## Race to enroll Texas Latinos as Obamacare deadline looms

AUSTIN — With a major deadline looming for all to have health care coverage or face possible penalties, the race is on to enroll the uninsured. Special focus is on the Latino population. Nationwide, 32 percent of Latinos are uninsured, compared to 16 percent of non-Latinos. In Texas, an estimated 3.5 million Hispanics have no health insurance.

Mayra Lopez, outreach specialist, Latino Health-Care Forum, said a majority of Latinos are eligible for "Obamacare."

"Try to enroll," Lopez said. "See if you qualify. If you don't qualify, it will tell you and it will give you options of what you can do. The worst thing is not to

### Engle homers as Harvesters come back against Borger

The Pampa Harvesters defeated Borger on Saturday 8-7 to advance to 6-8-1 (1-1 District) after trailing 7-3 at the top of the fifth inning. A three-run homer by sophomore Cade Engle followed by a one-RBI double from senior Ethan Hunt in the top of the sixth put the Harvesters on top 8-7 to win the game.

"I told them this game is seven innings and you've got to take what the game gives you. Just like in life, you get knocked down you've got to get up. We practiced six outs, so we were able to get those last six. These guys stayed in and didn't give up I couldn't be more proud of these guys,' head coach Kaleb Snelgrooes said. "We had some guys step up, Cade (Engle) with the big home run, Ryan (Powell) pitched well for us and I couldn't be more proud of them."

The Harvesters wasted little time at the top of the fifth getting on base after fresh-man Brendon Woelfle was walked as the lead-off hitter. A sacrifice bunt from Engle advanced Woelfle to second base. Senior Ryan Powell reached second base on an error loading two of the bases. Hunt was struck out swinging but then junior Brody Gaines hit a double to center field on a line drive hit, which brought in Powell and Woelfle for a 2-0 lead over the Bulldogs.

The Bulldogs scored one run on two hits, but had found a way to load the bases whether it was through walks or hit by pitches. Left fielder senior Brandon Stokes, Powell at third base and junior catcher Ty Hooper played a great game at their respective positions and were in sync which kept the game from getting away from the Harvesters.

"They did a great job, I just told these guys, whatever the game brings to them make the most of it. They did a great job of that. Ryan is a three-year varsity starter for us and Ty (Hooper) is the varsity quarterback and I just need them to be used to these pressure situations and make those plays and they did that today," Snelgrooes said. 
