Sgt. Houston Gass honored at **Back to Badges Night for** the Amarillo Bulls



Prior to anything I'm lying abed one frosty January morn contemplating life when I decide to start stretching.



The owner has to pay for Louie's month of care and testing for rabies.



Wilson tried a slant pass over the middle and it was picked off by Malcom Butler in the endzone.


A question that will be talked about across the world for the next six months is why did Seattle throw instead of handing it off to "Beast Mode" Marshawn Lynch?
