## 3 injured, home destroyed in gas line blast

BUSHLAND, Texas (AP) — A natural gas pipeline exploded in the Texas Panhandle on Thursday, shaking homes, melting window blinds and shooting flames hundreds of feet into the air, authorities said.

Three people were injured in the blast, which occurred at 1 a.m. near Amarillo, and they were taken to an area hospital with burns, said Potter County Sheriff's Chief Deputy Roger Short.

"My home is about 20 miles something away and I could see the flames from my home," Short said. "You could hear the roar of the flames 20 miles away."

Firefighters were able to contain most of the flames by 5:30 a.m. though small grass fires continued to burn, Short said.

Nearby residents were evacuated, and the pipeline's gas was shut off, Short said. One house was destroyed, and several

others were damaged in Bushland, about 15 miles west of Amarillo, he said.

"The heat onto the homes, it did a lot of damage. You could see blinds inside the homes that were melted ... it was very hot," Short said.

Bushland Middle School principal, Mark Reasor, said about 60 people who were evacuated took shelter at the school for a few hours before returning home before dawn. Gas service had been cut off to nearby homes and Bushland's schools, officials said.

Messages left with the hospital for conditions of those injured were not immediately returned Thursday. A team of investigators was heading to the pipeline, said Robert Newberry, a spokesman for El Paso Natural Gas.

El Paso Natural Gas is a subsidiary of Houston-based El Paso Corporation.

 The Dumas-based North Plains district set their desired future condition of the aquifer over a 50-year period at 40 percent for the western half of the district and 50 percent for the eastern half of their district.  
 Canadian-based Hemphill County district set their desired future condition at 80 percent at the end of 50 years.  
 Panhandle and High Plains have set their desired future condition at 50 percent of the groundwater in 50 years.  
 The districts with higher future conditions, lawyers for Arrington and Mesa said, limit what landowners in those areas can sell.

## Harvesters relaxed for season finale vs Dons

The Pampa Harvesters (2-7, 2-2) are looking to have fun in their last regular season game and close out the regular season with a win over the Palo Duro Dons (3-6, 2-2) 7:30 p.m., Friday at Harvester Field.

Junior Trent Carter said practice has been loose and the defense is enjoying themselves but also getting things done.

"Having fun is key," Carter said. "If you're not having fun then it's not worth being out here. A lot of us now are really excited because we're almost for sure going to playoffs. So all of us are really trying to soak up the moment."

Senior Tyler Hooper agreed and said they have done a lot more funnier drills.

"It's a lot more fun," Hooper said. "It's not as serious. It's still serious but having fun, relaxing and not worrying about much."

Head Coach Heath Parker said his players being loose and having fun seems to fit the team better.

"I came to the realization that regardless of how things went in the Dumas game, they needed to relax and play," Parker said. "I felt like I had them to uptight. We worked hard

on trying to play loose and playing without fear to make plays. Enjoy the time that we have with each other."

Carter said one of the challenges the defense will face is the Dons running backs.

"Number one for us is taking away that trap play," Carter said. "23 has gone 40 yards on a trap play in almost every game this year. So if we can take away the trap that's one less big play ability that we have to worry about."

Parker said Palo Duro's running backs set a state record for yards rushing in their game against Caprock October 9.

"For the first time in Texas High School football two backs got over 300 yards in one game," Parker said. "They are averaging over 300 yards on the ground. They're both really fast and hard to handle when they get to the open field."

Senior quarterback Alex Clendening said Palo Duro's strength on defense is their speed in the secondary but thinks his receivers can handle that challenge.

"I think our receivers will run good enough routes," Clendening said. "I think they will get off on them. They run man coverage but

I think our receivers are better."

Parker said the game is going to come down to the battle at the line of scrimmage.

