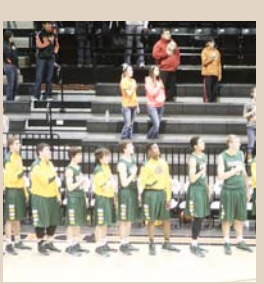

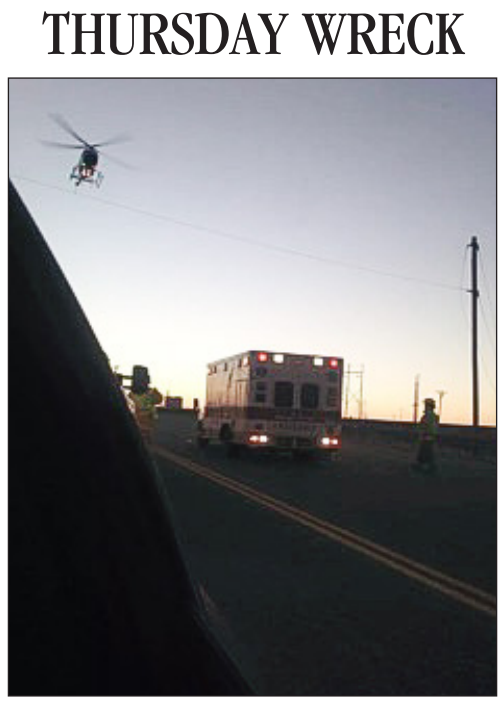

## State gas price average down 8 cents

 IRVING — According to the AAA Texas Weekend Gas Watch the average price for a gallon of regular unleaded fuel in the Lone Star State is now \$1.87. That's 8 cents less than last week and \$1.24 less than one year ago. Of the major metropolitan areas surveyed in Texas, drivers in Corpus Christi are paying the most at \$1.95 per gallon while drivers in Amarillo and Fort Worth are paying the least at \$1.79 per gallon. Drivers in Texas are paying 21 cents less per gallon than the national average of \$2.08.  
 Both national and statewide averages continue to test lows not seen since May 2009. Barring any major increases in the global price of crude oil, AAA analysts expect the national and statewide average prices for a gallon of regular unleaded gasoline to remain below \$3.00 per gallon in 2015.  
 "Currently Texas has one of the top ten least expensive statewide gas price averages in the country," said AAA Texas/New Mexico Representative Doug Shupe. "It now costs about \$26 to fill up a typical 14-gallon size fuel tank which is about \$17 less than this time last year."  
 The dramatic slide in retail gas prices has been driven by a similar drop in global crude oil prices since the end of the summer. This decline in the price of oil has been the result of weak demand combined with abundant supply.  
 While lower gas prices are certainly a welcome relief for consumers, the broad impact of sustained low oil prices are front of mind for many industry stakeholders.  
 In countries like the United States where the cost of oil extraction is more expensive, producers may be forced to reassess their plans to factor in profit margins that are sharply lower or even reversed as markets continue to register multi-year lows. Additionally, countries that rely heavily on oil revenues to fund government services may find themselves in situations where reductions to social programs are necessary, which could lead to civil unrest. Either of these dynamics has the potential to put upward pressure on prices.

Vals' list brings to mind another quote of Voltaire's, "To learn who rules over you, simply find out who you are not allowed to criticize."

Why did Vals not include slanders against Catholicism and Islam, the world's largest religions, both of which have been repeatedly insulted by Charlie Hebdo? In the banlieues north of Paris, they wish to know.

Pope Francis himself said yesterday, "You cannot provoke. You cannot insult the faith of others. ... If my good friend Dr. Gasparri says a curse word against my mother, he can expect a punch."

Is our new Pope offering preemptive dispensations to Catholics who sock those who mock their faith? That's pre-Vatican II thinking.

Back to Vals' list. Who decides what is "anti-Semitism" and what is "racism"? In America, these terms are tossed around with abandon.

As for the "glorification of terrorist acts," Israel's Menachem Begin, the ANC's Nelson Mandela, and the PLO's Yasser Arafat were all credibly charged with acts of terrorism in their liberation struggles.

And all three won the Nobel Prize for Peace. Millions of Algerians reside in France. Is it impermissible for them to celebrate the FLN in Algeria and the often-terrible deeds that won their independence? Algerians did not fight the French in stand-up

battles, but rather with bombs in cafes and movie theaters.

Did not the maquisards and French Resistance, during and after the Nazi occupation, exact savage reprisals, of which some in France are today ashamed?

