Hutchison's 30 percent. In his campaign, Perry fanned anti-Washington sentiment among Republican voters portraying die state's senior senator as part of a despised ashington political culture.
In a conference call with reporters, Cornyn called those
attacks "unfair." According to The Dallas Morning News, he Republican junior senator from Texas said Perry "was able to posture this as a campaign (of), 'Are you for Texas or are you for Washington?' Sen. Hutchison ended up when clearly she has been representing the best interests Texas in the United States Senate for a long time.
