Keeping the landscape in shape; there's an app or device for that

DALLAS – Many tools are available for turf managers to help monitor soil or weather conditions, diagnose turf problems or even take the guesswork out of selecting the best-suited grass type for the shade environment, according to a Texas A&M AgriLife Research turf expert.

Dr. Ben Wherley, an assistant professor for turfgrass science/ecology with AgriLife Research and the Texas A&M University soil and crop science department in College Station, demonstrated some of the new tools and technologies available to attendees of the turf and landscape industry at the recent Turf, Landscape and Irrigation Expo at the Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center in Dallas.

Whether it is shade, pH, salinity, soil compaction, air circulation, soil type, spray application, lawn size or soil moisture, Wherley said there are an increasing number of helpful apps and tools available for professionals, such as landscapers, golf course superintendents and athletic field managers, as well as homeowners, since most of the devices are reasonably priced.

Some iPhone or iPad apps that are handy, he said,

• Sunseeker app allows a person to enter any date and determine the exact trajectory of the sun for that date, helpful in determining how many hours of direct sunlight will reach a given area. Wherley said it also is used for tree pruning and planting, allowing landscapers to identify the problem trees when they have shade issues and determine where the shade pattern will fall when a new tree

• Planimeter app allows a landscaper to pull up a

GPS map of a client's home and drop pins on the corners of their property to get a quick, accurate estimate of the size of their lawn. "You could liter-

ally do a bid remotely or at the customer's doorstep without having to walk off or measure the site, Wherley said. • Landscape and Garden Calculator app helps the

landscaper or do-it-yourselfer calculate the quantity of materials, such as fertilizer and mulch needed for any given area, as well as fence lengths, spaces between items and angles if needed.

• Turfgrass Management app is designed for the southern U.S. and has pictures and information for all types of insects, pests and diseases – "things you might want to be looking out for on your site and it gives you an alert on your phone," Wherley said.



policecrimes. com. Policecrimes. com is a website that has, since 2004, been devoted to videotaping, for the

sole purpose of exposing law enforcement personnel across this country in acts of brutality or oppression, whether it be against a citizen or a member of their group, and placing those videos with hopes of going viral, on YouTube.

In April, a person calling himself a photographer video taped Gray County deputy sheriffs and Pampa policemen performing routine duties at a traffic stop on Cuyler Street. Photographer he is not. He is nothing but a yahoo walking around chosen city streets using a video camera with hopes of luring law enforcement personnel into his trap. He goes by the username andrewwake58

on his YouTube channel, and he is the owner of the viral video 'Rights Violated in Pampa, Texas,' or by another title, 'Small Town Hick Cops Hate to be Videotaped — Man Assaulted.' Small town hick cops? Give me a hick cop in Pampa, Texas versus living in crime-ridden cities such as Chicago, Detroit, New York City, Los Angeles, etc.

Policecrimes.com's website touts the groups knowledge of the First, Fourth, and Fifth Amendments of our Constitution. What the group doesn't tout about their videos is the fact their 'photographers' are schooled with what to say to an inquiring law enforcement officer, and that a goodly portion of law enforcement officers across this nation are not up on the Constitution. Am I endorsing policecrimes.com's motive? Hell no! I think their motive is reprehensible, like slime.

Make no mistake, what policecrimes.com and andrewwake58 are about. Their sole purpose is to make law enforcement come across as untrained, not knowledgeable on law, and specifically, abusive. World Cup action begins Thursday.

I am going to be talking about a sport that isn't too popular here, but it is the most popular sport as a whole worldwide. That is the sport of soccer, futbol or football as it is also known by.

Thursday will mark the start of the 2014 Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) World Cup in Brazil. It is like the Olympics and only occurs every four years. It is a time where all participating countries get their best players together in hopes to bring home bragging rights for a year.

The first stage is a group stage. Groups are made up of four teams and everyone plays everyone in the group. Ghana knocked out the United States in the round of 16 in 2010. The United States is ranked No. 13 in the world by FIFA.

As you can tell this is a very tough draw with Germany, who is looking to possibly win the World Cup after coming up short in the last one. The USA is a better squad than Ghana so if they can beat them soundly and at least tie either Portugal or Germany, they might be able to advance to the knockout stage.

All 64 World Cup matches will be televised on ABC, ESPN or ESPN2. The United States kicks off against Ghana next Monday at 5 p.m. on ESPN.
