out what Pampa businesses want and

"We look at these surveys to give

Pipeline spurs veto threat
WASHINGTON (AP) - The White House is threatening to veto transportation legislation that would extend money for highway construction projects through the
end of September because it would mandate construction of a Canada-to-Texas oil pipeline that President Barack Obama earlier blocked.
Congress has been financing road projects through stopgap measures. This one would extend spending
from July 1 to Sept. 30. But Republicans, who control from July 1 to Sept. 30 . But Republicans, who control
the House, want to add the requirement to build the Keystone XL pipeline project.
The White House, in a statement Tuesday, said such a requirement would bypass long-standing practices on how to approve cross-border pipelines. The statemen
noted that a pipeline route has yet to be identified.

Texas wheat better than anyone dared hope in some areas


#### Abstract

Robert Burns LleGE STATION Texas wheat looks better than anyone expected a few months ago, said a Texas "IIt's been a very intercesting year", said "lt's been a very interesting year," said David Drake, San Angelo. "It started out dry everywhere. Farmers had to plant wheat with faith that it would actually come up." Last winter, climatologists were forecasting the winter and early spring would be drier and warmer than average because of a strong La Niña, Drake noted. The year did turn out to be warmer Lubbock, for example, recorded the sec But despite the forecasts, many areas received substantial rains. In some cases, received substantial rains. In some cases, such as North Central Texas, the spring was much wetter than average. The mois- ture, in combination with the aboveture, in combination with the above- average temperatures, resulted in excellent growing conditions for wheat, Drake said. Not everyone benefited, he noted. Some farmers, expecting unfavorable weather, farmers, expecting unfavorable weather, cut back on fertilization and other inputs, and may have even seeded at lower rates. It put us in a situation where farmers ho did not cut back on inputs are going to be able to capitalize on those potential yields," Drake said. "Those farmers who applied enough fertilizer, used a decent seeding rate and didn't cutt corners they're going to do alright. They're going to get a bumper crop in some areas." In other areas, cutting back on inputs may have been the right plan. Drake noted large parts of the Panhandle and Far West Texas are still moisture-deficit. Overall, Drake said his best guess at this time was that total yield for the state this time was that total yield for the state was likely to be average, though it was far from being an average year weatherwise. He noted, however, that even on an average year, it's hard to predict statewide 


Drought sparks water supply dispute between Texas, Mexico

| Melted snow providing water for irrigation had barely begun burbling down a bone-dry Rio Grande toward a thin 4 -mile-wide strip of farmland straddling the U.S.Mexico border when a war of words erupted. <br> Mexico wanted a traditional early release from reservoirs so spring planting wouldn't be delayed. Texas farmers, fearing a historic drought could tighten its grip again this summer, wanted to delay the release for a couple of months to ensure enough water was left to help crops survive the hottest, driest part of the year. <br> Dividing the Rio Grande's waters is a complicated annual undertaking governed by arcane agreements and imperfect calculations. When there's plenty of water it flows smoothly, but with farmers on both sides of the border confronting severe drought - officials expect to have about one-third of the water of a normal year - Texas officials quickly lashed out an international commission's decision to release the water, accusing it of putting Mexico's water needs ahead of droughtstricken Texas farmers in the El Paso Valley. <br> Mexico is guaranteed a fraction of the water from Rocky Mountain snows that drain into two New Mexico reservoirs. Once released, the water flows down the Rio Grande toward Texas, where it's diverted to Texas and Mexican farmers by dams. Local irrigation districts move the water through canals to farmers' fields. <br> With water expected to be scarce this year, two irrigation districts in New Mexico and Texas - which receive most of the water - decided in February to take their first deliveries in May rather than in March as they typically do. The idea was to delay the irrigation season in an effort to stretch what little water would be available to the end of the growing season. <br> But this posed a problem <br> for Mexican farmers who |
