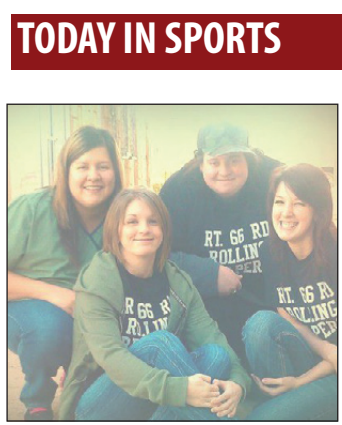

Coney Island celebrates 80 years in the Panhandle

Junior Rodeo, Pony Show this weekend

One does not have to travel to Lower Manhattan to get the authentic flavor of a coney-style hot dog. Pampa is home to a restaurant that serves these simple-yet-satisfying culinary masterpieces Monday-Saturday from 11 a.m.-7 p.m. First opened in Borger in 1933 by Bill Coronis, the Coney Island restaurant was moved twice until it reached its final destination near the intersection of Foster Avenue and Cuyler Street right here in Pampa. It has only changed ownership twice since its original opening. The first change was in Borger when opener Bill Coronis sold it to Ted and John Gikas, and they operated the eatery for decades until selling it to current owners Roger and Brenda Donnelson in 2001.

Whether they are coming to try out a coney or say "hello" to long-time employee Linda Austin, people from all walks of life come to the Coney Island restaurant.

"It is a historical marker [here in Pampa]," said Shelly Smith, another long-time employee of the restaurant. "People love coming in here just for the history. People come here from all over the world. We have a (guest) book that people sign and tell us what they think about our coney."

Zack Lee, who recently got promoted to manager, said that he thinks people like the classic look the restaurant has.

"I think its classic look and the Ted and John memorabilia," Lee said. "Just the atmosphere, really."

Coney Island is also the longest open business in Pampa. Aside from the cones, Coney Island also sells burgers, chili, stew and pies.



"They like the pies and the stews. They like it all I've never heard any negative comments," Smith said. The Pampa News asked the public's opinion of the restaurant on our Facebook page. And while there were a couple of negative comments, most of the responses were giving Coney Island the "thumbs-up."

Kathy Borden wrote, "The Coney Island was there when I was a child and when I visit Pampa my family visits there again. Although the food isn't the same as yesteryear, it's the nostalgia and the memories."

Others remember the interaction between the Gikases while they were in the restaurant.

Jessie Etheredge shared that she can still remember Ted telling them, "this is a coney, not a hot dog."

Sometimes, just as at any other job,

Ex-caretaker to trial for stolen whiskey

GREENSBURG, Pa. (AP) — The former live-in caretaker of a Pittsburgh-area mansion will stand trial on charges he drank more than \$102,000 worth of old whiskey that he was supposed to be guarding.

A district judge on Wednesday ordered 62-year-old John Saunders, of Irwin, to trial on theft charges after hearing from the owner of the South Broadway Manor Bed and Breakfast.

The owner found nine 12-bottle cases of whiskey hidden in the century-old mansion built by industrialist J.P. Brennan after she bought it last year. The Old Farm Pure Rye Whiskey was produced in the early 1900s and appraised at more than \$2,000 a bottle.

DPS trooper seizes 227 pounds of marijuana

AMARILLO — The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) conducted a traffic stop Wednesday on Interstate-40 yielding 227 pounds of marijuana that was valued at more than \$100,000.

At approximately 7:46 a.m., a DPS trooper conducted a traffic stop on a 2013 Toyota Camry passenger car traveling eastbound on I-40, for a traffic violation near Conway in Carson County. During the traffic stop, the trooper conducted a search of the vehicle and discovered 227 pounds of marijuana in the trunk.

The driver of the vehicle was identified as Miguel Danilo Morazan, 35, of El Paso. Morazan was placed under arrest for possession of marijuana, a second degree felony, and booked into the Carson County jail. The drugs were allegedly being transported from El Paso to Oklahoma City.

