from the Hawaiian Islands. One showed the front of the coin and the other revealed the back. I had no idea what the writing was on the
coins so I contacted Chris Martin, at Lahaina Baptist Church, Lahaina, Maui and asked if
he could hlip me out. He did and my blessing
grew even more.
Let me share with you what the coins say On the front it says Kanaka Kala which means
'Freedom of the Hawaian Freecom of the Hawaiian Islands'. On the
back it says - Ua Mau Ke Ea O Ka Aina I Ka Pono which means 'The life of the land is perpetuated in righteousness'. When I received
the news as to the meaning of these words I was blown away. Now each time I see it, the meaning grows even more.
The truth on those coins is found all through Scripture and lived out in the history of Israel. Scripture tells us in Jeremiah $29: 10-14$ that
'when the people of God would live their lives in a righteous manner, they would find restora-
tion. But 1 believe what was on these coins is definitely seen in Proverbs $14: 34$ which says, "Righteousness exaldy a nation, but sin is a
reproach to any peope." Israel he said, You have become guilty by
the blood your idols which you have made. Thus you have brought your day near and have come
to your years; therefore I have made you to your years, therefore I have made you a
