Tralee Crisis Center activities highlight sexual assault awareness

 Governor Greg Abbott designated April 2015 as Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAAPM) in Texas. Tralee Crisis Center joins rape crisis centers across the state in commemorating Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month to promote awareness and support survivors. This year's theme "In Your Own Backyard" highlights the pervasiveness of sexual assault in our communities. "Too often people think of sexual assault as something that happens to someone else – that is until it happens to them or someone they love. Then there it is – plopp – in your own backyard" said Dee Laramore, executive director of Tralee Crisis Center, who has served sexual assault victims from Pampa and the surrounding area since 1984. On Wednesday, April 29, Tralee Crisis Center invites local citizens and businesses to join them in "Denim Day." On this day, everyone is asked to wear their favorite jeans to work as a visible gesture of sup-

port for sexual assault victims everywhere. The purpose of this event is to raise awareness about the issue of sexual violence and the resources Tralee Crisis Center provides. This week, Tralee volunteers will be contacting local businesses and individuals asking them to participate in Denim Day by displaying Denim Day posters and wearing jeans. Last year, 39 local businesses participated in the event. Why denim? In 1998, a teenage girl in Italy was raped by her driving instructor, explained Laramore. The man was convicted, but the case was overturned on appeal a year later, she said. An appellate judge ruled that since the girl wore very tight jeans, she must have had to help remove them, thus giving consent to have sex. The case made international headlines, and the young girl's jeans became of symbol that what someone wears is never an excuse for rape, she said. Since September 2014, 90 new sexual assault victim/survivors have come to Tralee Crisis Center.

Research has brought us so far along that I can actually work during the months of my chemo treatment. Is that not amazing? Sure I have ups and downs but I have been able to live a productive life thus far. I relay so that treatment becomes even better, easier, and hopefully cancer is cured.

I have been relaying for years for my community and loved ones. I relay for my family and friends and for you. “In Texas, nearly 2 million Texans have been sexually assaulted. That equals 1 in 5 women and 1 in 20 men in our state. Unfortunately, fewer than 20

percent of sexual assaults are ever reported to police for fear they won't be believed or that nothing will be done,” Laramore said. “‘In Your Own Backyard’ reminds us of the importance of collective responsibility of community members in raising awareness, responding to reports of sexual assault, and understanding the dynamics of sexual violence.”

Mom was born on Feb. 18, 1925 in Muskogee Okla., the youngest of four children and the only daughter of Amy Wilson and Earl New. Her family moved to Skellytown around 1930. She grew up during the Great Depression and would tell us stories of how they lived. She and her brothers would get one pair of used shoes for Christmas and wrap their old shoes in butcher paper and give them to the "poor family" down the road in Skellytown.

They had family outings to the gullies and sandy creek bottoms to pick berries for making jam, and an occasional trip with her dad to "borrow" a little drip gas found in

exposed oil pipe in low areas where the pipe dripped, for the family Model T. She and her family eventually settled in Pampa where she lived the majority of her life. At 85 years old, Mom surprised us all when she left Pampa and moved to The Woodlands to spend her last years closer to Ann and me and her grandchildren. My sister and I thought she would never leave all she had ever known for a new life.

She attended Texas Tech University where she earned a Master's degree in Education, with a major in nutrition, and a minor in chemistry. Her 28-year teaching career began at Pampa High School followed by teaching science at Grandview Hopkins and Robert E. Lee Junior High in Pampa, where she spent the majority of her teaching years. She finished her teaching career at Lamar Elementary School in Pampa. My sister Ann remembers all the animals she had in her class for teaching, and I remember all the snakes, spiders, frogs, turtles, and horned toads she brought home to me. She created the first outdoor science lab in the spaces between the buildings at Robert E. Lee, and had one class bury a time capsule.

Mom married Paul D. Keim on Aug. 14, 1948, and had two children, myself, Frank Daniel Keim, and my sister, Elizabeth Ann Keim (now Findley). She later married V. G. "Red" Nelson on Sept. 9, 1977, and had a wonderfully happy relationship until Red's death in 1984. She led a very active social life but never remarried. She was an avid sports fan and loved the St. Louis Cardinals which we will forgive her for.

