PLANO (AP)-J. C. Penney Co. said Thursday that it
hired a new chief financial officer as it tries to reshape its business. Ken Hannah will take over as CFO on Monday Dastugue, left in April just days after the company announced it planned to cut hundreds of jobs and transform every aspect of its business. Hannah, 43 , was most recently president of solar
energy at MEMC Electronic Materials Inc. He has also worked at a number of other companies, including
General Electric Co., The Boeing Co and Home Depot Inc. J.C. Penney is trying to redesign everything - from
its management team to store promotion strategy - to its management team to store promotion strategy - To
boost sagging sales. The company's new CEO, Ron
Johnson, is a former Apple Inc. executive, who investors hope will bring some Apple ingenuity to the struggling chain.
The company has suffered in recent years because its
core middle-income customers have been core middle-income customers have been among those
hardest hit by the nation's weak economy. It's also lagged behind rivals like Macy's Inc. in making its stores fun places to shop.
J.C. Penniey posted a loss of $\$ 152$ million on revenue
of $\$ 17.26$ billion for its most recent fiscal year, compared of $\$ 17.26$ bilinon for its most recent fiscal year, compared
with a profit of $\$ 389$ million on revenue of $\$ 17.76$ billion the year before.
J.C. Penney, based in Plano, Texas, operates 1,100 stores nationwide.
Its shares fell 20 cents to close at $\$ 35.07$.

The restrictions started in August amid the severe Texas drought. It was the first time Fort Worth implemented such restrictions because of declining water supply levels.
Officials are still urging residents and businesses to be efficient with outdoor watering. Drought restrictions
will return when lake levels reach 75 percent - and Fort Worth officials say they expect that to happen.

Tax losses could be as high as $\$ 7.8$ million from the scam.
The Justice Department says Joseph Rivas, of DeSoto, consented to the ban Thursday from U.S. District Judge
Sidney Fitzwater without admitting to the allegations against him
A federal complaint alleged Rivas prepared tax returns using phony mortgage interest deductions, faked employ-
ee business expenses and illegally deducted Social ee business expenses and illegally
Security taxes as state and local taxes.
The injunction also orders Rivas to turn over the names of all the people who used him as a tax preparer since

In Texas, how conservative is enough?

AUSTIN (AP) - Like man Dewhurst has waited in line fo higher office for nearly a decade. Now that Kay Bailey Hutchiso is wrapping up a 19 -year career
in the U.S. Senate, Dewhurst may finally get his chance. But he first must survive the war being waged within the Texas GOP over who the most conservative candidate replace her.
Dewhurst has patiently held the
state's No. 2 job since sas long been considered the odds-
has on favorite for the Senate when the time came. His record might seem
unassailable for a Republican*He's unassailable for a Repubican-He established leader in a Legislature that has restricted abortion, cut spending, curbed gay rights and
advanced other conservative advanced other conservative pri-
orities
Yet the GOP's heir apparent is finding his promotion to
Washington to be tougher than Washington to be tougher than
expected. Opponents deride him as not conservative enough. A
leading challenger also noted that Dewhurst, as the presiding officer has allowed several minority party Democrats to chair state Senate
committees over the years The tone of the race is just one sign of the continuing rightward drift of politics in one of the most conservative states. With. nearly
50 percent of 50 percent of Texas voters calling
themselves "very conservative" a recent poll, the competition in the GOP is now all about who's the purest and most doctrinaire. And longtime officeholders who rose in an earlier time can find themselves held up against the new breed
hard-liners who brook no compromise with the opposition.
Notably, all the GOP candidate Notably, all the GOP candidates
in the field this year are well in the field this year are well to the right of Hutchison, who was
considered conservative when she was elected in 1993 but wourd now qualify as moderate.
"This is a conservative state, and it's still building off that tea party
movement" that surged in recen
years, said Republican strategist
Bill Miller. "It's got real roots Bill Miller. "It's got real roots
here, and they are dug in and dere, and they are dug in and
demanding that candidates be the most conservative." Already, the hammering may be
having an effect on Dewhurst. His top challenger, appeals attorney and former state solicitor general
Ted Cruz, 41 , has been cutting inte Dewhurst's lead in recent surveys Dewhurt' soaad in recent surveys in the May 29 primary to force his way into a runoff. "Away from the watchful eye "Away from the watchful eye of
conservatives, Dewhurst empowconservatives, Dewhurst empow-
ered and worked with liberal ered and worked with liberal
Democrats to increase spending and kill conservative legislation," said John Drogin, a spokesman for
Cruz, who is a tea party favorite Cruz, who is a tea party favorite.
"Pure, petty, negative politics," Dewhurst said of the Republican attacks. However, while trying to keep his campaign focused
on President Barack Obama on President Barack Obama,
Dewhurst recently lashed out at Dewhurst recently lashed out at
his Republican detractors with an ad blitz. "We don't have time for rookies and on-the-job training," Dewhurst said in remarks dismissive of his Also running are businessman and former Dallas mayor Tom Leppert and former football player
and television analyst Craig James and television analyst Craig James,
both of whom lag far behind Neither Cruz nor James has held elected office. In the Democratic primary, former state lawmaker Paul Sadler faces newcomer Sean Hubbard, a party activist and smal
businessman. businessman.
Dewhurst, with an energy industry pedigree and an appreciation of cowboy culture - he's a world-class cut-
ting horse competitor and member ting horse competitor and member
of the Texas Rodeo Cowboy Hall of Fame.
He says his life experiences He says his life experiences -
from growing up in a single-parent household in Houston to becoming the eader of the 31-member state
Senate - have prepared him for national office.

