Video-game industry wins again in court

Texans must declare independence from Zebra Mussels

thing from fishing to thing from fishing to our
water supply could be devastating." to the former Soviet Union, zebra mus-

the United States via the exchange of ballast water from ocean-going vessels
passing through the St. Lawrence Seaway to ports
on the Great Lakes. Since then, the rapidly propa-