Who decides which historical events are off-limits for debate?

Even before the Paris march, Vals had declared "war against terrorism, against jihadism, against radical Islam, against everything that is aimed at breaking fraternity, freedom, solidarity."

But does not the renewed publication of cartoons that insult the Prophet undermine the fraternity and solidarity of French Muslims, Christians and secularists in Val's war on terrorism?

Has Charlie Hebdo really helped to unite the West and the Islamic world in the "war ... against jihadism, against radical Islam"? Or has it divided us?

Egyptian President Abdel-Fattah el-Sissi, our ally who ousted the Muslim Brotherhood, killed hundreds, and imprisoned thousands, just issued a decree allowing him to ban foreign publications offensive to Islam.

Why might President Sissi regard Charlie Hebdo as toxic?

According to a 2013 Pew Poll, 80 percent of Egyptians favor the stoning of adulterers and 88 percent the death penalty for apostates.

The figures are comparable for Afghanistan, Pakistan, Jordan and the Palestinian territories. Across the Middle East,

majorities favor the adoption of sharia law. Many support beheadings, stonings, the lash and amputations of limbs for lesser offenses.

What does these polls tell us?

First, if we insist that freedom of the press means standing behind the blasphemies of Charlie Hebdo, we should anticipate the hatred and hostility of majorities in the Islamic world to whom faith and family are everything — and our First Amendment is nothing.

Second, the idea that, by sending armies of Americans into that part of the world for a decade or two, we could convert these peoples, steeped in a 1,500-year-old faith, to share our embrace of religious, cultural and moral pluralism and secularism was utopian madness.

Third, as Islamic peoples grow in number and militancy, while the peoples of Europe age and pass on, and the migrants continue to come

from the Maghreb and Middle East, Europe will have to adapt to Muslim demands or face endless civil and cultural conflict on the Old Continent.

The moral befuddlement in France mirrors that of the West.

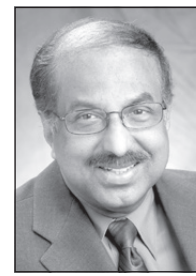
In welcoming the return to the newsstands of Charlie Hebdo, with a cartoon mocking the Prophet on its cover, President Hollande said, "You can murder men and women, but you can never kill their ideas."

True. And anti-Islamism is an idea. As is the "radical Islam" against which France has declared war.

And which of the two ideas appears today to have more adherents willing not only to march for it on Sundays, but to die for it?

Q: I am 62 years old and really worried. My whole life, I've always paid the

## Men concerned about size

maximum into Social Security. But now these last several years before I retire, I don't think I will quite earn a high enough salary to reach the maximum payment. I am concerned what this will do to my Social Security check. What happens if I don't get the maximum payout?

A: I guess what they say is true: Men really do worry about the size of things whereas women usually don't. In the 17 years I've been writing this column, I have probably heard from a thousand men worried that they won't get the maximum Social Security benefit. But I have never once heard from a woman with the same concerns.

Every year, the Social Security Administration announces the so-called "maximum" Social Security retirement benefit. There is nothing special about it. The agency's press office puts out the number only because the media cries for it. I guess that little snippet of information makes for a good news story.

That maximum benefit is \$2,663 in 2015. That



means that if someone is turning age 66 this year and has paid taxes on maximum Social Security-covered earnings for each of the last 35 years, he or she will get \$2,663 effective with age 66.

But there is nothing special about getting that maximum benefit. It's not like you get a bonus from the government if you pay the maximum Social Security tax each year. Your retirement benefit will be based on your highest 35 years of earnings. And as I just said, if you have 35 years of maximum earnings, you will get a maximum Social Security benefit. If you don't, you won't quite get the maximum, but so what?

If you have a few years of less than maximum earnings, you'll get something darn close to that maximum rate. Your Social Security check might not be as big as the one paid to guy next door who had maximum

earnings, but I must repeat: So what? Don't worry about it!

And I must make one more important point about all this maximum benefit business. I just said that the maximum Social Security benefit this year is \$2,663. But there are many people getting more than that. How can that be?

Again, that is the maximum amount payable to someone turning age 66 and retiring in 2015. But there are many people who work beyond their Social Security retirement age. And if they do so, their benefit will usually continue to grow because of all the additional earnings added to their Social Security record. How that works is explained in the answer to the next question.

