## Texas Rodeo Bible Camp prepares for 14th year

During the summer there are a number of activities that children can go to and keep themselves busy; usually they are vacation bible schools or athletic camps.

Not many offer the services of both. Texas Rodeo Bible Camp offers just that.

Texas Rodeo Bible Camp will be held from June 28 to July 1 this month.

The mission of Texas Rodeo Bible Camp is to give young men and women, ages 13-18, the opportunity to improve their rodeo skills while they study and learn more about the Bible.

They are a four-day summer camp that houses and feeds about 50-75 people. Through their qualified Christian instructors the campers learn how to incorporate the Bible's teaching into their daily lives.

The camp belt buckles are offered a little differently than traditional rodeo belt buckles.

"Some kids come with rodeo skills, some come with no skills just wanting to learn," Kathleen Greene of Texas

## Pampa reminded of IRS scam calls

As the calendars have turned to June, the phone scams have not stopped. Unfortunately this also opens the door for scammers to call and try and trick taxpayers into paying more than what they should.



Local residents have received calls impersonating Internal Revenue Service. The phone calls are actually a computer generated message. The message tells you that you owe the IRS but doesn't

tell you how much. Then they request that you call 207-291-2911 and pay the amount owed with a credit card.

According to a local accountant, the IRS will contact you by mail if you owe money. If you do not respond in 30 days you will then receive a certified letter. If after an additional 30 days you do not respond then someone from an IRS office will come to your home. The IRS does not contact someone by phone or require immediate payment with a credit card.

Pampa Police Department is only aware of one IRS call recently, but is aware of multiple scams in recent months.

"The first is a Publishers Clearing House scam. On this one, the caller states that they are in town and are ready to deliver your check for several million dollars. They even provide

## Gov. Greg Abbott signs 'Pastor Protection Act' into law on Thursday

Gov. Greg Abbott, who signed a bill Thursday that allows clergy members to refuse to conduct marriages that violate their beliefs, said that "pastors now have the freedom to exercise their First Amendment rights."

The signing ceremony for the so-called Pastor Protection Act, which goes into effect Sept. 1, was

held outside the Governor's Mansion.

Abbott was surrounded by about two dozen clergy members at a news conference discussing the law. Others attending the signing ceremony included Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick, Attorney General Ken Paxton and Sen. Craig Estes, R-Wichita Falls, who authored the bill.

"Freedom of religion is the most sacred of our rights and our freedom to worship is secured by the Constitution," Abbott said.

"Religious leaders in the state of Texas must be absolutely secure

in the knowledge that religious freedom is beyond the reach of government or coercion by the courts."

With the signing of the bill, "Texas took a small but important step to further protect the religious freedom of clergy in the face of increasing hostility toward people of faith in all walks of life," Paxton said in a statement. "No Pastor, Priest, Rabbi or other religious leader should be forced to perform or recognize a marriage that contradicts his or her sincere religious belief."

Estes has said the bill is about

protecting pastors "who have a strong religious belief" against same-sex marriage.

State Rep. Celia Israel, D-Austin, said in a statement released Thursday that she believes it's possible to support both equality and religious liberty.

"Texans are ready for equality, and if this measure gives pastors a peace of mind, I welcome it becoming law," Israel said.

Critics had argued that Senate Bill 2065 attempts to make it difficult for same-sex couples to marry in Texas, in case the U.S. Supreme Court legalizes gay marriages.

Rodeo Bible Camp said. "Some buckles are given out based on what the team leaders and the instructors decide. There's buckles for every event and somebody who never rides through the whole thing may win a buckle because of their attitude. How they took part in the camp and how hard they tried."

One of the buckles is the Jim Greene Memorial Buckle, who is named after Kathleen's late husband, who started the camp. "It's like a 'walk the walk, talk the talk' buckle," Greene said. "For the

whole camp, it goes to the boy and the girl that they might have pitched in helping in the kitchen. Or helping in the arena."

There are also prizes given out based on how well the campers perform on activities such as Bible verse memorization.

