and submit that to the Texas Water Development Board by Sept. 1, 2010.

GMA 1, unable to reach a consensus, has agreed to disagree, which they are allowed to do under the law, but there could be some far reaching implications with those differ-

Bob Harden, a hydrologist working for Mesa Water, indicated that he thinks the Groundwater

Management Areas could morph into regulatory agencies, replacing local groundwater districts.

"If this fails," C.E. Williams, general manager the Panhandle **Groundwater Conservation** District, said of the joint planning effort, "we're not going to like what comes

"We need to keep the state out of this," said Water-cont. on page 3

A Pampa ISD maintenance employee was climbing down a ladder after doing work on the roof of the school when he fell and hit a gas line to the school. The gas line ruptured and all students and employees were evaccuated from the school for a short time, according to PISD Superintendent Barry Haenisch.

"We evaccuated the students and Atmos Energy was called immediately,' he explained. "They were able to stop the flow of gas after a very brief period of time." Students were outside of PHS less than five minutes for the evaccua-

The PISD employee is in good condition and had minor scrapes and bruises from the incident. He and other workers were on the roof doing repairs before bidding estimates are made next week to repair the exising roof on the high school.


Frosh rewarded for scores

Pampa— B F Dorman, 82, died Friday, March 6, 2009 in Pampa. At his request, Mr.

Dorman's body was donated to Texas Tech School of Medicine. Memorial mass will be at 11:00 AM Monday, March 9, 2009 at Vincent DePaul Catholic Church with Rev. Joseph Ravi, associate pasofficiating. Arrangements are by Carmichael-Whatley Funeral Directors.

Mr. Dorman was born on Jan. 21, 1927 in Dozier, Texas. He spent his youth on cotton farms in the Texas Panhandle with his parents, six brothers (Bus, Bud, Dave Junior, Charles, Don, and Jerry) and two sisters (Zoella and Viola). He served in the U.S. Army 50th Field Hospital as an X-ray technician in France from 1945-1947. Soon after coming home, he found his beloved, Pauline Semrad, and they married Feb. 14, 1948. He lived the first part of his

adult life in Amarillo. B F studied auto mechanics, worked in the insurance business, and owned and operated a service station before joining Shook Tire Co. in 1959. In 1966, Shook Tire transferred him to Pampa to open and manage a new store. He managed that store for many years, building it into a very successful, wellknown business. He then bought the store, naming it Dorman Tire Co., and ran it for several more years before retiring in 1991.



on the ever-increasing number of convicts cleared by DNA evidence.

Some of the worst cases occurred in Illinois. In 2000, then-Gov. George H. Ryan placed a moratorium on executions after 13 people had been exonerated from death row for reasons including genetic testing and recanted testimony. Ryan declared the system "so fraught with error that it has come close to the ultimate nightmare, the state's taking of innocent

He commuted the sentences of all 167 death row convicts, most to life imprisonment without parole. His moratorium is still in effect.

Across the country, the number of prisoners exonerated and released from death row is more than 130, with thousands of appeals clogging the courts.

Death penalty trials are more expensive for several reasons: They often require extra lawyers; there are strict experience requirements for attorneys, leading to lengthy appellate waits while capable counsel is sought for the

accused; security costs are higher, as well as costs for processing evidence -DNA testing, for example, is far more expensive than

simple blood analyses. After sentencing, prices continue to rise. It costs more to house death row inmates, who are held in segregated sections, in individual cells, with guards delivering everything from daily meals to toilet paper.

In California, home to the nation's biggest death row population at 667, it costs an extra \$90,000 per inmate to imprison someone sentenced to death an additional expense that totals more than \$63.3 million annually, according to a 2008 study by the state's Commission on the Fair Administration of Justice.

The panel, which agreed with California Chief Justice Ronald M. George that the state's death penalty system was "dysfunctional," blamed exorbitant costs on delays in finding qualified public defenders, a severe backlog in appellate reviews, and a high rate of cases being overturned on constitutional

"Failures in the administration of California's death penalty law create cynicism and disrespect for the rule of law," concluded the 117-page report.

prominent Some Californians have asked

Schwarzenegger to get rid of executions. Especially now, as service cuts and tax increases are pegged to fill a \$42 billion budget hole. But it appears that the Republican governor will not abandon capital punishment anytime soon.

Meanwhile, the nation-

wide number of death sentences handed down has declined over the past decade, from 284 in 1999 to 111 in 2008. Reasons significantly, depending on who's providing them: Pro-death penalty activists say it's because crime rates have declined and execution is a strong deterrent; abolitionists say it's because jurors and judges are reluctant to risk taking a life when future scientific tests could prove the accused not

guilty. In Kansas, Republican Caroline state Sen. McGinn is pushing a bill

that would repeal the death penalty effective July 1. Kansas, which voted to suspend tax refunds, faces a budget deficit of nearly \$200 million. McGinn urged fellow legislators "to think outside the box" for ways to save money. According to a state survey, capital cases were 70 percent more expensive than comparable non-death penalty cases.