in Houston, then played basketbal

But he struck it rich wher another of his companies, Falco selling electricity to utilities an industrial users, sold three powe plants for $\$ 226$ million. For the last nine years, whil ing Texas' longest serving gove nor, Dewhurst held the powerfu independent office of lieutenan governor, which appoints commit rees and guilde
sands of bills.

Texas regents reject tuition increase proposal for Austin AUṠTIN (AP) - Rejecting a request to raise to $\$ 17,377$ by fall 2013.

multibillion-dollar endowment fund.

The vote comes at a time when the and universities are ander political pressure - led by Republican Gov. Rick Perry - to reduce costs and simultaneously improve graduation rates. Each of the system's nine campuses asked for some
sort of rate increase. Most were approved, although a sort of rate increase. Most were approved, although a
few were at rates lower than requested. The major exception was the University of Texas
at Austin, one of the largest public schools in the at Austin, one of the largest public schools in the
country and the most prominent target of critics in country and the most prominent target of critics in
the public debate over whether state universities are efficiently educating students.
The university asked to raise tuition from about
2.6 percent to 3.6 percent starting in the fall of 2012 . 2.6 percent to 3.6 percent starting in the fall of 2012 .
Much of the nearly $\$ 26$ million it hoped to raise was to be used for improving academic advising and add-
ing courses to help more students graduate in four ing courses to help more students graduate in four
years.
Regents instead froze tuition for undergraduate resident students and agreed to dip into money gen$\$ 13$ million. The regment University Fund for about $\$ 13$ million. The regents approved raising tuition for ate students ( 3.6 percent).
System officials said the endowment money, comSystem officials said the endowment money, com-
bined with the higher rates for non-resident and gradbined with the higher rates for non-resident and grad-
uate students, should get Texas close to the nearly $\$ 26$ million target.
But University of Texas President Bill Powers said
he was disappointed by the freeze. Powers said the higher rates were going to pay for student benefits and programs for years to come and freezing them at he current levels will make it harder to plan for
the future.
State universities have had to use tuition rates to raise money as the Legislature has cut state higher education funding in recent years. Lawmakers gave he universities the power to set their rates in 2003 ,

houses in Edinburg while others remained locked in hanses in Edinburg while others remained locked in The call came from an immigrant inside one of he houses who said he was being held against his will with about 50 others. Immigrant witnesses told
authorities that Salas greeted them at the stash house with "Welcome to hell," according to the complaint. Salas told investigators Ortiz paid him $\$ 500$ pef week o smuggle immigrants. Immigrants from El Salvador and Honduras told Homeland Security Investigations that both Ortiz and Salas drove them to the houses from the border and sold them snacks. Officers found the windows and doors locked from the outside with chains and padlocks and no light in the
house. Seven people inside the house were hospitalized for treatment of dehydration and malnourishment, The for treatment of dehydration an

How to properly level a patio or walkway

Dear Pat: I am going to build a brick patio adjacent to a small
fishpond in my backyard I to use a gravel and sand base for the bricks. What is the easiest
way to get them properly way to get them
eled? - Maria P.
Dear Maria: A brick patio and surround for the fishpond can be a andscaping. You might want to landscaping. You might want to of ordinary bricks because the pavers are usually more decorative
and they and they are made to fit together
perfectly
Whether you use bricks or patio pavers, laying the base and the
leveling leveling process are identical.
"Leveling" is the proper term to use, but you do not want the patio
to be level. A slight slope away to be level. A slight slope away
from the pond will keep rainwater from carrying patio dirt into the pond. One-eighth-inch slope per
foot length should be more than foot length should be more than
adequate. A 2-inch layer of crushed gravel
covered by another 2-inch layer of covered by another 2 -inch layer of
sand should be a good base for the patio. Always use crushed gravel,
not pea gravel, which will roll not pea gravel, which will roll
around. The angular edges of crush
gravel lock the gravel lock the pieces together for a much more stable base.
First, determine the height for
the top surface of the finished the top surface of he finished
patio. Drive wooden grade stakes patio. Drive wooden grade stakes
in the ground around the perimeter
of the patio so of the patio so the tops are at the finished height.Locate them 7 feet apart to facilitate creating a smooth
surface for the gravel and sand The best way to get the proper angle for the necessary slope is to use a builder's level or a laser level. You can rent either at most
tool rental shops or just buy a laser tool rental shops or just buy a laser
level. You will be able to use it level. You will be able to use it

about 4 inches plus the thickness
