NRCS announces partnership to protect wildllife habitats

- Lesser prairie chicken among species that benefit

The Natural Resources Conservation Service has announced a partnership with farmers and ranchers to protect wildife habitats, including the lesser prairie
chicken, an at-risk species in Texas. With the Lesser chicken, an at-risk species in Texas. With the Lesser
Prairie Chicken Initiative and the Working Lands Prairie Chicken Intitiative and the working Lands
for Wiidlife program, landowners can receive up to ${ }_{75}^{\text {for Wiidilife program, landowners can receive up to }}$
conservation practices to benefit the bird. The conservation methods, which also promote healthy grazing lands, include prescribed grazing, upland wildlife burning and range planting.
"We are excited about this partnership opportunity to work with Texas landowners and producers to advance the habitat and conservation of the lesser prairie chicken, says Don wildiferm, state coordinator
for the U. S. Fish \& Wildlife Service's Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program in Texas.
People interested in the Working Lands for Wildlife program, which creates a $\$ 33$ million partnership with farmers and ranchers, can apply at their local NRCS
office by today. If funds remain, a second sign office by today. If fund remain, a second sign-up
period will be held through Weenessay, May 30 .

The population of the lesser prairie chicken, ground-nesting bird native to rangelands in Texas New Mexico, Oklahoma, Colorado and Kansas, has declined over the last few decades due to habitat frag mentation, degradation of habitat and loss of native prairie. Over 90 percent of the bird's habitat occur on private land.
The aim of the program is to focus available conservation dollars and wildilife expertise on the recov
ery of this at-risk species," says Salvador Salinas state ery of this at-risk species, says Salvador Salinas, state
conservationist for the NRCS in Texas. "Our mission is to provide financial and technical assistance to help private landowners and other producers voluntarily restore or enhance their land to create a more sustain able habitat for the lesser prairie chicken, while ensur ing the viability of farming and ranching in Texas."

## Weather changing Big Bend landscape

PANTHER JUNCTION (AP) -
Surrounded by large patche Surrounded by large patches of straw-
yellow sotol and withered prickly yellow sotol and withered prickly
pear, federal botanist Joe Sirotnak summarized the causes of a massive plant die-off that has changed the Big
Bend desert landscape, at least tempo Bend desert landscape, at least tempo
ranily.
"This is from the freeze, and that's from the drought. It's a double-whammy", he said, with a sweep of the hand.
The first blow came when only 253 The first blow came when only 2.53 inches of rain fell during 2011 at the
headquarters of Big Bend National headquarters of Big Bend National
Park, less than a fifth of normal precipitation. And the second was a five day freezz in February 2011, when the mercury dropped almost to zero.
"The freeze and drought were events, unprecedented in living memory," Sirotnak said.
The drought extended throughout
the Big Bend and into northem Mex the Big Bend and into norther Mexico, and desert plants once thought to
be nearly indestructible, such as creosote bush and lechuguilla - a spiky miniature agave known affectionately
as "shin dagger" as "shin dagger" - succumbed in
massive numbers. massive numbers.
The extraordinary plant mortality,
first reported in the Big Bend Sentinel, extended to upland trees such as
> oak, madrone, piñon and juniper. And
while this spring has been somewhat
wetter while this spring has been somewhat
wetter, bringing, flowers and some
regeneration, the scars might last for regener
years.

worked at the national park since the late 1990s. "There's a good indication that 20 years from now, you could still see the effects of the drought of 2011 in the plant community." botanist at Sul Ross State University in Alpine, is seeing the fatal effects o the drought on these supremely hard "I's species
> Thm just seeing them dying. I can maybe a dozen," he said.
> "And here's the tricky part: These are the species that normally would have come up and produced seed by
now that are not answering the call of spring. There is no water." Terry's main worry is soil loss caused by the demise of vegetation such as creosote bush.
"Everything that would normally "Everything that would normally
hold the soil in is now dead, and it will take years for the plants to come back.

There will be this vulnerable period
where horrible erosion can occur," he Retired Sul Ross Professor Michael Powell, 74 , who has studied the plants of the Big Bend for more than 50 years, said the biggest unknown is what the future holds will the flora change? No one really knows," he said. "t think what we're seeing is climate change, and it is expressed in these kinds of ways. It's
been getting drier in West Texas for long time."
So far in 2012, 2 inches of rain has fallen at Panther Junction, already below average this year buts still wetter
than in 2011 . The ocotillo and surviv ing prickly pear are flowering.
And if the rains return to normal and keep coming, the effects of the drought of 2011 on the Chihuahuan Desert might fade, Powell said. for years and years, then ultimately the desert plants will come back," he said. "But if we keep having these severe droughts without fairly long periods

Lawmakers to talk school discipline

AUSTIN (AP) - This week lawmakers will examine one of the most expensive and controversial question facing school districts. What to do with undiscipline kids.
State law requires districts to set up Disciplinary Alternative Education Programs for students from ele mentary to high school who are removed from their classes for "mandatory or discretionary disciplinary reasons. These programs can be inside the schools at a different locac to operate them One thing all the programs share is the advocacy group Texas Appleseed reported that the Dallas Independent School District spent $\$ 1.3$ milli on disciplining kids, a total that does not include the Last year the Republican-controlled Legisl spending by more than $\$ 500$ per-student last year, a move that forced schools to cut budgets this year, and there are more cuts coming in the fall. Therefore school Dallas, special schools for kids with disciplinary prob lems cost the district $\$ 9$ million. Texas Appleseed found that the Disciplinary Alternative Education Program cost the district $\$ 57,000$ per student a year, more than a veteran teacher's salary
That's about seven times more than what a Texas scho district spends per student on average.
And since the state school finance system only pays when a student shows up for class, referring 22,827 students for out-of-school suspension and into alternative programs last schools yar cost to