Rolling Reapers: Pampa's roller derby team

Roller derby team has members and league, just lacks a permanent practice facility.

When someone goes to a roller skating rink they normally don't consider the possibility of themselves or someone else falling down for the fun of it. But the ladies of the Rolling Reapers, Pampa's roller derby team for the Route 66 roller derby league, do it routinely and enjoy it.

Roller derby is now played normally on a flat skating track, as opposed to the banked skating tracks used in the 1970s. Two teams of five skaters match-up, each consisting of blockers and jammers. The blockers make up a pack and the jammers score the points. At first whistle the pack takes off, followed by the jammers on a second whistle. When a jammer makes it through the pack legally they become the lead jammer. The other players' jobs are to get the jammer through the pack without her being knocked down. As the jammer passes members of the pack, she gets a point for each member passed. The game can be very aggressive and can lead to injuries such as concussions and career-ending knee injuries, but can also be a very therapeutic sport.

"It's fun," said Alicia Sanchez (roller derby alias "un-

LEESHAbest"). "You can definitely let out a lot of aggression."

Team captain Brittany Walters (roller derby alias "Sarah Michelle Killher), said that it is also a way to get through a rough time in a person's life.

"Just about every single girl that I have skated with, and it's my story too, we all say roller derby saved our lives," Walters said. "We were all going through something and then we found this little niche. If you have bad self-esteem issues you join derby and you don't feel bad anymore. You become family."

The seasons usually run from April to October. The Rolling Reapers aren't playing right now but they have a sister team in Amarillo.

The ladies who play have to be in full-gear to practice or play. They also sign a waiver stating that injuries are a responsibility of the player, not the team or the owner of the building where they are competing. The team members have to have skater's insurance and are encouraged to have their own private insurance.

Taking and giving hits is the favorite thing for these players.

"The more bruises the better," Sanchez said. "I took a picture of my first derby bruise."

Walters said that the hits are almost a way of making friends out of respect.

"The harder the hit the better," Walters said. "I have made some of my really good friends just because we met at a game, and they beat me, and I was like 'that was impressive' and now we are really good friends."

Women from all walks of life are eligible to play. The Rolling Reapers team is made up of a lab tech, mother of three, someone with two jobs and many other occupations and characteristics.

While you do have to pass a skills test which includes skating on one foot, jumping while skating and getting up quickly after a fall, a player does not have to be the most physically gifted athlete.

There are almost 200 full-member leagues and 98 apprentice leagues in the Women's Flat Track Derby Association (WTFDA), but the Route 66 league does not belong to either category. Despite this, the Route 66 league is a WTFDA-sponsored league that follows the same rules.

The players going into the Open know the state of their game and have a game plan to minimize the impact of their weaker parts and a practice plan to improve them. What is the weakest part of your game and what will you be doing to minimize its impact?

If you are spraying tee shots right and left then leave the Driver in the bag and play a shorter club from the tee, like a Fairway or even a Hybrid. If

your long game is too inconsistent, then consider not trying to reach the green with a no. 3 or no. 4 Iron / Hybrid, but rather play a mid-Iron and leave it short but in the fairway. If you are thinking or 'chunking' short pitch shots, then make sure your approach-shot misses allow you to play a 'bump and run' or even the 'Texas Wedge'.

They say the Open Championship is about 'thinking' your way around a links layout. Actually, every round of golf is improved with better 'thinking'. Play golf this week, but play golf with your head. Contact us if you would like help to improve your game.