There are also opportunities for scholarships for some of the older participants.

Entry into the camp costs \$150, but there is a \$25 late fee if registered after June 20.

This fee covers everything from their food cost, activity cost and they get a t-shirt and a cap with the camp.

The events include, for girls, barrel racing, goat

tying, breakaway roping and team roping.

For boys, the events are bareback/saddle broncs, bull riding, cowboy protection, calf roping, team roping and steer wrestling.

One of the unique components of the camp is that it helps the campers disconnect from society for a while.

"When they come to the camp they have to turn their cell phones in," Greene said. "If they have an emergency they can come to any of us and borrow our phone or we'll get their phone. The ones that drive have to park their vehicle and turn their keys in."

Greene said the campers don't complain about this

either.

"They're really hungry to hear from our praise and worship band."

The kids break up into groups of about five and learn from Christian-based literature.

Several of the team leaders have come through the camp themselves.

The camp is always looking for donations or volunteers.

you a description of your house and cars, believed to have been obtained from Google Maps, to make you believe the story. Then, you are asked to wire transfer about \$800 to them to cover the taxes and fees, which has to be done prior to them showing up at your doorstep to deliver the check.

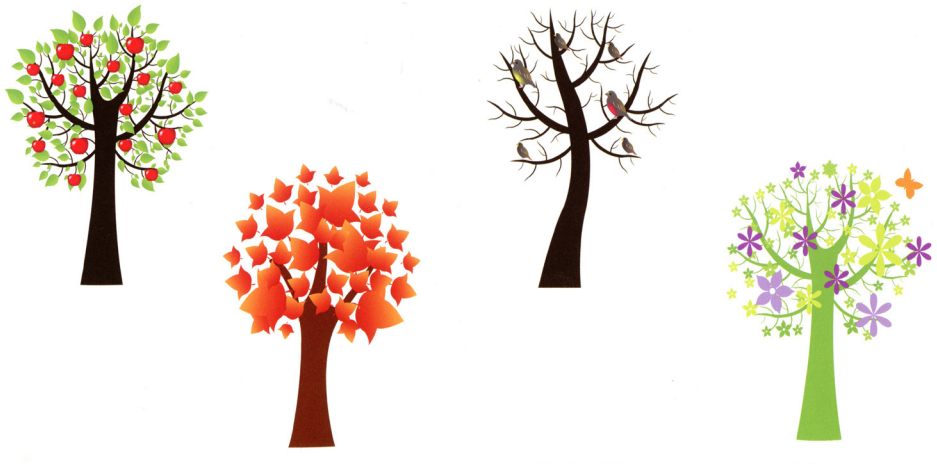
The next scam involves a call from someone claiming to be with the IRS, stating that you owe money in back taxes. They then demand you to wire transfer money to them immediately or face being arrested.

And the last scam is a check for several thousand dollars that arrives to you unexpectedly in the mail. The check comes with instructions to cash it, keep a certain amount, and then forward the balance to someone else via wire transfer," Pampa Police Department said in a press release.

"In each of these, you see one thing in common. 'Wire-transfer.' When trying to determine if a call or piece of mail is a scam or not, we urge you to stay away from anything that requires you to send a wire-transfer to someone. While there are legitimate reasons to use this method of sending money, the lack of being able to trace the transfer makes them very prone to criminal activity such as scams. We also remind you that if something seems too good to be true, then it more than likely is something you don't want any part of. In the case of scare tactic scams like the IRS scam, or the Xcel Energy scam from several weeks ago, simply hang up and call the company/agency's listed phone number to inquire about the matter yourself. Don't be pressured into giving them money or personal information without first taking the time to verify that they are who they say they are, and that they have a legitimate purpose or reason to obtain that from you."

# Wingstop shares advance following \$110 million IPO

NEW YORK (AP) — In the latest big debut for a "fast casual" restaurant company, shares of Wingstop are rocketing after the chicken wings chain said its initial public offering raised \$110.2 million.

