## Nighttime speed limit to go?

AUSTIN (AP) - Texas drivers would no longer have
to slow down for nighttime road trips and some highway speed limits would be increased to 75 mph under legisla-
tion approved Friday in tion approved Friday in the House.
The bill, which was approved would eliminate the current requirement that drivers slow down to 65 mph when the sun goes down on most Texas highways.
It would also
Commission to set highway speeds at 75 mph , up from the current 70 mph limit on most non-urban state highways. Counties would be eligible for the higher limit
only if a safety study deemed it to be safe and reasonable only if a safety study deemed it to be safe and reasonable
for each portion of highway. Houston Republican Rep. Gary Elkins, the bill's spon-

tors receive more education and training, and establish a tors receive more education and training, and establish a
procedure for reviewing old cases. procedure for reviewing old cases.
Cameron Todd Willingham was executed in 2004 for setting the blaze at his home in Corsicana, south of Dallas.
He didn't testify at his trial but always insisted - even in an obscenity-filled tirade the moment before his death - that he was innocent. He suggested the fire could
have been started accidentally by his 2 -year-old daughter, have been started accidentally by his 2 -year-old daughter,
Amber, who died along with her 1 -year-old twin sisters, Karmon and Kameron.
The Texas Forensic Science Commission disclosed Thursday it wouldn't decide whether arson investigators
were negligent or guilty of professional misconduct in were negligent or guilty of professional misconduct in
Willingham's case until the Texas attomey general's office decides whether the panel has that authority.
The panel on Friday completed an often tedious review
of its nearly 50 -page draft report based on his case and of its nearly 50 -page draft report based on his case and
