The government would be required to make a "bona
fide" offer to buy the property from landowners and pay for relocation expenses. It also puts into state law aprohibition on property seizure for private use, which already was prohibited by a constitutional amendment

nent domain law for years, after a U.S. Supreme Court decision sparked concern about governments abusing their constitutional power to seize private land. Gov. Rick Perry, a Republican, has designated the

Jury finds ex-slugger Bonds guilty of obstruction of justice
SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - Just lik
the whole Steroid Era: We'll neyer really the whole Steroid Era: We'll never really
know. Even the one charge that left Barry
Bonds a convicted felon didn't specify Boven a convicted felon didn't specify
steroids. steroids.
Instead, a federal court jury found th home run king guilty of obstruction of
justice Tuesday for giving an evasive justice Tuesday for giving an evasive
answer under oath more than seven years ago. Rather than say "yes" or "no" to
whether he received drugs that required a whether he received drugs that required a
syringe, Bonds gave a rambling response syringe, Bonds gave a rambling respons
to a grand jury, stating. "I became to a grand jury, stating: "I became
