tion, it is looking likely that the trial will be held in a federal court elsewhere. In defending the legal
treatmentof Abdulmutallab and Mohammed, Obama noted that the Bush administration - not known for a liberal reading of
the U.S. Constitution "prosecuted 190 folks in prosecuted (federal) Article III courts, got convictions and
those folks are in maxithose folks are in maxi-
mum security prisons right mum security prisons right
now. And there have been no escapes."

That, he said, "i s a virtue
of our system we should be of our systen
proud of."

argue that Obama and Bush were wrong. The strength of that argument gained political momentum in
the Massachusetss special election to fill the Senate
seat of the late Democratic Sen. Edward Kennedy. Winning candidate Scott
Brown, a Republican argued, among other things, that terror suspects
should not be accorded constitutional rights. That
struck a chord with the state's traditionally liberal-
leaning voters. leaning voters. require 60 votes in favor
of major legislation before
it can even be brought to
a vote. The The opposition is now captured for planning or captured for planning or
trying to carry out terrortrying to carry out terror-
ist acts should be treated as "enemy combatants" and shuttled automatically to the military for impris-
onment, interrogation and trial.
The $\qquad$ tion has shown some ambiguity of its own. While
moving to send Mohammed and four alleged henchmen to a civilian trial in New
York, it decided that a suw pect in the bombing of the pect in the bombing of the
USS Cole off Yemen in 2000 and four other terror suspects will be tried by
military commissions military commissions.

between the systems are the federal jydiciary's independence, rooted in the Constitution and life time appointments of judg-
es. Military tribunals have evidence.
Federal courts bar evi dence obtained by coer cion. And the new law regarding military commis
sions that Obama signed in sions that Obama signed in
October forbids evidenc derived from torture an other harsh interrogation techniques.
Even so Even so, the military
commissions still have rules that allow greater use of hearsay testimony and
in some instances, could in some instances, could
permit the introduction of peorced testimony. The commissions set up under Bush to try terror
ism detainees ism detainees have been
revised several times based revised several times based
on Supreme Court deci sions and acts of Congres that pushed their rules and
procedures closer to those procedures closer
of federal courts.

Even as Republicans publicly welcome President Barack Obama's call for a
bipartisan confab on health care, some privately worry that he might be laying a trap to por
as flimsy.
If so, a shaky showing
by GOP leaders could pos-
sibly embolden congressibly embolden congres-
sional Democrats to make sional Democrats to ma a final, aggressive push