Mary also loved college sports and supported Texas Tech all of her life even to the point of flying with the girls basketball team occasionally. She volunteered for the Top O' Texas Golf Tournament at Pampa Country Club for many years.

Mom was a very spiritual woman who backed up her faith with countless acts of service during her life. She was involved with Meals on Wheels in Pampa, mission work at First Presbyterian Church in Pampa, and the after school program, Create a Beat!, at Hi-Land Christian Church in Pampa. She was an active member of Pampa Altrusa Club and Twentieth Century Study Club.

Ann always called her Mother, and I always called her Mom, but we both agree we have never known a more gracious lady. She was right at home hunting or branding cattle with Red as she was on a ballroom dance floor. She always made everyone she met the most important person in the room and never made an enemy in her life. She celebrated her 90th birthday with more than 30 family members from 12 cities and four states, some of us not seeing each other in more than 30 years. She truly enjoyed her life to the fullest. Please come and join us for the celebration of her life.

She is survived by her son, Dan Keim and wife Audrey; her daughter, Ann Findley and husband Chuck; her brother Paul New and wife Grace; her step-daughters, Susan Nelson and Cathy Thompson; five grandchildren, Brian Findley, Michael Findley, Mary McKenzie Keim, McLendon Daniel Keim and Jackson Miles Keim; two step grandchildren, Rob Findley and Les Findley; her great-grandchildren, Alexis Findley, Kelly Findley, Christopher Findley, Brianna Findley and Peyton Findley, and her great-great-grandchild, Nijah Braxton. 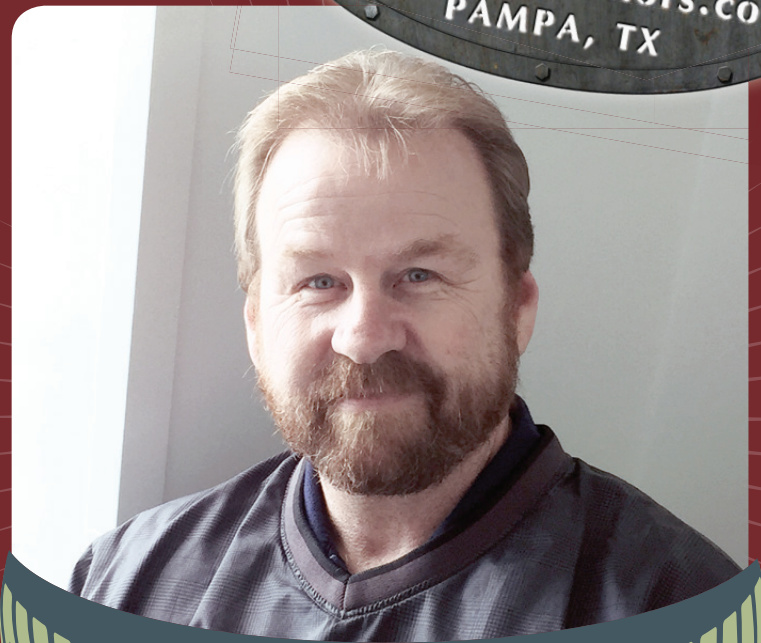
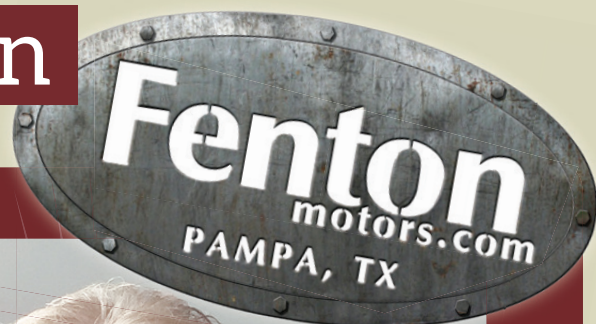

Chicago: Economic death spiral after 84 years of democratic control

Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel, after winning reelection, pronounced

Chicago "the greatest city in America." Run by Democrats for more than eight decades, Chicago should serve as a

showplace that reflects the wonderful world of "progressive policies." Public schools are a mess, and the city's finances place their bonds at near junk level. In 2013, the city averaged 36 homicides a month, with the majority of them unsolved.