Wingstop's offering of 5.8 million shares priced at \$19 per share. The company had expected the stock to price between \$16 and \$18 a share.

Its stock climbed \$10.90, or 57.4 percent, to \$29.90 in midday trading.

Restaurants that call themselves "fast casual" tout a more relaxed atmosphere and fast service than traditional restaurants combined with food that seems healthier or fresher than fast food. The style has grown in popularity in recent years, and older fast food

chains are also trying to refashion themselves to reflect the trend. It's also caught on with investors.

Wingstop is the fifth such company to go public with a \$100 million IPO since late 2013. All of those stocks did well on their first day of trading: shares of burger chain Shake Shack Inc. and sandwich maker Potbelly Corp. both more than doubled in value in their debuts, while chicken chain El Pollo Loco Holdings Inc. climbed about 60 percent and chicken and biscuits maker Bojangles Inc. advanced 25 percent.

Wingstop's restaurants serve 11 varieties of wings along with sides and seasoned fries, and the company calls itself the largest fast casual chicken wings restaurant

company in the world. It opened 100 restaurants in 2014 and currently has around 750 restaurants in the U.S. and five other countries. In its most recent quarter ended in March, the chain earned \$2.6 million, or 10 cents per share, on revenue of \$19 million. Sales in domestic stores open at least a year, a key metric of a retailer's health, rose 10.7 percent.

Most of the shares in the IPO are being sold by Wingstop shareholders. The Dallas-based company will get \$40.9 million in gross proceeds. It plans to use the funds to repay debt and for general corporate purposes.

Shares of Wingstop Inc. are listed on the Nasdaq Global Select Market under the ticker symbol "WING."

So far, I have only taken two pictures which I immediately posted on Facebook, but it’s nice not to have to haul out my camera, take the picture, download it to the computer and then share it, or using the old cell phone, email it to myself, save it to the computer, and then share it. I’m trying to control myself.

My daughter has linked my phone to the Internet, and I’m sure I’ll soon find myself getting some apps that are fun and practical. Maybe check radar for those thunderstorms that keep popping up on us when least expected.

I’m working now on getting a ring tone that is unique to me. It only took me two tries to learn how to shut the thing up when we’re in church. There are few things more embarrassing than having your cell phone start playing a clever tune during the silence of prayer.

