City Commission meets Tuesday

Will consider repealing prohibition of sale of alcohol on Sundays.

The Pampa City Commission on Tuesday will consider on second and final reading approving a grant from the Pampa Economic Development Corp. to the Gray Pampa Community Fund in the amount of \$50,000.

The grant will support scholarships at local academic institutions and provide for area organizations to launch and manage social initiatives.

In other business, the commission will consider adopting on second and final reading:

- Ordinances amending chapters of the city code in adopting the 2012 International Fuel Gas Code and the 2012 International Plumbing Code.
 - An ordinance amending the revenues and appropriations for the support of the city for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1, 2012 ending Sept. 30, 2013. This amendment provides for an additional \$150,000 for the 2013 Seal Coat Project.

For Perry, veto is a seasonal power

Look at your calendar. It's about to be Perry time.

Texas governors like Rick Perry have three primary sources of power.

First is the bully pulpit — the ability to draw attention to a particular issue or cause, to get widespread media coverage, and to try to sway public opinion simply by saying things and being heard.

Governors also have the power to appoint most of the people who run the executive branch. It's not a cabinet government, and it takes years for governors to put their own people on all of the state boards and commissions in Texas. But eventually the power of those alliances and appointments accumulates.

Perry, who has been the governor since 2000, has extended that second power further than any of his predecessors. He doesn't just have the appointees; those appointees have, to a remarkable extent, hired former Perry aides, supporters and acolytes to fill agency positions. The professional people at the top of those agencies are often obliged to Perry, or to his operation, for their positions. His control of the executive branch has undone the cliché about the constitutional weakness of Texas governors. Someone caution his successors.

Then there is the power of the veto, which is coming into play as the legislative session draws

After vote on gay youth, Scouts face more turmoil

The Boy Scouts of America will get no reprieve from controversy after a contentious vote to accept openly gay boys as Scouts.

Dismayed conservatives are already looking at alternative youth groups as they predict a mass exodus from the BSA. Gay-rights supporters vowed Friday to maintain pressure on the Scouts to end the still-in-place ban on gay adults serving as leaders.

"They're not on our good list yet," said Paul Guequiere of the Human Rights Campaign, a national gay-rights group. He said the HRC, in its annual rankings of corporate policies on workplace fairness, would

deduct points from companies that donate to the Boy Scouts until the ban on gay adults is lifted.

In California, gay-rights leaders said they would continue urging passage of a bill pending in the Legislature that would make the BSA ineligible for nonprofit tax breaks because of the remaining ban.

The Boy Scouts' chief executive, Wayne Brock, pleaded for the Scouting community to reunite after the divisive debate that led to Thursday's vote by the BSA's National Council. The proposal to lift the ban on openly gay youth — while keeping the ban on gay adults — was supported by about 60 percent of the council's 1,400 voting members.

However, Brock's plea failed to sway some conservative religious leaders whose denominations sponsor many Scout units and who consider same-sex relationships immoral.

"Frankly, I can't imagine a Southern Baptist pastor who would continue to allow his church to sponsor a Boy Scout troop under these new rules," Richard Land, a senior Southern Baptist Conference official, told the SBC's news agency, Baptist Press.

Land advised Southern Baptist churches to withdraw their support of Scout troops and consider affiliating instead with the Royal Ambassadors, an existing SBC youth program for boys that combines religious ministry with Scouting-style activities.

Baptist churches sponsor Scout units serving more than 100,000 of the BSA's

2.6 million youth members.

The Assemblies of God, which oversees units serving more than 2,000 Scouts, said it could no longer support such units and suggested its own Royal Rangers youth group as a "positive alternative."

John Stemberger, a conservative activist and former Scout from Florida who led a group opposing the policy change, said he and his allies would convene a meeting next month in Louisville, Ky., to discuss creation of a "new character development organization for boys."

"We grieve today, not because we are faced with leaving Scouting, but because the Boy Scouts of America has left us," Stemberger said. "Its leadership has turned its back on 103 years of abiding by a mission to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices."

Nachtigall quoted from Matthew Chapter 7, which states that if you build a house but not on a strong foundation, then the house will not stand.

to a close. Legislation that makes it to Perry's desk becomes law whether he signs it or not, unless he uses his veto. And he's been willing enough, vetoing 273 bills since taking office. When Perry tells a lawmaker he might veto something, he might actually veto it.