In New Mexico, Gov. Bill Richardson recently said his longtime support of capital punishment was wavering - and belt-tightening was one the reasons. As the state tries to plug a \$450 million budget shortfall with cuts to schools and environmental agencies, a bill to end executions has already passed the House as a cost-saving measure. The supreme court has ruled that more money must be given for public defenders in death penalty cases, but legislators have yet to act.

In Maryland, a 2008 Urban Institute study said taxpayers forked out at least \$37.2 million for each of five executions since the death penalty was re-enacted in 1978. The survey, which examined 162 capital cases, found that simply seeking the death penalty added \$186 million to prosecution costs. Gov. Martin O'Malley, who disdains the death penalty on and financial

grounds, is pushing a bill to repeal it.

But if convicted killers get life imprisonment instead of death, is that letting them off easy?

Not a chance, says 52year-old Gordon "Randy" Steidl. He lived on death row and then in the general prison population, after his sentence was commuted to life. He preferred his former accommodations.

"If you really want to kill someone, give them life without parole," Steidl said in an even voice. He speaks of his troubled past as if it was trapped under glass or locked behind bars visible but no longer able to torture him.

"It's worse than dying."

Ten years and some lawsuits ago, the White Deer-Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District made water law for the state.

Now, it appears that GMA 1 will be at the forefront of developing state water law, which can be an expensive, ugly and litigious process.

GMA 1 is proposing that 40 percent of the water in the aquifer in the western counties of the North Groundwater District Conservation remain in storage at the end of 50 years, that 80 percent of the water in the aquifer beneath Hemphill County remain in place in 50 years and that 50 percent of the water in the aquifer remain in the other counties in the panhandle at the end of that period.

Panhandle the **Groundwater Conservation** District meeting last week, Harden, Jones and Steve Stevens with Mesa Water all praised the Panhandle district for its stand on setting the desired future condition in the district at 50 percent in 50 years, known as the 50-50 rule, but they wanted the district to vote against the GMA resolution that would allow differing desired future conditions for different areas of the panhandle.

Gray County rancher John R. Spearman, Jr., said that as president of the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District and its representative to GMA voted down. Still, Harden said Mesa

had to deal with different from different groundwater districts.

Mesa has about 200,000 acres of water rights in five counties across three groundwater districts and the difference in storage mandates would affect pumping and, therefore, the value of those water rights.







Today's Highlight in History:

On March 7, 1965, a march by civil rights demonstrators was broken up in Selma, Ala., by state troopers and a sheriff's posse.

On this date:

In 1793, during the French Revolutionary Wars, France declared war on Spain.

In 1850, in a three-hour speech to the U.S. Senate, Daniel Webster endorsed the Compromise of 1850 as a means of preserving the Union.

In 1875, composer Maurice Ravel was born in Ciboure, France.

In 1876, Alexander Graham Bell received a patent for his telephone.



No margin for error

Just how much money should Texas businesses pay under the newly revised franchise tax? That is the question many legislators are trying to answer and one that will soon be up for serious debate.

Calls for re-examining the revised franchise tax (a/k/a the margin tax) have been growing in number as the economy retracts and more Texans lose their jobs. But the economic decline is only part of the reason people are taking a second look at the new business tax.

According to the Comptroller's latest revenue estimate, the margin tax collected \$4.5 billion from Texans after only its first full year a whopping 46 percent increase over the amount collected from the old tax the year before - making it the second costliest tax in the state.

And while an increase in business taxes was expected to some degree, the higher taxes were supposed to be offset by lower property taxes. While school district property taxes did decline by \$2.3 billion from 2005 to 2007, according to the Texas Taxpavers and Research Association Texans' total property tax bills still increased by \$1.7 billion - making for higher taxes on two fronts.

Making matters even worse is that all businesses with at least \$300,000

in total revenue are subject to the margin tax, whether or not a business made money. Since the tax is based on gross receipts rather than profitability, many businesses above the \$300,000 threshold that were unable to turn a profit have been forced to make an impossible choice: close up shop, or take out a loan to pay their tax bill and hope that their business

Hit with a gigantic first year tax increase, continually rising property taxes, and an added "do-or-die" pressure, it's no surprise that many Texas businesses are crying foul.

Fortunately, a number of lawmakers from both sides of the political aisle seem to have taken notice of the issue and have made it a top priority this session. Among some of the more promising proposals that have been filed:

· Four legislators have filed identical bills that would exempt businesses with \$1 million or less in total revenues from the margin tax. Presently, only businesses with \$300,000 or less in total revenue are exempt.

· Another/proposal would amend the constitution to require a threefourths supermajority vote from each house to increase the margin tax rate any further.

