experience my family had last year. My dad became very ill. After being seen by his physician, he was admitted to Pampa
Regional Medical Center ICU. He was cared for by both a private physician and an employed physician. He was also cared for
by many wonderful nurses by many wonderful nurses
and respiratory therapists. His illness progressed rapidly and he was flown to an Amarillo hospital
for more "specialized" for more "specialized
care. This is where our nightmare began. While in Amarillo, he was cared for by private physicians.
One of which was wonder ful, the other was not. The less than wonderful private physician only made
rounds to see his patients rounds to see his patients
after midnight which did not allow for any family $/$
physician interaction. He
also scheduled a procedure
on my dad three days in a row but never showed up or called to cancel. I took
each day off so my mother and I could be with my mad
and during the procedure. No procedure was performed
and no apology from the and no apology from
physician was given.. The Amarillo hospital staff did not care about my dad or our family.
They gave him a hospital They gave him a hospital
acquired infection that he acquired infection that he
did not have at PRMC.
We know thit We know this because
he was initially tested he was initially tested on
admission for this infecadmission for this infec-
tion at PRMC. They made no attempts to get him out of bed nor did they per-
form any sort of physical form any sort of physical
therapy to keep him from therapy to keep him from
wasting away during his long illless. They allowed
him to lay in bed him to lay in bed with
minimal interaction. They minimal interaction. They
saw a frail, debilitated man but what we knew was a
strong hard working 76