Q: I took my Social Security last month at age 66. But I continue to work. I was surprised to learn that they are still withholding Social Security taxes from my paycheck. Isn't it true that once you go on Social Security, you no longer have to pay into the system? And if I must continue to pay, will my Social Security benefits go up because of the extra taxes I'm forced to pay?

A: Everyone who works at a job covered by Social Security must have Social Security payroll taxes deducted from his or her paycheck. And you pay those taxes whether you are 20 years old or 120 years old!

To understand whether or not the earnings you have, and the taxes you pay, after you start getting Social Security will increase your benefits, you have to understand how Social Security retirement benefits are figured in the first place.

Simply stated, your Social Security retirement benefit is based on your average monthly income, indexed for inflation, using a 35-year base of earnings. So, when you initially filed for Social Security, the Social Security Administration looked at your entire earnings his-

tory. Then they adjusted each year of earnings for inflation. The inflation adjustment factor depends on your year of birth and varies from one year to the next.

After SSA indexes each year of earnings for inflation, they pull out your highest 35 years and add them up. Then they divide the total by 420 — that's the number of months in 35 years — to get your average monthly inflation-adjusted income. Your Social Security benefit is a percentage of that amount. The percentage used depends on a variety of factors to complex to explain here. But for now, suffice it to say that for most people, their Social Security retirement benefit represents roughly 40 percent of their average inflation-adjusted monthly income.

So when you are working and paying Social Security taxes after you start receiving Social Security benefits, those additional taxes you are paying will increase your monthly Social Security check if your current earnings increase your average monthly income. In other words, if your current annual income is higher than the lowest inflation-adjusted year of earnings used in your most recent Social Security computation, SSA will drop out that low year, add in the new higher year, recalculate your average monthly income, and then refigure your Social Security benefit.

Monthly benefit increases can be as little as \$5, or as much as \$50 or more. But on average, a year of earnings will increase your Social Security benefit by about \$20 per month.

SSA has a software program that automatically tracks the earnings of working Social Security beneficiaries and refigures their benefits to see if any increase is due. The increase shows up automatically (you don't have to file for it) in the following year. So, for example, you will get an increase for your 2015 earnings sometime in 2016.

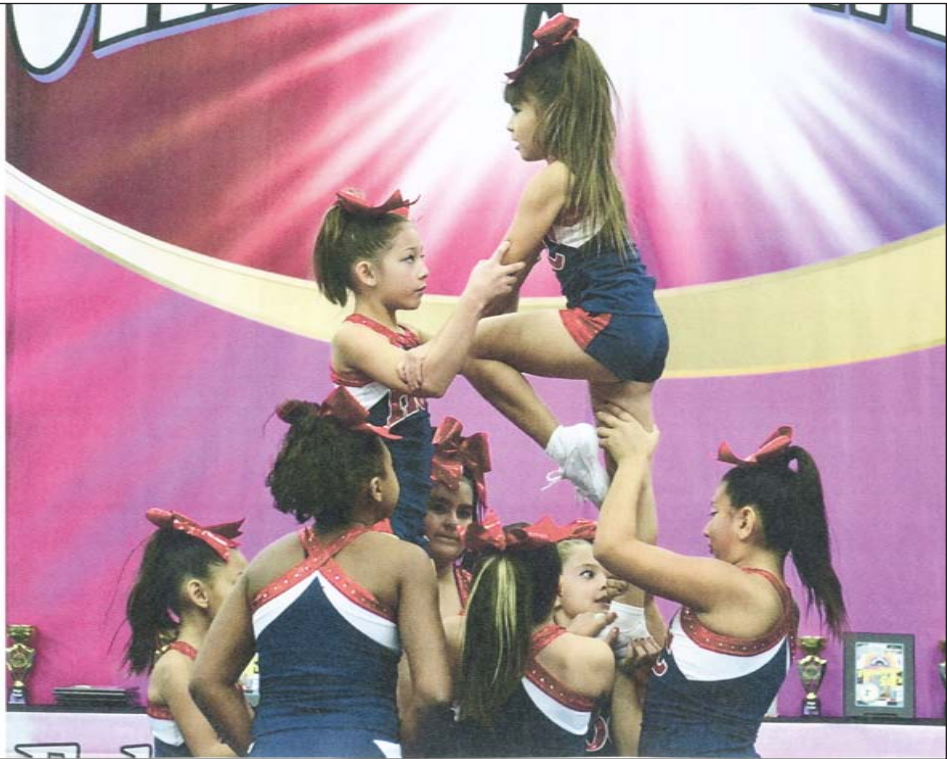

## Lady Harvesters hold off Rangerettes rally behind Brown's 20 points

The Pampa Lady Harvesters (13-10, 1-1) took the court Friday night to take on the Perryton Rangerettes in their second district game of the season. The Lady Harvesters held off a late rally from the Rangerettes to win 48-46, including a defensive stand with six seconds left in the game. The Lady Harvesters got the ball with .2 seconds left and were able to inbound the ball to run out the clock.