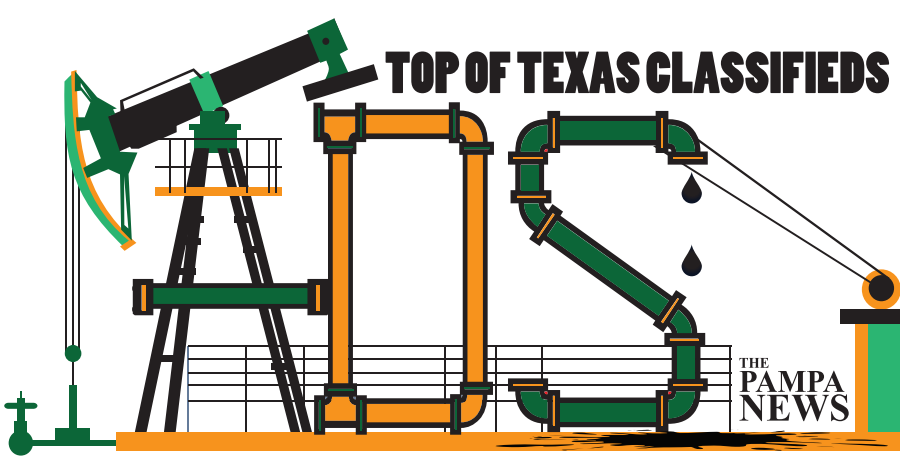

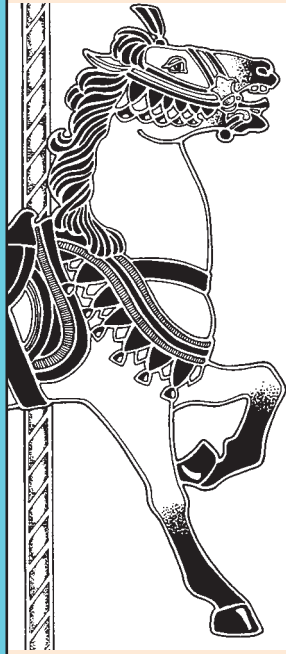

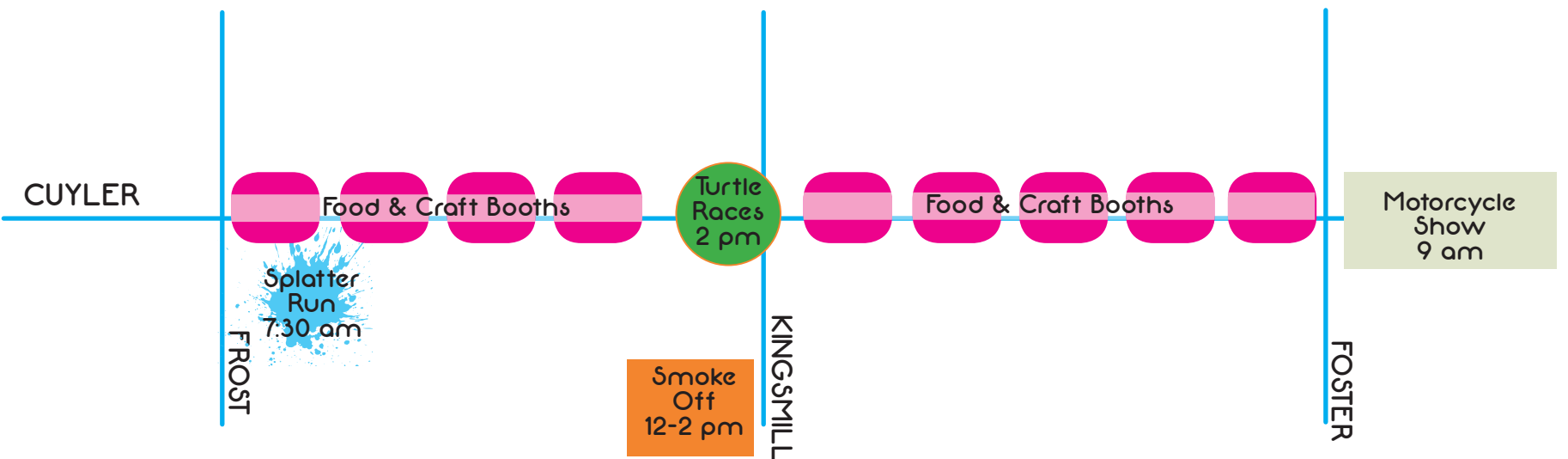