CNN aired a series on Chicago called "Chicago-land," starring the city's dynamic mayor. Presumably, Emanuel thought it would show off the mayor as he tackled the city's problems. Why, if the man his own mom calls "Rahmbo" can lead Chicago as a prosperous, well-run city, imagine the job he'd do as president of the United States. But the idea backfired — and not because Emanuel isn't dynamic or hard-working.

The eight-part series showed a beleaguered city, struggling to get by on limited funds. In one episode, a valiant but embattled inner-city high school principal literally maps out "safe passage zones" — routes her students could take to and from school to avoid gang violence. Think of it. A public school principal literally advising

students on how they can go to and from school — without getting shot.

Welcome to Chicago-land.

A recent piece in the National Journal pronounced Chicago a "broken city." "Perhaps more than any other major city in America, Chicago is facing a truly grave set of problems — problems that are essentially more extreme versions of the challenges confronting city governments across the country.

"The quandaries begin with Chicago's dramatic social divide. To an even greater extent than is the case in, say, New York or Philadelphia, Chicago has become two entirely separate cities. One is a bustling metropolis that includes the Loop, Michigan Avenue's Magnificent Mile, and the Gold Coast, as well as the city's well-to-do, working-class, and upwardly mobile immigrant neighborhoods. The other Chicago consists of impoverished neighborhoods on the far South and West Sides, primarily populated by African-Americans. These places have remained beyond the reach of the city's recovery from the Great Recession.

"Meanwhile, even as it grapples with this extreme gap, Chicago is suffering from a severe fiscal crisis. Like plenty of other municipalities, Chicago lacks the revenue to pay its bills, particularly its pension obligations to city workers. According to a 2013 Pew report, 61 other U.S. cities face similar difficulties, but Chicago's situ-

ation is one of the worst. ... If the gaping holes in Chicago's social and fiscal fabric ... can't be fixed ... (t)hen Chicago may end up serving as a cautionary tale about the grim political and economic fate awaiting other U.S. cities that put off or wish away their problems."

About Chicago's finances, Investors Business Daily recently reported: "(Chicago's) financial woes have mounted despite Emanuel's efforts to rein them in. Years, perhaps even decades, of past financial sins all seem to be coming home to roost now. ... Moody's Investors Service estimated in a 2013 report that fixed costs, like pension contributions and debt service, could soon eat up more than half the city's operating budget, up from about 15 percent of the 2015 budget."

With contributions to the city's pension plan for government workers funded at only 34 to 35 percent of their liability — and since unions resist any cuts or givebacks — taxes must be raised to cover the shortfall. Raise taxes on job creators, and they leave. When they leave, they take their taxes with them, contributing to the city's further decline, the so-called "economic death spiral."

Nationwide, 10 percent of all parents have their kids in private schools. In Chicago, 39 percent of public school teachers with school-age children have their kids in private school.

So, what to do? Why,

find people from whom more taxes can be extracted, of course. As former Rep. Barney Frank, D-Mass., once put it, "There are a lot of very rich people out there who we can tax."

Economist Stephen Moore writes: "Massachusetts Sen. Elizabeth Warren appeared on one of the late night talk shows last week, beating the class warfare drum and arguing for billions of dollars in new social programs paid for with higher taxes on millionaires and billionaires. In recent years, though, blue states such as California, Illinois, Delaware, Connecticut, Hawaii, Maryland and Minnesota adopted this very strategy, and they raised taxes on their wealthy residents. How did it work out? Almost all of these states lag behind the national average in growth of jobs and incomes. So, if income redistribution policies are the solution to shrinking the gap between rich and poor, why do they fail so miserably in the states?"