"I told them that this is six seconds that we have been practicing for all year. If we are going to come out and play defense then it's for this last six seconds," head coach Kim Chaffin said. "Even if they kind of dribble it around and they had the ball the whole time, we are going to play smart and don't foul and we are going to make them make the mistakes."

The Lady Harvesters wasted little time getting on the board to start the game with senior Madison Brown scoring a basket in the paint just 40 seconds into the game. Senior Rayna Wall hit a basket followed by a free throw conversion by sophomore Elise Kennedy to give the Lady Harvesters a two possession lead at 5-0. Senior Taylor Eubank added to the run with a basket of her own extending the lead to 7-0. Perryton scored a pair of baskets to pull within three.

Senior Raven Neal-Landers went a perfect 2-2 from the free throw line to put the lead back at five before Perryton sank another basket. Already leading 11-6, Eubank hit a basket and converted two free throws to give Pampa the 15-6 lead.

Perryton hit a trey with under a minute to play and Brown went 1-2 from the line to make it a seven point game. Perryton went a perfect 4-4 from the charity stripe, however, to make it 16-13.

Brown started the second quarter much like the first, hitting a basket 35 seconds into the quarter making it a five point game. Eubank added to the lead with a basket of her own and the score became 20-13. Perryton tied it up at 20 on a 7-0 run until Neal-Landers and Wall each hit baskets to take the lead back at 24-20.

Perryton tried to come back, hitting a trey but Brown wouldn't have any of it as she hit a pair of baskets to give the Lady Harvesters the 28-23 lead to end the half.

The second and third quarters were also senior Caragan Niccum's first action of the season. While she didn't have any points her presence in the paint and rebounding helped the Lady Harvesters.

"I think she did very well, there were times when she was first coming back I was getting a little scared watching her, but that kid has so much passion for what she's doing I went up to her before I put her in and I asked her, 'where would you be more comfortable, guard or post?' and she said, 'Coach you can put me anywhere,'" Chaffin said. "That's just the heart and mindset of Caragan, so I am very pleased with her."

Brown and the Lady Harvesters came out of the gates in the third quarter with a 6-1 run to take the 34-24 lead. The Rangerettes wanted to keep it interesting by going on a 9-0 run before senior Ty'Randa Johnson hit a 3-pointer out of the corner pocket.

Eubank capped the quarter off with a fast break layup to give the Lady Harvesters the six-point, 39-33 lead heading into the final quarter.

"After we played Dalhart that was one of the better games we had played defensively and we focused so hard on our defense we were kind of absent-minded on offense a little bit," Chaffin said.

The Pampa Hustlin' Harvesters 18-2 (0-1) played host to the Perryton Rangers 8-10 (1-0) in the first district game for both teams on Friday night.

Perryton added another three to take an 11-8 lead. Perryton's run continued with the score at 13-8 with 1:19 to go.

Junior Shanoaha Bridges went 2-2 from the line and had four points in the quarter. Engle, Stevens and Gibson all had two. Scott had a three-pointer and three points in the quarter.

There was yet another three by the Rangers to help them pull within two at 23-21 with 1:25 to go before the half.

Burrell had a steal that led to sophomore Brandon Sieck's layup that made the score 25-21 with 20 seconds left. Pampa led at the break, 25-21.

Engle, Sieck, Zuniga and Gibson each had two points in the quarter. Stevens was 2-2 from the charity stripe and had four points in the quarter.

To start the third, Perryton picked up right where they left off in the first half with a three to come within one at 25-24 with 6:30 to go in the quarter.

Another Ranger three gave them the lead at 27-25. It was a lead they never relinquished the rest of the night.

Engle had a layup to briefly tie the game at 27 all before Perryton hit another three with four minutes to go in the quarter. That score put the Rangers up 30-27.