· The boldest proposal would

move the business tax exemption threshold from \$300,000 \$600,000 starting in 2010; \$1 million in 2011; and repeal the tax altogether in 2014.

Reforming the margin tax is the first major step the Legislature can take to help businesses and consumers weather the ongoing economic storm, but it is only the first

Beyond lowering taxes, the Legislature needs to tighten its belt and rein in spending. Remember, if legislators can't keep budget growth in check today, then taxes will have to be raised tomorrow.

As the margin tax debate grows to a climax over the next three months, you can be sure that businesses everywhere are watching closely not because businesses are greedy or don't want to pay their fair share. They are watching because their very livelihoods depend on it. They are watching because for them, there is no margin for error.

High cost lenders profit from desperate times

As more businesses close and unemployment lines lengthen, a virtually unregulated sector of the Texas economy continues to rake in huge profits by providing high-cost payday and auto title loan services that often drag desperate families deeper into financial crisis.

A Texas-based provider of such loans recently reported record-breaking annual revenues topping \$1 billion and a net income of \$81 million.

So how do small-dollar loan companies make this kind of profit in the middle of the nation's worst economic crisis since the Great Depression?

In Texas, the answer is clear: they exploit a loophole in state law that allows them to operate as unregulated "credit servic-

es organizations" (CSOs). In 2005, there were fewer than 100 CSOs in Texas. Today, nearly 400 payday, auto title, and other lenders operate more than 2,000 CSO storefronts offering high cost small loans across the state. CSOs in Texas were originally established to control credit repair businesses; however, in the past few years, small dollar lenders are operating as CSOs under a statutory loophole that allows them to obtain

"an extension of consumer through CSO credit" for borrowers.

Unlike other lenders in Texas, CSOs are not subject to any limitation on the fees they can charge. CSOs routinely offer loans with costs exceeding 500 percent Annual Percentage Rate (APR) -- making these loans among the most costly in the country.

At the same time, CSOs also are able to sidestep licensing and enforcement by the state's Office of Consumer Credit which Commissioner, holds other Texas consumer lenders accountable.

Borrowers stung by these CSO loan deals, with high fees and onerous terms, find it almost impossible to escape a widening sinkhole of debt.

One Austin woman recently reported taking out two payday loans totaling \$1,800 from registered CSOs. Because she is not allowed to pay down the principal without paying the loan in full, she must pay over \$400 every two weeks to renew the loans. Despite taking a second job and already paying \$600 to retire the first \$1,000 loan, she still owes \$1,200 on

it, and the second loan, still unpaid is racking up its own renewal fees.

Texans take out an estimated \$2.5 billion in loans

lenders each year and pay an additional \$500-\$600

million in annual fees. Low-income Texans, primarily working women and minorities, disproportionately use payday loans. According to a recent Texas Appleseed survey of low-income payday borrowers, 58 percent of those borrowers could not pay off their loan, plus fees and interest, by the next pay-

Financial regulators in Florida and Michigan recognized this CSO scheme as an evasion of existing laws against predatory lending, and some CSOs, still operating in Texas, closed up shop in those states.

Congress imposed a 36 percent APR rate cap in 2007 on all payday and other short-term loans to

the military, and 15 states and the District of Columbia have a similar provision in place for all residents. Already, some Texas cities -- including San Antonio, Richardson and Mesquite -- have passed ordinances restricting the rapid growth of CSOs within their city lim-

Now, it is time for state lawmakers to protect Texas consumers and hold CSOs accountable to the same regulatory standards that apply to mainstream lenders. Texas has a longheld tradition of opposing usury--lending money with excessive interest rates and fees -- and CSOs should not operate as the exception to the rule.

Wednesday night shuttle launch is official

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — It's official: NASA has finally settled on a Wednesday night launch for space shuttle Discovery.

The flight to the international space station was originally set for mid-February, but was delayed four times because of concern over critical shuttle valves. On Friday, senior

NASA managers meeting at Kennedy Space Center put the valve issue to rest for Discovery and cleared the shuttle for flight.

Seven astronauts will ride Discovery into orbit, taking with them one final set of solar wings for the space station.

Launch director Mike Leinbach said spirits are much higher now than they

were when the flight kept being put off.

"The mood is very, very upbeat," he said. With a firm launch date now, "everybody feels really good."

Managers had ordered extensive testing of the hydrogen gas valves after one broke during the last shuttle launch. The valves control the flow of hydrogen gas feeding into the external fuel tank during the 8 1/2-minute climb to orbit.

The broken valve didn't cause any problems, but NASA wanted to make certain that there was little chance of rupturing Discovery's downstream lines by a valve fragment and, if that did happen, it would not be catastrophic.

A new technique for finding cracks in the steel valves helped convince engineers, over the past two weeks, that the three now in Discovery's engine are free of defects. Valves were replaced when the new method found tiny

Space shuttles have likely flown many times before with bigger cracks in the valves, believed to be the result of wear-andtear, and the valves remained intact, said shuttle program manager John Shannon.

