"After learning that Habitat not only builds homes but also renovates homes, there was once again a glimmer of hope, and we as a board determined that we should move in that direction," Nachtigall said.
"I want to make sure that nobody that's living in Pampa, Texas, that needs a home that Habitat can work
with is going to be turned away," he added. "We're going to be able to supply them with a home. It may not be a brand new, scratch, built-from-the-ground-up house, but it will be a house that will put a roof over their head that
is solid and provides them cover and is solid, an

The bulk of the work on Habitat homes is done by volunteers, with
electric and plumbing done by licensed contractors, and the projects are funded by grants and donations of money, materials and time. Habitat had a wo home in early May.

## Lawmakers pan first year of STAAR test

They also wondered aloud if students who fail to pass STAAR tests early in high school would have enough time to catch up and pass sub-
sequent tests before they get so far be sequent tests before they get so far be
hind that they simply drop out. Committee members heard tes Committee members heard tesurged scrapping rules requiring that percent of the final grades of high percent of the final grades of high
school freshman. The committee also
wa was told that that districts are setting aside extra money to pay for addition-

On June 20,1782 , Congress approved the

In 1791, King Louis XVI of France and his family attempted to flee the country in the so-
called "Flight to Varennes," but were caught.

In 1837 , Queen Victoria acceded to the British
throne following the death of her uncle, King throne following the death of her uncle, King
William IV.
In 1863, West Virginia became the 35th state.
In 1893, a jury in New Bedford, Mass., found Lizzie Borden not guilty of the ax murders of
her father and stepmother.

In 1921, U.S. Rep. Alice Mary Robertson,
R-Okla., became the first woman to preside over a session of the House of Representatives. In 1947, Benjamin "Bugsy" Siegel was shot girlfriend, Virginia Hill, apparently at the order of mob associates.
In 1948, the variety series "Toast of the
Town," hosted by Ed Sullivan, debuted on CBS
In 1963, the United States and Soviet Union signed an agreement to set up a "hotline"
between the two superpowers.

In 1967, boxer Muhammad Ali was convicted in Houston of violating Selective Service laws by refusing to be drafted. (Ali's conviction was
ultimately overturned by the Supreme Court).

In 1972, three days after the arrest of the Watergate burglars, President Richard Nixon met at the White House with his chief of staff,

said the government will no longer seek to deport illegal immi grants under the age of 30 who were brought to the United States before they turned 16 and have
been in the country for at least five continuous years. They also must have no criminal history and
either have graduated from either have graduated from a U.S
high school, have earned high school, have earned a GED
diploma or certificate or have

## spokesman for Flake, said the congressman "does not support giving amnesty to illegal immi-

 giving amnesty to illegal immigrants, and he never has." Rep. Steve King, R-lowa, oneof the party's more outspoken lawmakers in the immigration issue, has announced he intends to file suit challenging Obama's
authority to bypass Congress and change the policy on his own. Also in the House, Rep. Ben Quayle, R-Ariz., has introduced egislation to block Obama from implementing his own policy. In
some regards, his state serves as a microcosm of the broader debate inside the party. In addition to Kyl's comments, reporters during the day he neither wanted to "repeal it or no repeal" what Obama announced. Like many other Republicans, McCain said Obama was now
doing "something that he said he didn't have constitutional authority to do a year ago." Also like other members of his party, he said the president's announcement had complicated efforts to ion to a vexing problem.
House Speaker John Boehner told reporters that because the "turned to the politics of envy and division, which I don't think the American people are going to accept."
Boehner said Obama's Boehner sad
announcement "puts everyone in announcement "puts everyone in young illegal immigrants who "from no fault of their own" are in the United States, as well as
lawmakers seeking legislation to tackle more than just the problem of younger illegal immigrants brought to the United States as children.
Democrats have applauded
Obama's announcement, many of them adding that he acted after Republicans refused to permit a more wide-ranging immigration
measure advance in Congress.