Perry has never had a veto overridden by the Legislature, and that's where the calendar comes in. Lawmakers leave on Monday, and Perry will have until Father's Day, June 16, to decide which bills should become law.

That means they won't be here in Austin to try to override any veto. Even if he calls a special session, Perry's aides say, lawmakers acting in a special session can't override a veto of a bill from another session.

So this is his time. Other high officials have their own seasons of power. When the Legislature is in session, the speaker of the House and the lieutenant governor are at the peak of their power. Those two Cinderellas — Speaker Joe Straus and Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst — are ap-

proaching their midnight hour. They will still have some political juice after the session is over, but not what they have right now.

Comptrollers are powerful going into legislative sessions and, when they play it right, coming out: Those are the times when lawmakers need someone to tell them how much money they will have to spend, and then that their budget arithmetic was correct.

Comptroller Susan Combs started the session by telling lawmakers, in essence, that they have more money than they are allowed to spend.

That was terrific news for the lawmakers, but it also dampened Combs' clout. In a session like 2011's, when the state was short of money, any pennies a comptroller can produce are welcome. That is potentially a trading proposition: The legislators need money, and the comptroller wants things from the Legislature.

With money to spare this time, Combs' leverage dipped a bit. In fact, the House killed one of her pet projects this week, calling a rule violation on a bill that would have required more disclosure of debt and debt payments from local governments across Texas.

Koch brothers: Please buy the L.A. Times!

Hearing rumors that the billionaire, libertarian Koch brothers might buy the Los Angeles Times, the L.A. City Council

“L.A.’s metropolitan daily into an ideological mouthpiece.” Cue the laugh track.

UCLA professor Tim Groseclose wrote “Left Turns: How Liberal Media Bias Distorts the American Mind.” Of 20 major news outlets, he found 18 were left-wing. Only two tilted to the right -- The Washington Times and “Fox News Special Report.” Groseclose argues that media bias gives Democrats an 8- to 10-point electoral advantage. Take away the leftist bias, he says, and states would vote like Texas. A powerful pulpit like the Times in non-liberal hands could chip into that advantage.

How left-wing is the L.A. Times?

Consider this December 1993 editorial in which the paper effectively urged the repeal of the Second Amendment:

“You will not feel safe, your children will not be safe, until there are almost no guns on the streets and in the homes. No guns, period, except for those held by law enforcement officers and a few others, including qualified hunters and collectors. ... We must, as a nation, move toward a very different model, one that presumptively bars private citizens from owning a firearm unless they can demonstrate a special need and ability to do so. ... We think the time has come for Americans to tell the truth about guns. They are not for us; we cannot handle them. They kill people, our children included. It’s time to get rid of them. Period.”

The Los Angeles Times does not have a single local, regular non-leftist columnist who writes

about politics. Not one. Before the Supreme Court decision upholding ObamaCare, Times’ columnist David Lazarus questioned the motives of ObamaCare opponents: “That’s an act of pure selfishness (even though we’d all benefit from having fewer people relying on emergency services for treatment). It’s also a display of heartlessness unbefitting a country that claims to define itself by love-thy-neighbor Judeo-Christian values.”

Another columnist, Patt Morrison, thinks that the legal basis for ObamaCare rests in the preamble to the Constitution. “You know,” she said to me, “the part that says ‘provide for the domestic tranquility.’”

Another longtime business columnist, Michael Hiltzik, pushes the left-wing analysis that greed and lack of oversight caused the financial crisis. Forget about the minority reports filed by the Republican members of Obama-appointed Financial Crisis Inquiry Commission. One wrote: “Although there were many contributing factors, the housing bubble of 1997-2007 would not have reached its dizzying heights or lasted as long, nor would the financial crisis of 2008 have ensued, but for the role played by the housing policies of the U.S. government over the course of two administrations.”

On May 21, Angelenos go to the polls to vote for mayor, city attorney, controller and several city council races. The Times did not endorse a single Republican candidate.

Whether the purchase of the Los Angeles Times makes business sense remains an open question. But the reporting, editorial positions and parade of left-wing columnists already serve as an ideological mouthpiece -- only a left-wing one.

After World War I, it became known as Memorial Day to honor all soldiers who have lost their lives in service to their country.