Bill Gerstenmaier, head of NASA's space operations, said he cautioned the shuttle team that "it's time to step back from the issue of the day and think about all the other things we need for flight readiness."

There is a slightly increased risk of danger, for instance, because of last month's two-satellite wreck in orbit. The odds of a catastrophic hit by a piece of space junk is an estimated 1-in-318 for Discovery's two-week mission because of all the extra satellite scrap now circling Earth. Before the satellite collision, the odds were 1-in-336, said Gerstenmaier.






Can Web site offer homeless man hope?

few weeks ago, Tim Edwards was just another ragged guy begging for spare change at a busy Houston underpass, scrounging for food and chained to his alcohol addiction. Most drivers whizzed by without a glance. No one asked his name or knew his story.

Now, thanks to an Internet marketing campaign, unlikely allies, and a Web site with the catchy and controversial name of www.pimpthisbum.com, Edwards has become the human face of homelessness to thousands of online viewers. On regular Webcasts, dozens of people log on to ask questions about Edwards' life and his slow fall from officer manager with a home, a car, and a future to an outcast short of hope and with little prospects of help.

But the Web site does more than offer a reality-TV glimpse of life on the streets. It gives viewers a chance to donate money, services and goods to help Edwards yank himself out of homelessness.

And it does so with an edgy tone that has drawn criticism as well as con-

"We wanted to insult people's sensitivities so that they would go to the site and see Tim, and people seem to have fallen in love with him. He's funny and doesn't blame the world for his situation," said Kevin Dolan, 55, a marketing specialist from the Houston suburb of Katy who started the site with his 24-year-old son, Sean

The Dolans originally began to test a viral advertising campaign, and spark some publicity for the Dolans' new Internet marketing business. They had planned to promote a mom-and-pop business, until Sean suggested using the site to do some good.

If the site had been

"Help called Homeless," many of those now clicking on it might just have passed it by, notes Sean.

Instead, they are getting to know Edwards and getting past the stereotype of an anonymous group labelled "The Homeless."

"I'm the world's first online bum," jokes Edwards, a lanky, bearded 37-yearold who talks about life on the streets with a mix of dark humor and unvarnished honesty. whole idea of this project is to get people off the street. I'm the pioneer, but I've got friends behind me. If I don't get this right, it ain't gonna work for

The Web site's hompage features videos of Edwards and a photograph showing him with a cardboard sign that reads: www.pimpthisbum.com. Under 'Donate" button are icons for Mastercard, Visa and American Express, where viewers can charge their donations.

A donors list shows the names of people who have sent in money ranging from 45 cents to \$101. Others have dropped by Edwards' regular panhandling spot to drop off food and fast-food gift cards or just to shout hello.

Next week, Edwards is

scheduled to enter an alcohol detox program at the Seattle-based Sunray Treatment and Recovery, which is providing the \$13,800 35-day program free of charge. There are plans to air Webcasts as Edwards goes through the program — and judging from online comments, many people will be monitoring his progress.

On a recent Webcast, Edwards was peppered with questions and words of support from his cyberfans.

some homeless Yet, advocates say the site exploits Edwards and does little to address the underlying issues of homelessness. Even the name makes Anthony Love, president of the Coalition for the Homeless of Houston/Harris County, bristle.

"He is a person. His name is Tim. And to pimp anyone is not something I would endorse," he said.

The Web site also stirred up an Internet debate over the merits of the Dolans' approach. One blogger named KatDish noted: "Your impassioned pleas for helping Tim get off the street don't hold much weight when you ask him to hold up a sign that says "Pimp this Bum" and let people know he needs a sharpie and a cheeseburg-

One of her readers named Jody added: "I'm sure they are excited to find their viral marketing working well. I just wish they cared about the outcome of Tim and others who are homeless more than they cared about 'successful business."

But Edwards says he roared with laughter when Sean Dolan nervously approached him with the idea of the website and tossed out the proposed

On that night, in early February, Edwards and the fellow homeless men who have become a tight-knit family were clustered beneath an underpass, getting drunk like we always do." At first, he wasn't sure if the Dolans were a threat or just dogooders bringing some

Now, Edwards says, he believes they were an answer to a prayer born out of his own desperation. He had been mired in homelessness since Aug. 19, 2004 (he remembers the exact date), unable to shake loose severe alcoholism.

He had gone from that first night of sheer terror to someone skilled in the art of survival on the street. Keep to your own territory. Beg enough for the bare necessities: food, cigarettes, drink, then get off the corner. Learn who to trust and who to stay away from.

He had seen close friends die from years of addiction, from infections that raged out of control, from simple, intractable hopelessness. And he had come to the edge many times himself, once yearning to lay down and die.

