NEW ORLEANS (AP) - With sick and dead dolphins
turning up along Louisiana's coast, federal regulators are curbing an oil and natural gas exploration company from using seismic equipment that sends out underwater The Bureau of Ocean Energy Manage Global Geophysical Services Inc. to not conduct deep penetration seismic surveys off the Louisiana coast until May when the bottlenose dolphin calving season ends. The agency says the surveys are done with air-guns that

Q: My husband and I are self-employed. Quite a few years ago, we incorporated our

Security's "Office of Quality Assurance." The people there
want to redo his claim for ben efits. And they are asking him to bring in his military discharge papers (he was in the Army 40
years ago), his W-2 years ago), his W-2 records for
the past 10 years and other docthe past 10 years and other doc-
uments. What's going on? He's very worried about this.
A: Tell your client to relax.
This really is a "no big deal" kind This really is a "no big deal" kind
of thing - from his perspective, of thing -- from his perspective,
anyway. But it is a big deal to the Social Security Administration. The SSA's Office of Quality Assurance takes a small sampling of Social Security cases and rede-
velops them. It's not really to see velops them. It's not really to see
whether he's being paid correctly, although they will check into that.
But your client shouldn't But your client shouldn't worry about this, because historically,
Social Security benefit tions have a very high degree of accuracy. Statistics show that people, in part because of these kinds of reviews, are getting the correct benefit amo
of the time.

On April 3, 1942, during World War II, Japanese forces began their final assault on Bataan against
American and Filipino troops who surrendered six American and Filipino troops who surrendered six
days later; the capitulation was followed by the notorious Bataan Death March

minor, Op. 63, had its world premiere in Helsinki, Finland, with Sibelius conducting.
In 1936, Bruno Hauptmann was electrocuted in Trenton, N.J. for the kidnap-murder of Charles In 1946, Lt. Gen. Masaharu Homma, the Japanese