When French President Francois Hollande imposed a 75 percent tax on the rich, the rich said adieu. The revenue from his "rich person's tax" fell well short of projections. Turns out, rich people aren't stupid, French or otherwise. But the lessons of France are lost on Chicago. The lessons of Chicago are lost on the American left.

Backbone: do you have one?

Have you ever cheated on a test? You know, let your eyes wander over to someone else's paper? Isn't it interesting how our eyes never wander on to someone's paper who makes lower grades than we do, but only strays to the smarter folks in the room. Well, that same thing can happen with the values we choose to live by and use to make life's decisions. Don't think so? The Bible has a perfect example of this type of lifestyle: King Joash of Judah, 2 Kgs. 11-12; 2 Chr. 22:10-24:27.

Joash, aka Jehoash, was the royal baby that the wife/husband team of Jehosheba and Jehoiada saved from certain death at the hands of Athaliah when she slaughtered all of the royal descendents in Judah because her son Ahaziah had been murdered by Jehu. Joash lived his first seven years hidden in the temple with Jehoiada as high priest. He then ruled over Judah for 40 years.

A summary of his reign is given in 2 Kgs. 12:2 and 2 Chr. 24:2. "Joash did what was right in the eyes of the LORD all the years Jehoiada the priest instructed him." The moment our eyes finish that sentence we immediately ask ourselves, "So what then happened after Jehoiada died?"

That answer is given in 2 Chr. 24:17-19. "After the death of Jehoiada, the officials of Judah came and paid homage to the king, and he listened to them. They abandoned the temple of the LORD, the God of their ancestors, and worshiped Asherah poles and idols. Because of their guilt, God's anger came on Judah and Jerusalem. Although the LORD sent prophets to the people to bring them back to him, and though they testified against them, they would not listen."

It turned out that every good thing that King Joash had ever done was only because Jehoiada was there

serving as King Joash's conscience and the source of the values he used to make all his decisions. Up until Jehoiada's death, no one really had a clue what was on the inside of King Joash except God. When the real Joash exploded he violated everything that his foster father and mentor had tried to teach him.

So what is the point for us today? God not only specializes in reading hearts and at all times knows who the REAL US is, but He bases His judgment of us on that internal examination. We can put on a show of godliness like King Joash did, but God will know better. Knowing the REAL US and not lying to ourselves is a very big deal.

Remember one more thing about King Joash. When the REAL JOASH broke loose from the chains of Jehoiada, he not only became an idol worshiper and led Judah in the same direction, but when Jehoiada's own son, Zechariah, came to pronounce Jehovah's words of condemnation, he hardened his heart and had him stoned to death. "King Joash did not remember the kindness Zechariah's father Jehoiada had shown him but killed his son, who said as he lay dying, "May the LORD see this and call you to account." 2 Chr. 24:22

What about your conscience and your values? Do you have your own or are you mooching off of someone else's? Do your values match God's values? Don't fool yourself into thinking that God is pleased with your good deeds that grow out of another person's values. He isn't. Get your own values and make sure that they match God's values. That way you won't have to spend eternity with Joash and you can get to know Jehoiada when you get to heaven. God bless.

Kids and sports: two forms of pride

Last week I said there were two emotions I experienced when I watched my daughter's first competitive softball game of the season. Then I specifically addressed the emotion of fear. I mentioned that many times we have so much fear for our kids that we prohibit them from failing. This also then prohibits them from learning from failure. I said that we should keep that emotion in check. This week I want to address the other emotion I experienced. That emotion was an overwhelming sense of pride. I also think this is an emotion we should keep in check.

The issue of pride was experienced in two ways.

First it was an overwhelming sense of pride for her. Something like, "She is good and we need everyone to know"

Let me go through a brief description of my thought process during the day and I think you will see why we should keep this emotion in check.