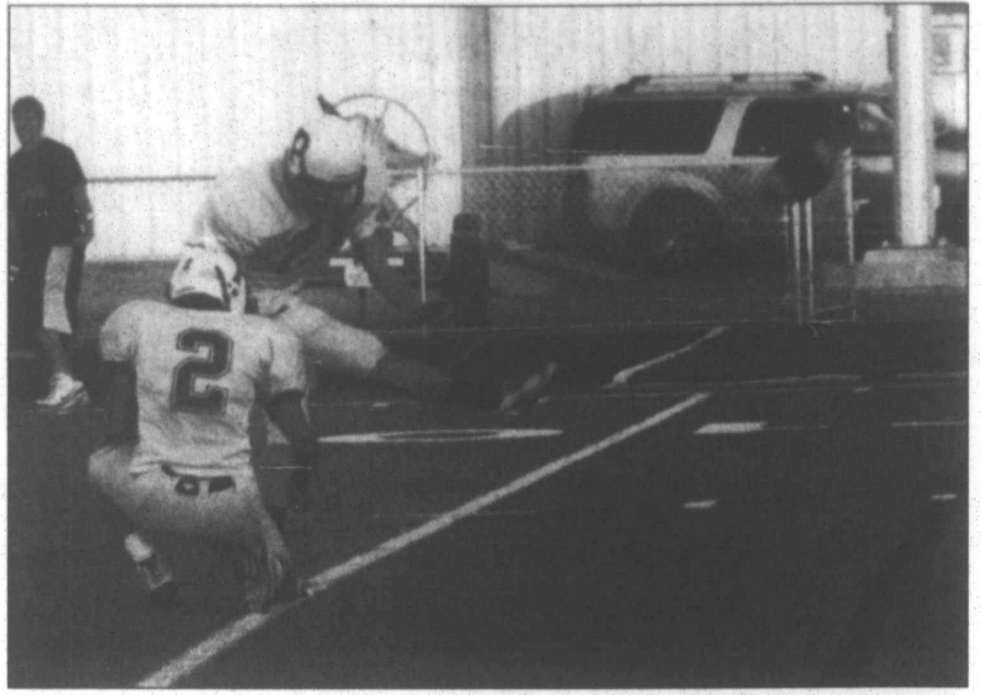
"We understand that for us to have a chance we got to stop the fullback," Parker said.

Clendening said it would be great for the team and the senior class to win their last guaranteed game at Harvester Field.

"We've never been to playoffs before," Clendening said. "It would just be great to seal that playoff spot and know that we would get to go next week."

Parker said a win would be huge for his senior class but would also end their home losing streak.

"One thing we haven't accomplished this year is we haven't stopped our home losing streak," Parker said. "At some point we would like to break that and we are not guaranteed any more games at home this year. It's the last time the seniors might play at Harvester stadium depending on what happens in the playoffs. It would be a nice way to send them out with a win. I'm so proud of the seniors hanging in there and what they accomplished for us."

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York Yankees bolted from the dugout even before the last grounder was scooped up. After waiting nine years for championship No. 27, no one would dare hold them back.

"It feels better than I remember it, man," captain Derek Jeter said. "It's been a long time."

Hideki Matsui tied a World Series record with six RBIs. Andy Pettitte won on short rest and New York beat the Philadelphia Phillies 7-3 in Game 6 on Wednesday night, finally seizing that elusive title — the most in all of sports. Paint the town in pin-stripes! Nearly a decade after their dynasty ended

on a blooper in the desert, the Yankees are baseball's best again.

Matsui, the Series MVP, powered a quick rout of old foe Pedro Martinez. And when Mariano Rivera got the final out, it was ecstasy in the Bronx for George Steinbrenner's go-for-broke bunch.

What a way for Alex Rodriguez and Co. to christen their \$1.5 billion ballpark: One season, one World Series crown — the team's first since winning three straight from 1998-2000.

"The Yankees won. The world is right again," team president Randy Levine said.

The season certainly ended a lot better than it

started — with a steroids scandal involving A-Rod, followed by hip surgery that kept him out until May.

"My teammates, coaches and the organization stood by me and now we stand here as world champions," said Rodriguez, who admitted using steroids from 2001-03 while with Texas. "We're going to enjoy it, and we're going to party!"

For Chase Utley and the Phillies, it was a frustrating end to another scintillating season. Philadelphia fell two wins short of becoming the first NL team to repeat as World Series champions since the 1975-76 Cincinnati Reds.

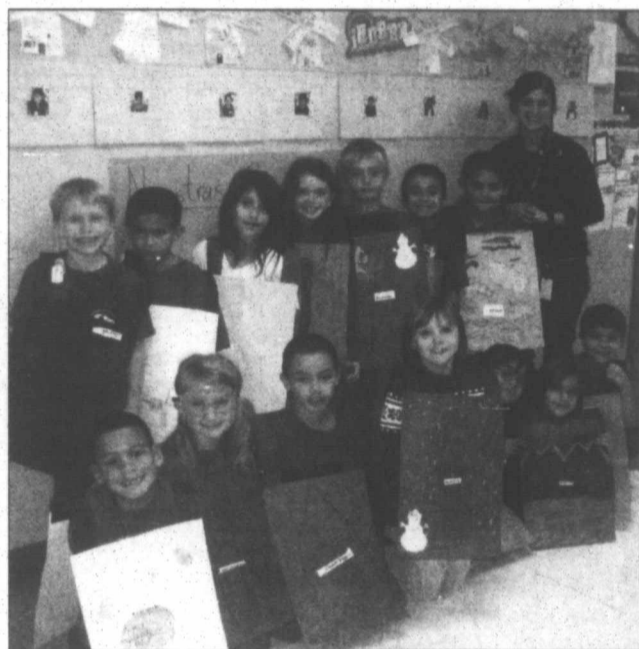

# Dear Abby...

I gave it to you because I respected and trusted you enough to go out on a limb for you. Please honor your promise to repay me without my having to ask you.