The National Holiday Act of 1971 made Memorial Day into a three-day weekend, and Memorial Day became more of a weekend to celebrate the beginning of summer, have picnics and barbecues, and open public swimming pools. Now, “Memorial Day Sale”

seems to be quite prevalent. The solemn remembrance of those who gave their all has slipped quite a bit. Veterans’ groups and Boy and Girl Scouts in many areas place flags on the graves of service personnel, and there may be the occasional parade. When I was a student in grade school, we had to memorize the poem “In Flanders Fields” written in 1915 by John McCrae.

We shall not sleep, though poppies grow

In Flanders fields.

Many members of my family have served in the military, but since 1776 only one family member served in a war. My cousin Jeff fought in Vietnam and thankfully survived. Since 9/11/01 many young men and women have lost their lives in the war on terrorism.

I wish everyone a very happy and festive Memorial Day weekend, but please buy a poppy and take a few moments to remember those who have given their all for their country.

The very first Decoration Day — aka Memorial Day

If you check out the history of Memorial Day, most sites and people will tell you that the very first

Decoration Day (today’s Memorial Day) was proclaimed by General John Logan and observed in Arlington National Cemetery, May 5, 1868 when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers alike.

As glorious and harmonious as that day was, it wasn’t the very first Decoration Day.

To get the whole story of the very first Decoration Day, we have to check out Charleston, S.C. in February 1792. That was the year that the South Carolina Jockey Club finished construction of Washington Race Course in Hampton Park.

From its construction until the Civil War, it was the highlight site of Charleston’s social calendar. In February of each year Hampton Park turned into what would now be similar to a state fair. And

the highlight of the entire event was the Jockey Club Purse, on par with today’s Kentucky Derby.

Then came the start of the Civil War right there in Charleston. Everything changed. In the late months of the Civil War the Confederacy found itself without enough room for Union captives. The decision was made to transform the beautiful race park into a prisoner of war camp.

The exposure in the open outdoors of the race track, combined with food shortage and disease made it a terminal place for many.

Some 257 died in the latter days of the Civil War and were all buried in a single giant burial site out behind the grandstand. Then the war ended.

Charleston, once one of the South’s true gems, found itself wrecked from all of the bombardments and fires; looking like a true war zone of ruination in the spring of 1865.

Most of the white residents had evacuated by February 1865, leaving Charleston’s mostly black population to begin commemorating what the war had meant to them — FREEDOM.

The official surrender of the city was received by the Union Commander of the 21st U.S. Colored Infantry.

In the latter days of April, 28 black workmen went to the “mound” behind the grandstand and re-buried each one of those Union soldiers properly in their own grave. Then they built a beautiful high whitewashed fence around the graves and built an archway over the entrance into the cemetery with the words inscribed: “Martyrs of the Race Course.”

About that time is when the very first Decoration Day took place — May 1, 1865.

The day began with a glorious parade of 10,000 Charlestonians, mostly black, marching in celebration and remembrance around the old race course where only Charleston’s white aristocracy was allowed to gather for the park’s festivities.

But this day was different.

A New York Tribune correspondent witnessed the event, describing “a procession of friends and mourners as South Carolina and the United States never saw before.”

David Blight’s research discovered: “At 9:00am the parade was led by 3,000 black school children carrying arm loads of roses and singing ‘John Brown’s Body.’ Then several hundred black women with baskets of flowers, wreaths and crosses. Then came black men marching in cadence, followed by contingents of Union infantry and other black and white citizens.

As many as possible gathering in the cemetery enclosure; a children’s choir sang ‘We’ll Rally Around the Flag,’ the ‘Star-Spangled Banner,’ and several spirituals before several black ministers read from scripture.”

The truth is that the very first Decoration Day (Memorial Day) was mostly founded by black Charlestonians who brought enough flowers to make each of the cemetery’s 257 graves look like mounds in a gorgeous garden. They remembered, may we do likewise. God bless.