As I watched my daughter I started to think to myself, "WOW! This girl is good. She can throw the ball hard for her age. She can swing the bat well. Awesome! I think she could probably play in college. We need to take her to every practice and to additional lessons to ensure that she goes to college on a full-ride scholarship. As she gets better we can take her around the country playing games and getting her name out there. Then after college she can play professional."

That is where the train of thinking derailed in my mind. It brought me to reality. There is no professional opportunity for a girl who plays softball. Well there is one professional league. It is called National Pro Fast-pitch. It consists of five teams and the players make \$5000 to \$6000 per playing season (June-August). Like I said professional softball is not a real option.

So as my thought process brought me to the end result and reality set in I had to check my pride. Sure I am proud of her. Sure I am proud that she works hard and learns. But I do not want it to become a foolish pride that leads to thinking my kid is so good that she will play the game forever. It just is not true. I have to keep my pride in check.

This also goes for the boys too. We need parents to push their boys to be good but they must keep their pride in check. They must keep everything in perspective. Here are some statistics to help the parents of young athletes keep their pride in check.

- Only 2 percent of high school athletes are awarded sports scholarships at NCAA schools.

- "Full-ride" scholarships are the exception, not the rule. Plus, only six sports offer them (football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball, tennis and women's gymnastics).

- Most athletes have "partial scholarships" that only cover a portion of tuition.

- Of the athletes skilled enough to play in college, anywhere from one percent (basketball) to nine percent (baseball) will have enough game to play professionally.

- CNBC says your child has a better chance of being admitted to Harvard, Yale, Princeton or Stanford than receiving an athletic scholarship in a major sport.

These are the numbers. These are the facts. And yet many parents still believe that their kid is a two percent. Pride takes over and we do not allow ourselves to keep a good perspective about the real purpose of childhood athletics.

Checking my pride caused me to think differently. This is our family's new approach to childhood athletics. Athletics is part of life but it is not all of life. We will spend some money and time on athletics but we will not spend all of our money on athletics. The money we save from buying expensive equipment and expensive lessons is now placed in a fund. I imagine we will have her scholarship for school funded by the time she needs it.

Second, there was an overwhelming sense of pride for myself. I was thinking something like this, "Her mom and I did a good job

with her!"

The sense of pride for myself kept telling me that I had something to do with her natural talent. If you saw me throw a ball you would know immediately I did not have anything to do with it. Her mother is a different story. If you saw her mother throw you would know immediately where her abilities came from. But even then, we have to keep our pride in check. We have to admit that our role in creating this child was very small. God did all the work.

So to keep this aspect of pride in check I admit, yes, maybe she does have some talent. But it did not ultimately come from me. Neither is it to make me look good. God has given her a talent that she might use it for his glory and his purposes. My job in this is to teach her that lesson.

God has given your child or grandchild a talent. I know you know how easy it is to get so filled with pride that it leads to some crazy thinking. For some of you it leads to some crazy actions (I have been at the ball park. I know who you are). As we enter this spring ball season, let us remember to keep our pride in check. Remember that the Lord blesses our kids with talent and that talent is to point toward him and not toward our kids or ourselves.

Many of you are familiar with the name George Mueller, a man of childlike faith in God and His provision. On Dec. 2, 1835, Mueller felt led of God to open an orphanage.

The following was written by A. T. Pierson concerning the beginning days of faith in God's leadership and supply:

"While reading in the Psalms, he was struck with these words, "Open thy mouth wide, and I will fill it." (Psalm 8:10). From that moment this text formed one of his great life mottos, and this promise became a power in molding all his work. Before this, he had not prayed for the supply of money or of help. But now he was led to apply this Scripture confidently to this new plan and at once boldly asked for premises, for one thousand pounds in money, and for suitable helpers to take charge of the children. Two days after, he received, in furtherance of his work, the first gift of money – one shilling – and within two

days more the first donation in furniture – a large wardrobe."