"Please don't show up in a new car or with photos on your new cell phone from your exotic vacation until I have been repaid. Please don't invent a reason to be 'mad' at me, as if that erases the loan. And please do not ask for another loan while you still owe me money!"

Abby, I know you'll say I should have drawn up official papers for the loan but, the truth is, few people expect to be shafted by the people they care about. All someone who owes money has to do is pick up the phone, initiate a payment plan and then stick to it. -- **FEELING USED IN NEW BRIGHTON, PA.**

**DEAR FEELING USED:** Your problem isn't a new one. William Shakespeare wrote, "Neither a borrower nor a lender be." I would be remiss if I didn't stress to

you -- and the rest of my readers -- the importance of talking to a lawyer or CPA before lending any significant amount of money to anyone. (By "significant" I mean any amount that you can't afford to lose.) If papers are drawn up and for some reason the borrower is unable to repay the loan, there could be a tax benefit for the lender.

**DEAR ABBY:** I have just learned that my husband of 28 years has end-stage leukemia. I worked in the medical field for years and have been around a lot of sick people, but this is "unreal" for me. I'm in a state of shock, and terrified about what lies ahead.

I have told all our children except our daughter, "Pearl." Pearl is pregnant and has miscarried three times. She knows her father hasn't been well, but she doesn't know the current facts. I am worried if I tell her about her dad's condition she'll have complications with her pregnancy. But if I don't and her dad worsens, Pearl might not get to see him in time.

problem with her pregnancy. -- **SUFFERING IN SILENCE**

**DEAR SUFFERING:** When Pearl first learned of her father's diagnosis, she put you on notice. Because your other children know your husband's condition has worsened, what is to prevent one of them from letting something slip?

Call your daughter and let her know her dad's condition has worsened, but that he's getting the best

treatment available. Do not announce that he is dying. She'll catch on to that fact as she talks to you, her other siblings and to her father as time progresses.

Much as you would like to, you can't protect Pearl from this reality. Better she experience the loss of her father along with you and her siblings than to learn later that she was left out.

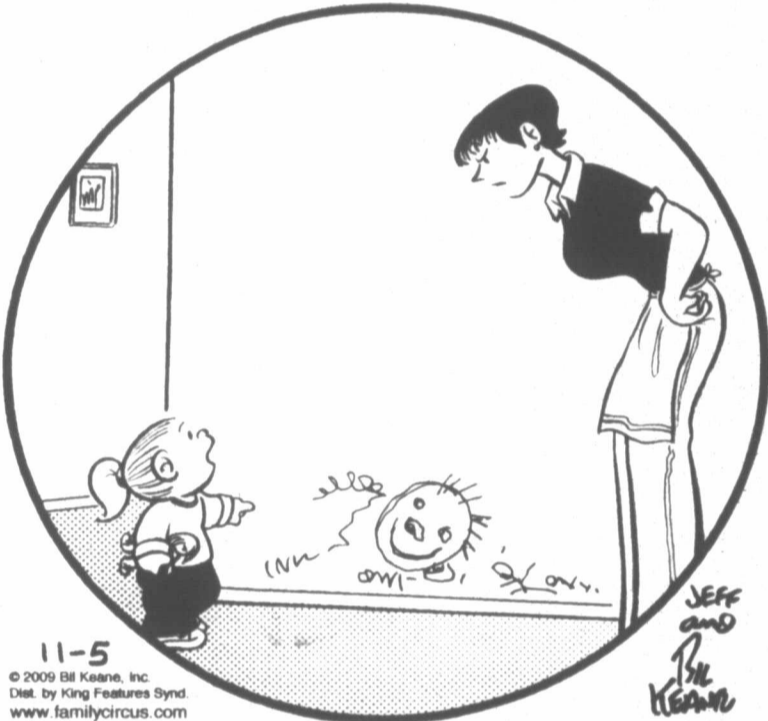