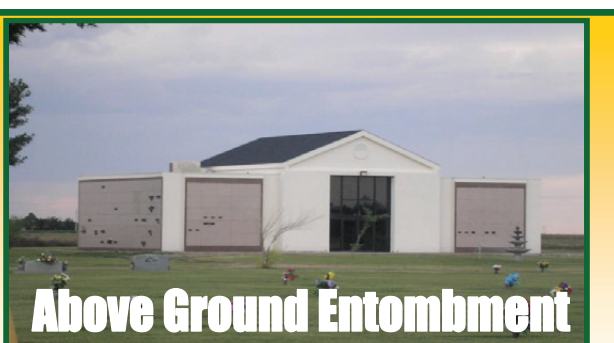

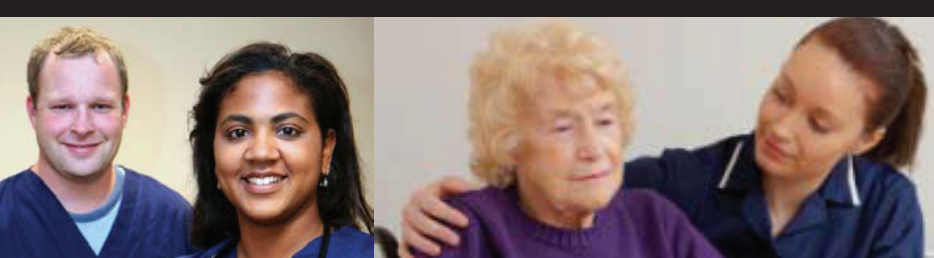

Crane accident cuts power to one-third of Vietnam

HANOI, Vietnam (AP) — One mistake by a clumsy crane operator caused a 10-hour blackout over about a third of Vietnam, exposing the fragility of the nation's power grid. State electricity company EVN said in a statement Thursday that the blackout occurred Wednesday after the crane operator knocked a tree down onto the main north-south high voltage power transmission line. The outage covered 22 of Vietnam's 63 provinces. It was not clear how many people were affected, but the loss of power forced scores of garment and seafood factories to close, and traffic was snarled in major cities as traffic lights failed. State-owned newspaper Thanh Nien reported that the incident cost EVN \$700,000 in lost revenue.

Doctors said they detected the hairball using a scope with a camera.

For Philadelphia bicyclist, a cat is his co-pilot

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — For bicyclist Rudi Saldia, you could say a cat is his co-pilot.

Saldia often buzzes around Philadelphia with his year-old feline Mary Jane perched on his shoulder. Their urban adventures have turned heads on the street and garnered big hits on YouTube.

The 26-year-old bike courier didn't intend to become Internet-famous. He originally shot footage of the outings only to prove to his mom that he was taking Mary Jane — nicknamed MJ — for a spin.

"She said, 'No way! You're not taking your cat out for the ride,' which is the reaction I still get even after people see this video," Saldia said.

Saldia used a GoPro sports camera mounted on his bike to capture images of him and MJ, a brown and black tabby with bright yellow eyes. She seems to take the trips in stride, even

nuzzling her owner as he pedals, though she gets a bit spooked by sirens and buses.

"She enjoys seeing everything and having the wind blow in her ears, especially being an indoors cat. This is really her only time outside," he said. "On the shoulder, she loves it. She's in total zen mode."

The first video, which he posted last October, has more than 1.2 million views on YouTube. GoPro spokeswoman AnneMarie Hennes said she saw it earlier this year and was blown away. She immediately reached out to Saldia to get permission to use the footage in a camera ad, which was posted online last month.

"It's just unique and he did a really good job shooting it," said Hennes. "We hooked him up with some cameras so he can make more cool MJ content."

Saldia said he began taking out MJ when she was 2 months old.

A Stinger for Your Swing

If you've heard of a shot called the "stinger" and wondered what it is and how to use it, this article is for you. Even if you haven't heard of it, you've probably seen it. It's a shot Tiger Woods revived in the 1990s and which better players use to good effect to achieve distance and accuracy from tee shots in the wind.

The stinger is simply a low-flying, low-spin shot that shoots along a bit like an aeroplane shortly after take-off. It's great to beat the wind, especially when the ground is firm and the ball bounces and rolls for extra distance.

Several subtle technique changes will help you achieve this. Here are the basics. First, you want to select about two clubs more than usual - Fairway Woods and longer Irons are the usual suspects. Then, move the ball slightly back in your stance. This allows the hands to get further forward at impact, removing some of the club's loft. Choke down slightly on the grip.

That alone will lower your trajectory without any swing changes. Of course, we can help you add in extra tools to perfect the shot.

Less experienced players can land in trouble trying this shot. But there's real value in being able to play it well. I invite you to contact me to give you tailored advice on how to incorporate this shot into your arsenal.