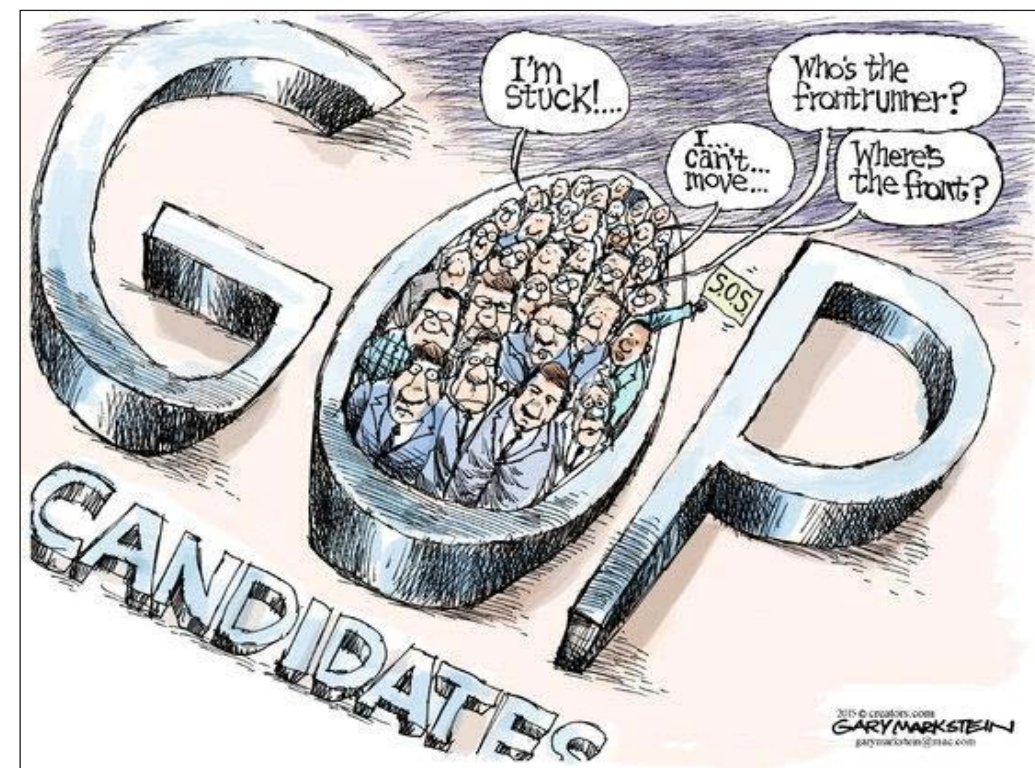

# From drought to rust, Texas A&M wheat breeders prepare for the elements

**SUBMITTED BY TEXAS A&M AGRILIFE EXTENSION AMARILLO** — The wheat breeding program in Texas is very diverse, and Texas A&M AgriLife Research scientists learn something every year from the changing environment. For the past four years, it was about drought; this year, with the moisture, it's about rust.

"We have to test a lot of environments," said Dr. Jackie Rudd, AgriLife Research wheat breeder in Amarillo. "Before we release a new variety, it has been through at least 50 different environ-

ments. "We learn something new every year. The last four years have been very dry and we gained a lot of information on drought tolerance. This year, however, we've been able to gain information on leaf rust, stripe rust and stem rust under the wetter conditions."

Rudd said the environmental differences from College Station all the way north to Amarillo provide more diversity than throughout the rest of the Great Plains region, "so that's really why our varieties are so adaptable to different areas."

Dr. Amir Ibrahim, AgriLife Research wheat

breeder in College Station, said wheat rusts, which are caused by a fungus, have a bulls'-eye target over Texas. The fungus can overwinter in much of the state because it doesn't usually get cold enough to kill it.

"This year we've learned a lot, continue to learn a lot, about how our varieties respond to rust," Rudd said. "We almost always have rust somewhere in Texas, but this year there's not a field in Texas that I've experienced that has not been affected by at least one of these."

Ibrahim said the first cases of rust this year showed up in the southern wheat growing regions as early as January, and Rudd said the stripe rust started showing up on wheat in the High Plains about three to four weeks ago.

Many producers sprayed for the fungus or they were growing a resistant variety, something both wheat breeders said has been good to demonstrate this year.

"That's what has been a major value this year to the breeding program,

seeing the varieties that have showed high resistance to stripe rust, such as TAM 114 here in the High Plains," Rudd said. "It remained green with leaves in many cases when varieties such as TAM 112, which we know is very susceptible to stripe rust, had leaves drying up and will certainly have a reduced yield."

If the stripe rust had come in earlier, it could have been a lot worse on some varieties in the High Plains, he said. The timing of the rust this year could mean grain fill will be a little less, but if fields lost the flag leaf to the fungus, there could have been up to 20 percent yield loss.

"The cool wet May that we had increased the fungus, but the 90 degree days that we are having now should reduce the spread of the stripe rust," Rudd said.

Ibrahim said they have recently released a cultivar of winter wheat — TAM 305 — that is resistant to stem and leaf rust. Adult plants are resistant to stripe rust as well.

"With this adult plant

resistance, there may have been some symptoms in the field, but those symptoms did not spread very fast and the yield loss was minimal," he said.

Ibrahim said this year's rust nursery at Castroville was the most interesting he has seen at that location. It has been raining continuously, and cooling and warming throughout the season there.

"This was perhaps shifting the disease agents' dynamics and overwhelming the leaves with drying and new infections," he said. "Leaves of susceptible germplasm were overwhelmed with a combination of stripe rust that came early, leaf rust, bacterial leaf streak and septoria."