Then, recalled Edwards, as he and the Dolans stood in the parking lot of a Waffle House restaurant, "I asked God to make it rain and here come these guys. And I thought this is just crazy enough to work."

Edwards says he has tried other programs aimed at getting the homeless off the streets, but none have worked for him.



Report: Guard commanders removed

HOUSTON (AP) — Three Texas military commanders are being removed from top positions following allegations that they received paychecks from the state and federal government for work done at the same time, according to a report by KHOU-TV in Houston.

Gov. Rick Perry is removing Gens. John Furlow, commander of the Texas Army National Guard, and Allen Dehnert, who commands the Texas Air National Guard, the television station reported Thursday. The top commander of the Texas Military Forces, Adjutant Gen. Charles Rodriguez, is also being replaced.

Perry's spokeswoman, Allison Castle, said the removals were not related to the double-dipping of pay.

"The governor routinely appoints new leadership," Castle said, noting that Rodriguez's four-year term expired in

February. However, all three came under scrutiny because they allegedly collected paychecks from the state while simultaneously performing work for the federal government, the television station reported. Rodriguez, Furlow and Dehnert did not go on "state leave" when they performed work for the federal government but instead took "emergency leave," allowing them to continue to be paid by Texas.

Chief Gonda Moncada of the Texas Air National Guard said Friday that the allegations stem from a busy period late last summer in which the officers were assisting with multiple hurricanes that threatened the state. She said in such a situation Guard members are most concerned with helping during the disaster and that administrative paperwork is secondary.

"Nobody would have done something like this purposely," she said.

Perry announced last week he would replace Rodriguez, currently the top mili- under review.

tary officer in Texas. The adjutant general oversees the Texas military's three branches — the Texas Army National Guard, Texas Air National Guard and the Texas State Guard.

Rodriguez, who also worked sometimes for the federal government, is to be replaced by Gen. Jose Mayorga, pending confirmation by the Texas Senate.

Rodriguez told KHOU he was in the process of repaying \$53,000 and had paid nearly a third of it.

"I have every obligation to pay off the

rest," he said.

Dehnert will be replaced by Col. John F. Nichols, who will receive a promotion to brigadier general, and Furlow will be replaced by Brig. Gen. Joyce Stevens.

Castle confirmed that Furlow and Dehner were double-paid but the amount they owed has not been disclosed. In a Jan. 14 memo, the governor' chief of staff, Jay Kimbrough, wrote to Rodriguez telling him to establish a new policy that prohibits the practice for all state employ-

Castle referred questions about how much money Dehnert and Furlow owe the state to the Guard. The Guard's internal audit director, Mike Garner, said he provided Rodriguez in October 2008 with estimates of how much is owed. The Guard would not release the amounts noted in those estimates, KHOU reported.

Meanwhile, a group of senior women officers in the Texas Air National Guard has filed a joint congressional complaint alleging sexual discrimination against the wing commander at Ellington Field. Their allegations were substantiated by Brig. Gen. Thomas Haynes, an independent investigator appointed from outside Texas to look into the matter, KHOU reported.

Police find disabled man filthy, starving

CHANDLER, Texas (AP) — An East Texas husband and wife were arrested on charges of injury to the disabled Friday after authorities found an emaciated mentally disabled man locked in a filthy room of their home.

Roy and Lea Johnson were taken into custody at a Tyler fast-food restaurant around noon, officials said.

Police attempting to serve a warrant on an unrelated matter at the couple's home Wednesday discovered a man clad in an adult diaper hanging to his knees locked in a room covered with filth.

"The place was sickening and the sight of that man reminded me of a wild animal," Henderson County Sheriff's Detective Wick Gabbard said.

Upon being released from the room, the man ran to the kitchen and tried to eat frozen bacon and a TV dinner through the box, Gabbard said.

Family members told officials they kept him confined so "he wouldn't steal their food."

The man was identified as Lea Johnson's brother, Kerry Cotten, and estimated to be in his mid-40s. It was difficult to get details from Cotten because he has trouble speaking, Lt. Botie Hillhouse of the Henderson County Sheriff's Department said.

Cotten was taken to a hospital and later placed in the custody of Adult Protective Services. An APS spokeswoman confirmed that the agency is conducting an investigation but declined to provide details, citing privacy concerns.

Chandler police were looking for Roy Johnson, who was wanted on felony theft charges, when they discovered Cotten.

Johnson wasn't home, but officers noticed an odor coming from inside the house when a teenage girl answered the

"When they got inside, they found this door locked from the outside and they asked what was in there," Gabbard said. "The girl told them it was just her retarded uncle and they might not want to go in

The teenager, Alyssia Johnson, was rrested on a charge of injury to an el ly person. She remained in the Henderson County Jail Friday with a bond set at \$100,000.

