FSA taking applications for loans

With Gray County being declared eligible for Farm Service Agency disaster emergency loans last
Tuesday, applications are now being accepted at the FSA office in Perryton.
Gray County is one of 131 counties in Texas recently named by United States Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack as eligible for the loans, which cover damages, loss or profrom the drought, heavy winds, heat and wildfires from Jan. 1, 2011 and onward.
Farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100 percent of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, whichever is sess. Frivate commercial lenders, the interest rate is 3.75 percent. According to a news release from program technician Cel Cloud of the Gray County FSA, as a general rule, farmers who have lost at least 30 percent of their production because
of the above conditions qualify for of loans. the loans.
Insurance program and/or any hazard insurance are taken into consideration when determining a producer's eligibility and total loss.
The FSA will accept applications for the emergency loans until Sept. 4, though FSA Farm Loan Manager

not willing to serve America? That's just phony nonsense." Sunday began with GOP conenders facing off for the second time in less than 12 hours,
following their debate Saturday night in nearby Manchester. Though aggressive in assailing Romney, Gingrich hedged when he was confronted with one of his own campaign leaflets declar-
ing Romney to be unelectable against President Barack Obama. "t think he'll have a very hard time getting elected," was as far as Gingrich would go.
Indicating he'd taken offense on another matter, Huntsman, who was Obama's ambassador to China before quitting to run for he White House, returned to a comment Romney had made the
night before. Romney said then that the rest of the GOP hopefuls had been trying to oppose the administration's policies while Huntsman was advancing them. people here in New Hampshire and throughout the United States, he criticized me while he was out raising money for serving my country in China, yes, under a

The former speaker briefly led in the Iowa and national polls sefore the caucuses, before his surge was blunted by a series of
ads aired by a so-called super PAC that is operated by forme Romney aides and allies. Gingrich has complained bit terly that the attacks were false,
but he was asked Sunday about a similar organization set up by his own supporters. It is intent on criticizing Romney for having
run an investment firm that cost run an investment firm that cos
workers their jobs when it took over their companies.
Asked if he was being consistent, Gingrich said, "I'm consis tent because I think you ought to
have fact-based campaigns." He have fact-based campaigns." He
demanded Romney say whether the attacks against him were true Romney replied: "I haven'
seen them, and as you know seen them, and as you know under the law, I can't direct the
ads. If there's anything in the ads ads. If there's anything in the ad

most number of 100 -degree days ( 50 including the 120 -mph wind gust that days), the most consecutive days of
90 -degree temperatures ( 50 days), and the hottest average monthly temperature on record (July at $85.2^{\circ}$ F). Only
February and December have the distinction as being the only months this year 2011 will go down as the 7th warmest year on record at Amarillo.
2011 will also be remembered as a quiet year for severe weather. The severe
weather season started slowly but did increase slightly in June when all 4 tornadoes that were reported in the Panhandles this year occurred on June 11. However,
since 1950, this was the 6 th latest start to a year without a tornado in the Panhandles. typically see about 21 tornadoes per year, and this year, all 4 tornadoes that were reported were weak. Most of the thunderstorms this year were responsible
for producing straight line wind damage,