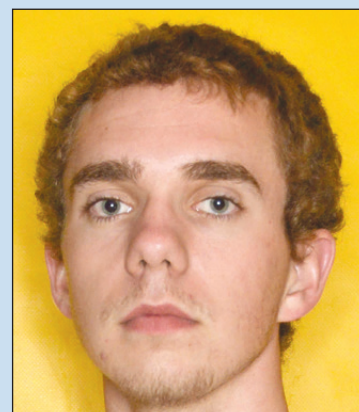

## Golf Tips of the Week

### ■ Improving your game

The second oldest Open Championship is the South African Open and on Sunday it saw Charl Schwartzel lose a 4-shot lead with 5 holes to play.

Of course the media is out with their easy headlines: "Choker".

But that's not fair, really.

If you look at Schwartzel's driving accuracy statistics on the PGA Tour, he ranks 121st. He hit the fairway less than 60% of the time.

So at the best of times, he's not accurate off the tee (by PGA Tour standards), and now we add a little pressure.

What many coaches talk about is a "go-to shot",

especially for the times when you're not playing well or playing under pressure. It might be a high fade.

Some Pros play a shortened backswing and hit a lower draw off the tee.

Rarely, though, will it be a straight shot.

That only ever leaves them with half the fairway to play with, whereas playing a fade means they can aim down the very left and play with the whole width of the fairway.

On the range, is there a tee shot shape you can replicate, and control, easier than any other?

It might not even be with the Driver, but try and make sure you have a club and shot you feel confident in playing for the time you find yourself four ahead with five to play.

## Thunder snaps Warriors' streak

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Russell Westbrook scored 17 points, had a career-high 17 assists and matched a career best with 15 rebounds to help the Oklahoma City Thunder beat the Golden State Warriors 127-115 on Friday night.

Westbrook had eight assists and six rebounds in the fourth quarter to help the Thunder pull away.

Kevin Durant scored 36 points, Serge Ibaka matched his career high with 27 points and Dion Waiters added 21 for the Thunder. Oklahoma City had lost three of four, but

bounced back by shooting 53 percent from the field.

The loss ended the NBA-leading Warriors' eight-game winning streak. Klay Thompson scored 32 points, Marreese Speights had 20 and Stephen Curry added 19 for the Warriors, who allowed their highest point total of the season.

Oklahoma City trailed for most of the first half. Late in the second quarter, Westbrook went for a hard throw-down and missed, but the ball bounced straight up in the air and in to give the Thunder a 53-51 lead. They scored the

next five points to push their advantage to seven.

Oklahoma City inbounded the ball with 0.1 seconds left in the first half, and Steven Adams was fouled by Justin Holiday on a tip attempt. Adams made the first free throw and missed the second, but Westbrook flew in and tipped the ball at the buzzer to give the Thunder a 69-60 lead.

Anthony Morrow drained a 3-pointer at the third-quarter buzzer to put the Thunder ahead 98-91. Ibaka scored 14 points in the fourth, and the Thunder remained in control the rest of the way.

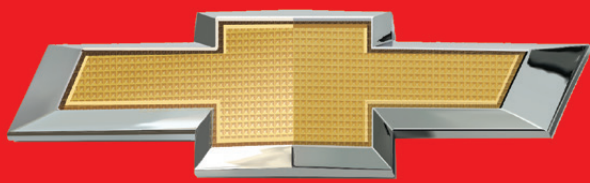

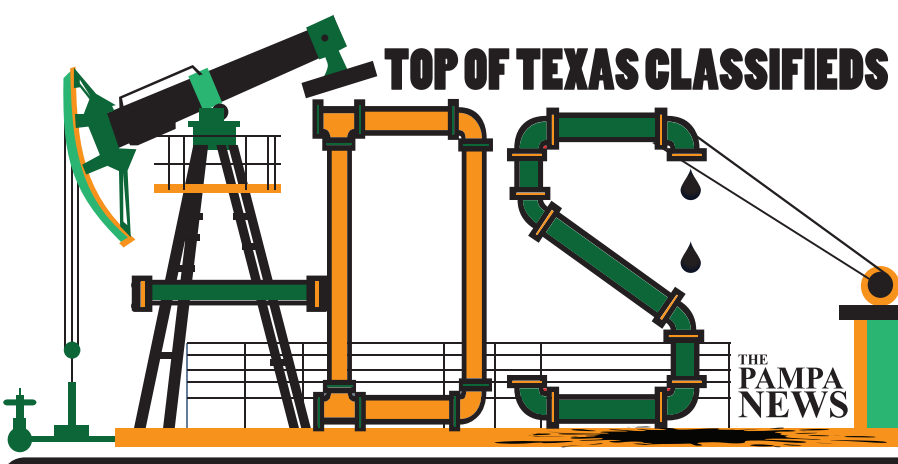