Her 19-year-old boyfriend, Curtis Durham, who lives next door, was arrested on a charge of failure to report a felony, authorities said. He was released Thursday on a \$25,000 bond.

In an interview with The Associated Press, Durham said he was arrested because he was in the wrong place at the wrong time, visiting with his girlfriend when the police came. He also said he has previously reported the squalid conditions, saying he placed a call to the Henderson County Sheriff's Department about a year ago. Other neighbors have reported the conditions to authorities as well, he said.

"Alyssia has, too," Durham said. "We did what we thought we had to do." Hillhouse said the sheriff's department

has no record of calls from Durham or others to report problems at the home. Injury to the disabled is a first-degree felony that carries a prison term of five to

Associated Press Writer ALBION, Mich. (AP), Äî Jerry Sacharski crafted his first batting tee from metal piping, some pieces of rubber and part of a garden hose.

Half a century later he still was coaching T-ball, a game that introduced baseball to millions of kids from backyards to the White House lawn.

Many in this college town of 9,100 give Sacharski the nod for being the architect of T-ball, though that kind of recognition made the long-time teacher uncomfortable. He figured that some-body, somewhere, had previously put a baseball on a tee.

What Sacharski is widely credited with doing is developing a set of rules for the game that allowed young children to play before they'd mastered two fundamental but difficult skills: throwing a pitch and hitting one.

The benefits served them well, from Little League onto the majors.


"I loved it. I have some great memories," said Texas star Michael Young, a career .300 hitter.

In 1954, Sacharski took a part-time job as director of the city of Albion's Recreation Department. To get more youngsters interested in baseball, he figured that having them hit from his jury-rigged tees placed atop home plate would make things easier. Not only could the batter hit, other players could learn to field and throw.

Five teams of about a dozen players each took part in the first season of Albion's "Pee Wee Baseball League," as Sacharski called it. The game debuted June 25, 1956, at Victory Park, and T-ball is still played there.

Within a year or two, organized T-ball leagues were popping up everywhere, says his son, who was among those playing that first season.

T-ball pioneer made game a huge hit over 50 years

The game's exact origin is unclear but behind Sacharski, Albion in 1956 became one of the nation's first communities in which T-ball was played as an organized sport.

"He was very sensitive about being credited with actually inventing the game," says Will Sacharski, now 60 and the youngest of three. "He didn't necessarily want to take credit for that."

His father died Feb. 27 at his home in Albion, about 85 miles west of Detroit. Jerry Sacharski was 93 and had spent the past few years in failing health.

After his funeral here this week, some of the original Albion T-ballers, now in their 60s, reminisced about Sacharski and how the game helped shape who they are today.

Tommy Clark says playing in that first league increased his interest in baseball and boosted his confidence as a player.

"It was one of the best

times of my life," says Clark, now 62 and a retired inspector for General Motors Corp.

Clark, who lives in Albion and became lifelong friends with Sacharski, played for the Davy Crocketts. The team that won the title that year was the Porky Pigs, whose players included Dave Bieskie, who lives across the street from Victory Park.

Bieskie says he enjoyed T-ball but his baseball career ended early, at age 13, when he got a job delivering newspapers.

T-ball has come a long way since the 1950s.

These days, about 2.2 million children ages 4-7 participate annually in T-ball leagues around this country, according to the

T-Ball USA Association Web site. Former President George W. Bush, once a part-owner of the Texas Rangers, held T-ball games on the South Lawn of the White House each year he was in office.

Glenn Hoffman, a former big leaguer who is now the third base coach for the San Diego Padres, said two of his five children played T-ball. "To be able to play in an organized game, a structured game, at that age was a great atmosphere for my kids growing up, before it led them into Little League for the 8-year-olds," he

New York Yankees great and now Los Angeles Dodgers hitting coach Don Mattingly has long maintained that players of all

ages can improve their slugging by practicing with a batting tee. All three of his sons have played T-ball.

"Our neighborhood, they had leagues for T-ball to get them started, then they progressed on," he said. "It's funny, because you get kids that are in Little League, they don't want to use the tee anymore because they look at it like this little starting thing that little kids use.

"Then I try to explain to them that guys like Manny (Ramirez) and other guys are all using that. Why wouldn't they want to use it?"

Born Feb. 6, 1916, in West Allis, Wis., Sacharski was a standout basketball player at what was then known as Oshkosh State

Teachers College and is now the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh.

He served in the Army during World War II, reaching the rank of second lieutenant, and played on an armed forces basketball team with several college stars.

From 1951 until he retired in 1980, Sacharski taught at Albion Public Schools, Äî a range of subjects including history, social studies, English and Latin. He also coached high school baseball for many years.

When Rodney Ferguson took over as Albion's recreation director in 2002, many years after Sacharski had left the job, he discovered that the T-ball league needed to be reorganized and revitalized. Ferguson help sought from Sacharski, who dusted off copies of his rules and field diagrams and showed him T-ball film that he shot in the 1950s.

