With the first week of school behind us, the Pampa Independent
School District's numbers are
showing that enrollment within the city's schools continues to grow,
according to PISD Superintendent Barry Haenisch. Haenisch said on Thursday
morning that the district is schooling approximately 3.600 students,
up 200 from last year. "The junior high is about the
same size, the high school's up same size, the high school s up
about a hundred and the elemen-
tary schools are up by various tary schools are up by variou
amounts." Haenisch said. The increase offers an unex-
pected challenge for the district.
