mitted for federal court approval a consent decree that would require the Environmental Protection Agency to enforce clean air laws in Texas by the end of the year. If the Sierra Club's filing is approved by a U.S. district
judge, the EPA will have to ensure Texas is complying judge, the EPA will have to ensure Texas is complying
with laws from 1997 regarding ozone and particulate matter - or dust - pollution.
The proposed decree was filed Tuesday with U.S.

| Because Texas is locked in a 25 - to 30 -year dry period, "even with occasional rain events, we can expect a long-term situation with an increase in the number and severity of wildfires, perhaps unlike anything we've seen in Texas," the agency said. <br> According to the budget request, $\$ 20.4 \mathrm{mil}$ lion annually would be required to fund the program adequately. However, the agency said it would accept an "incremental approach" that would raise the amount of money slowly over several years. <br> The wildfire protection plan was also reviewed last year by the Texas Sunset Advisory Commission, which periodically assesses state agencies. <br> The commission took no position on whether the funding was adequate, but it noted that the Legislature had invested "significant" money to finance wildfire protection even though the Forest Service's plan was limited to a brochure and "miscellaneous documents." <br> DeWitt said the Forest Service was happy to get an added $\$ 8.5$ million for wildfire protection in 2009, raising annual funding to $\$ 15.5$ million. The agency's budget was slashed by $\$ 35$ million earlier this year, and it did not ask for more because of the intense battle for every dollar in the state budget, he said. |