The rest of George Mueller's life is living proof that God honors this text. By 1898, sixty-three years later, seven day schools had been established. There were 8,501 children in attendance. The orphanage had 10,024 children. Almost two million Bibles had been distributed.

God was faithful to His Word. Today God also delights in our faith in Him. He wants us to trust Him for every need. I can speak from 50 years of experience that God cares for us and is faithful. God can meet your need; He has promised to do so: "Open wide your mouth." Look to the Lord for help today.

Mature girls know to protect themselves when engaging in sexual activity. It is important that you be checked by a gynecologist for STDs and learn about effective birth control. If you don't have a doctor you can confide in, Planned Parenthood

can help you.

DEAR ABBY: I find myself in an interesting situation that I never thought could happen. I'm a 43-year-old gay male who had an extremely difficult time coming out when I was 19. My parents weren't initially supportive, but things did get better down the line.

I have had zero luck at any long-term gay relationships, but as I get older, my sex drive has diminished, and I think I'd be happy with a female companion — if sex wasn't a factor. What should I do? — INTERESTING CONDITION IN TEXAS

DEAR CONDITION: Gay men marrying straight women is not an unheard-of phenomenon, and neither are marriages in which sex is not a part of the picture. 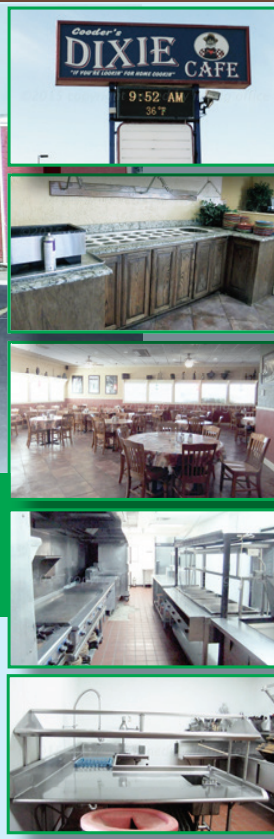

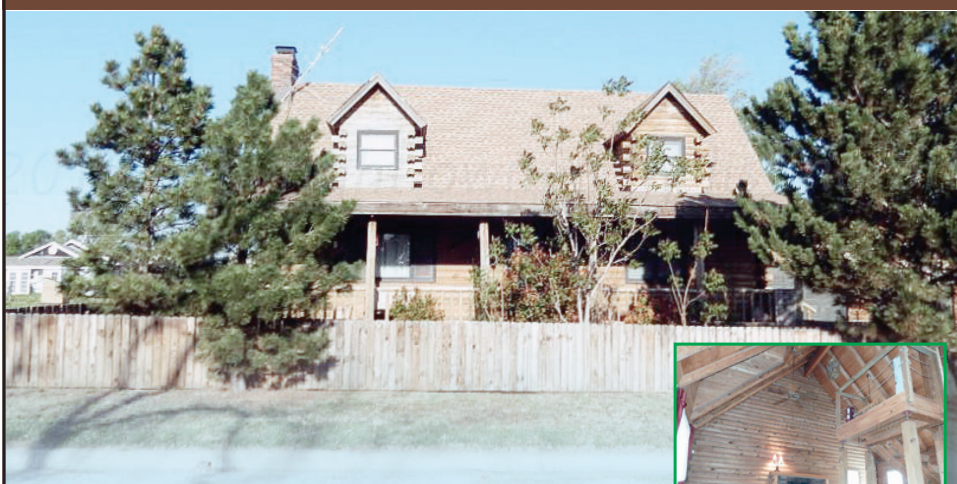

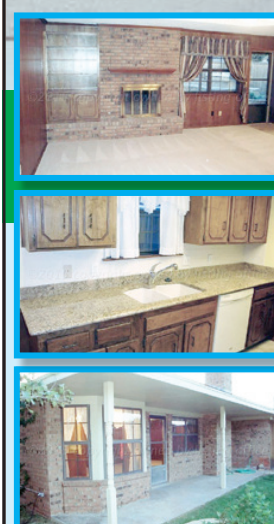