To Ferguson's surprise, Sacharski also returned to the diamond that year as a T-ball coach, which he continued to do through 2006, when he was 90.

"The big thing with Jerry Sacharski was he invested his time in you to help you be a better young person," Ferguson said.

Ferguson said.

Will Sacharski said his father seemed to have an unlimited amount of patience with children and a remarkable memory, even late in life, for their achievements long ago. He enjoyed nothing more than talking with his former players, decades later, and reminding them of their outstanding plays.





Taj Mahal to be inducted into Blues Hall of Fame

Taj Mahal, the blues whose vibrant, worldly music encompassed African-rooted sounds of all kinds, will be inducted into the Blues Hall of Fame.

Mahal, who grew up in Massachusetts as Henry St. Clair Fredericks, has been selected along with New Orleans soul singer Irma Thomas, Chicago bluesman Son Seals and ragtime guitar player Rev. Gary Davis to join the Blues Hall in Memphis, Tenn. They will be inducted in a ceremony on May 6, which will be followed the day after by the Blues Foundation's 30th annual Blues Music Awards.

"I'm very happy that a group of my peers think it's something I deserve after Blues Foundation. "With

music," said Mahal, 66, speaking by phone from the San Francisco Bay area.

California is one place Mahal has spent a lot of time, though the nearly nomadic singer-guitarist notes: "I pretty much move around wherever I like."

The same could be said of Mahal's music, which has for four decades dug deeply into sounds of many places, particularly Africa, the Caribbean and Hawaii. The breadth of Mahal's influences came partly from his heritage and partly from a nurtured openness.

"He was into globalization long before the rest of us," says Jay Sieleman, executive director of the

the years I've put into the Taj, it's not just the music, although that's of course the big thing. It's the whole social history and musicology and awareness that comes with listening to his music."

> Mahal was raised in Springfield, Mass. His mother was a schoolteacher from South Carolina and his father, of Caribbean roots, was a jazz pianist. Later, his stepfather came from Jamaica.

> "As a youngster, my parents made me aware that all that was from the African Diaspora belonged to me," said Mahal. "So I came in with Caribbean music, African music, Latin music, gospel music and blues."

> > Mahal, a two-time

Grammy winner, in 1968 released his self-titled debut, which included contributions from Ry Cooder, an early collaborator. It included the great "Leaving Trunk" (in which he sings "I ain't never seen no whiskey, but the blues made me sloppy drunk"). One of his most famous tunes is "She Caught the Katy (And Left Me a Mule to Ride)," which ended up in the 1980 film "The Blues Brothers."

With a full-bodied voice and predilection for blues that made people dance, Mahal's continuous output through the '70s, '80s and '90s was always with an adventurous spirit. One of his most acclaimed albums came in 1999 on "Kulanjan," a collaboration with Malian kora legend Toumani Diabate.

The international influences, Mahal says, aren't from his constant travels, but from always being fully invested in such music. He sees blues as running far beyond the Mississippi Delta and back through

"I was always taught that Latin, Caribbean people were cousins to me, as well as blues was a cousin to me, as well as Africans were direct relatives to me," he said. "It was all a part of my language."

Still, Mahal's music was always blues at its foundation: "Sometimes the blues is like the whole meal. ... Other times it's like a spice that's thrown in there."

"The blues is played

everywhere," says Mahal. "There's no place I've been where they don't have blues or aren't interested in blues.

Mahal, who last year released "Maestro" and is touring this spring, doesn't know yet if he'll perform at the Blues Hall of Fame induction. But if he does, he, as always, would hope to see people moving in the audience

"Most people that play blues don't dance do it! It's a listening music and a music they have a lot of knowledge about it," says Mahal. "They got country line-dancing down there in Nashville. Why can't we do some blues dancing down there in Memphis?"



FBI raid on Georgia-based food charity raises question

ATLANTA (AP) — For more than a decade, Angel Food Ministries seemed like a godsend for families who purchased its low-cost food boxes and the churches that shared millions in revenue for distributing the goods.

It became an economic juggernaut in the faith community, employing hundreds, feeding thousands a month and pouring \$19 million into its network of more than 5,000 host churches in 35 states.

Now, a lawsuit coupled with an FBI raid at the group's headquarters has raised accusations of financial mismanagement at the nonprofit. The raid and ensuing FBI investigation have left congregations and church leaders weighing whether to cut their ties to the high-profile charity after the reported disclosure that six-figure salaries were paid to its founders.

"We get signed up and I start hearing this," said the Rev. Chad Massey, whose Unadilla First Baptist Church in central Georgia planned to place its first Angel Food order this month. "It's kind of hard to know what to do.'

FBI officials haven't disclosed the nature of the investigation surrounding the ministry.

Angel Food acknowledged that a grand jury investigation is looking into what it called "alleged financial irregularities" involving unspecified individuals — but not the ministry itself.

