The trustees for the funds said in their annual report that the worsening financial picture emphasized the need for Congress to make
changes to avoid disruptive conse quences in the future for millions of people who depend on health and pension benefits.
Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner, who chairs the trustee's
panel, said the new report panel, said the new report under-
scored "the need to act soone rather than later to make reforms to our entitlement programs. ... We
should not wait for the trust funds should not wait for the trust funds
to be exhausted to make the reforms necessary to protect our cur rent and future retirees. The trustees said that they moved the target date for the Medicare
hospital trust fund to be exhaust hospital trust fund to be exhaust-
ed from 2029 to 2024 because o a weaker economy, which means fewer people working and paying Medicare premiums into the fund,

and expand oil and gas drilling In a 243-179 vote Thursday, the House passed a measure that would open up areas off the West and East
coasts, Alaska and the eastern Gulf of Mexico to drill coasts, Alaska and the eastern Gulf of Mexico to drill-
ing. The Obama administration pulled back on leasing in some of those spots after the Gulf oil spill last year in some of those spots after the Guif oil spin last year never considered drilling in the Pacific.
The bill directs the Interior Department
The bill directs the Interior Department to select lease areas based on how much oil and gas they contain.
The measure joins two others passed earlier by the House to speed up drilling and leasing.

n making and selling malt liquor containing stimulants, on making and seling malt liquding caffeine and ginseng.
Approved Thursday, the measure won't apply to malt liquor where stimulates occur naturally.
Supporters say beverages that mix alcohol and cer
ain stimulants have led to heart attacks and deally tain stim
crashes.
Last year, the Food and Drug Administration warned four companies that make caffeine and alcohol drinks that
their products were unsafe. Their products were unsafe.
The sale of one, Four Loko, has been banned by at least
3 states through their alcohol control boards, according to the National Conference of State Legislatures. Opponents of the Texas measure warned that it creates a

Candidate Ron Paul: Less lone these days

| The man who likely has done more than anyone to put the libertarian philosophy of freedom and small government on the political agenda probably will make another run for the presidency: U.S. Rep. Ron Paul. <br> Paul is always upbeat, but lately he's had more reason to be, as he sees libertarian ideas bubbling up from the grass roots. <br> "People outside of Washington are waking up," he told me, "and they're getting the attention of a few in Washington. <br> Paul has been in Congress more than 20 years, and much of that time he's played a lonely role, often being the only representative to cast "no" vote on bills to expand government. <br> "Twenty years ago, there weren't very many people around that would endorse these views. So ... I'm very pleased with what's happening. There are more now, but the problems are so much greater." <br> Because bigger government creates built-in resistance to cuts. <br> "Everybody has their bailiwick they want to protect: 'We know the spending is bad. But don't touch my stuff." <br> The biggest growth is in entitlements. Recently, after constituents yelled at them, Republicans backed off on their reasonable plan to try to make Medicare sustainable. <br> "This is one of the places where good conservatives and good libertarians have come up short. ... We get a bad rap that we lack compassion. A liberal who wants to take your money and give it to somebody else ... grab(s) the moral high ground." | At the recent Conservative Political Action Conference, Paul floated a novel idea: "Would you consider opting out of the whole system under one condition? You pay 10 percent of your income, but you take care of ask the government for anything." <br> The CPAC crowed applauded. But liberals like MSNBC's Chris Matthews mocked him, sneering that anyone who accepted Paul's offer would have no access to federal highways, air safety, food inspection, cancer research or defense. <br> Paul laughs at Matthews' shallow criticism. Ever the constitutionalist, he'd like to privatize the federal highways someday, but he notes that even now they are largely financed by the gasoline tax -- essentially a user fee. As for air and food safety, he's sure the airlines and food companies have no desire to kill their customers and that careless companies would be disciplined by competition and the tort system. He claims that government stands in the way of a lot of cancer research. <br> In other words, it's foolish to assume that just because the government doesn't do something, that it wouldn't be done at all. <br> "(Matthews is) using fear," Paul said. ## Paul announces intent to seek presidential nomination

AUSTIN (AP) - Texas Rep. Ron Paul announced
Friday that he will run for the GOP nomination for Friday that he will run for the GOP nomination for
president in 2012, the third attempt for the man known on Capitol Hill as "Dr. No" for his enthusiasm for bashing runaway spending and government overreach.
"Time has come around to the point where the people
are agreeing with much of what l've been saying for 30 are agreeing with much of what I've been saying for 30
years. So, I think the time is right," said the 75 -yearold Paul, who first ran for president as a Libertarian in
ol 1988.

Paul made his announcement in an interview on ABC's Good Morning America" from New Hampshire, where on Friday.
Three years ago, the former flight surgeon and outspoken critic of the Federal Reserve became an Internet sensation - and a prodigious fundraiser- when he
made a spirited but doomed bid for the 2008 Republican presidential nomination.
First elected to Congress in 1976, he is known for holding unconventional views while keeping a smile on his face, espousing a sort of modern Republican populism. and is personally against abortion, but he doesn't think the federal government should regulate it. That's a function of state government, he says.
He has also said he wants
He has also said he wants to abolish the Internal Revenue Service, favors returning the United States to out of Iraq and Afghanistan. Democrats have tried repeatedly to beat him in a congressional district that stretches from the outskirts of
Corpus Christi to Galveston. But the independent swath Corpus Christi to Galveston. But the independent swath of coastal exas seems a good fit for the maverick doc-
tor. He has 18 grandchildren, according to his website,

Paul, a native of Pittsburgh, is both a spiritual father and actual father in the tea party movement. His son, tea party darling Rand Paul, won a Senate seat in Kentucky last year and has become an ardent proponent of spending cuts and smaller government.