Meanwhile, Angel Food Ministries board members and former employees have filed lawsuits accusing Angel Food leadership of using the non-denominational nonprofit as a moneymaking venture.

The Rev. Joseph Wingo and wife Linda founded the ministry in 1994 to help 34 families hurt by plant closings in the manufacturing town of Monroe, about 45 miles east of Atlanta.

Since then, Angel Food Ministries has grown to hundreds of workers supplying food for anti-poverty programs at more than 5,000 churches spanning several denominations. There are 473 distribution centers listed in Georgia and more than 1,400 concentrated in Texas, Missouri, Tennessee and Pennsylvania.

All told, the ministry says it serves more than 500,000 families a month. It has no plans to interrupt food delivery.

Families typically order multi-meal boxes of meatballs, ham and other staples from monthly menus, spending roughly \$30 for an estimated \$65 worth of groceries, Angel Food says. Later, they collect boxes at churches that are rewarded with at least \$1 for every box delivered.

At Ebenezer United Methodist Church in assistant Glenda Evans said leaders are sticking by Angel Food. "Hopefully it gets worked out," Evans

In 2006, the ministry reported revenue of \$96 million dollars and \$17 million in expenses. Tax records from that year show the Wingos and two of their sons earned a combined total in excess of \$2.1 million for leading the ministry, up from just less than a combined \$323,000 a year earlier.

Their combined salaries dipped to \$501,472 in 2007, records showed.

Wingo did not respond to repeated AP requests to be interviewed.

In December, the salaries prompted a national Christian charity watchdog group to flag Angel Food as one of 30 ministries donors should avoid. "One family for one year

making ... more than the president of the United States of America is just kind of outrageous," said Rodney Pitzer, a top official at Wall Watchers. "That should be enough for donors to be con-

Two Angel Food board members alleged in a lawsuit last month that the Wingos enriched themselves by at least \$2.7 million and sought to bar the Wingos from their Monroe headquarters. The board members accused the Wingos of directing \$600,000 from Angel Food to their church as a "housing allowance." In a settlement reached

behind closed doors Friday, the Wingos agreed to an audit and to stopping questionable financial practices - like using corporate credit cards for personal expenses — in lieu of being barred from the premises, according to Thomas Rogers, an attorney representing the board members.

Attorneys representing the Wingos would not reveal further details of the settlement, and the Wingos themselves declined to comment.

A statement on Angel Food's Web site called the lawsuit an effort "by two directors who are interested in removing the founders of the ministry -Pastors Joe and Linda Wingo — only to install themselves in the founders place. This is a power grab.'

In an earlier statement, Angel Food portrayed the FBI's Feb. 11 search as part of an "investigation of an individual or individuals connected to the organization, and not regarding the ministry itself."

In disputing the suit, Angel Food said it has been "a model corporate citizen," donating \$5.2 million to more than 5,000 communities in 2008.

Luke Erickson, a pastor at Mountain Christian Church near Baltimore, Md., said church leaders Convers, administrative like himself received an

explanation from the ministry for the high salaries.

"They've invested a lot in it ... there was some kind of compensation given back to them by Angel Food and it was reflected in a large salary in one year," Erickson said.

Finances of prominent ministries have come under scrutiny of late, including a Senate probe begun last year of claims of extravagant spending by some leaders of Christian broadcast ministries nationwide.

The FBI involvement in the Angel Food case could imply far more than just overpaid staff, said Dean Zerbe, former senior counsel with the U.S. Senate Committee. Finance Though not involved with

the Angel Food case, Zerbe said, "If you have ... the FBI knocking on your door of a charity, you've got issues beyond just paying a fellow too much.'

FBI officials had no comment Wednesday, and no charges have been filed.

In Georgia, Donna Foster attends Emmanuel Praise - the Wingos' church — and her son works at Angel Food. Recently, "Pastor Joe found out I was unemployed and he sent me a box of food."

She blamed honest mistakes for any perceived financial mix-ups.

"There are some people you can tell if they're faking it," Foster said. "You can tell that these people are real."

Texas cities report falling revenues

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — More than 20 percent of Texas cities expect less revenue for 2010 budgets, and 45 percent plan to delay major road and construction projects when revenues fall, according to a statewide survey released Friday.

The Texas Municipal League, which lobbies for city governments, surveyed the finances of cities around the state. According to the report, 11.5 percent of cities with more than 10,000 people brought in less money in 2008 than in 2007, and 23 percent with populations under 10,000 were down in funds.

Frank Sturlz, the league's executive director, said cities decided to raise utility fees or put off major projects rather than raise property taxes.

According to the report, Texas cities get more than 60 percent of the their revenue from sales and property taxes. Sturlz said with appraisal values falling and a drop in spending, those sources will continue to fall off and drive city revenues down.