Ibrahim also indicated that these conditions provided an incredible opportunity to all U.S. Great Plains programs evaluating material at Castroville to make progress against a plethora of fungal and bacterial diseases.

Rudd said it is good for the breeding program to be able to see the rusts under field conditions.

"This really highlights the value of resistance, which is something our breeding program has been strongly working towards," he said. "The majority of our new wheat varietal releases are leaf rust, stem rust and stripe rust resistant."

Both Rudd and Ibrahim pointed out how important that is, not just for Texas producers, but wheat producers across the Great Plains.

Ibrahim said as Texas warms, the rust spores begin to germinate and can be blown by the wind to states like Oklahoma, Nebraska, Kansas and the Dakotas. If the spread of rusts isn't controlled in Texas, wheat crops across the continent can be affected.

"We develop a lot of the inoculum that spreads throughout the Great Plains with wheat crop progression," Rudd said. "We are pleased with our progress and what we are seeing here, but we need to remain vigilant. There are many forms of the rust fungus out there, and we as wheat breeders need to 'up our game' to stay ahead."

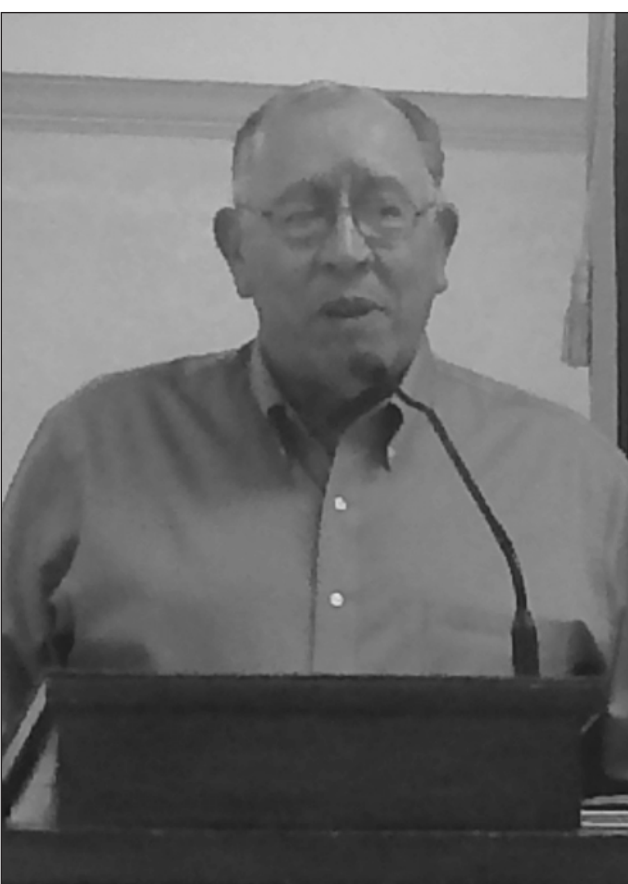

## Prison instructor emerges as central figure in escape probe

DANNEMORA, N.Y. (AP) — In the months before two convicted killers' escape, prison tailor-shop instructor Joyce Mitchell was investigated over a possible relationship with one of the men, authorities say.

Now the 51-year-old woman has become a central figure in the escape probe, suspected of aiding the breakout by supplying the two inmates with prohibited items and agreeing at one point to be the getaway driver.

District Attorney Andrew Wylie said Friday he is considering charges against her.

Authorities are "learning more and more information each day from her, as far as establishing a timeline on how this process occurred and what her involvement was," he said.

Mitchell's family has said she wouldn't have helped the convicts break out.

Meanwhile, the hunt for the inmates refocused on

a new area after residents reported seeing two men jumping a stone wall outside the far northern New York town of Dannemora, where David Sweat and Richard Matt cut their way out of their cells last weekend. About 300 searchers were added, bringing the total number of state, federal and local law enforcement officers involved in the manhunt to more than 800.

Mitchell has a \$56,000-a-year job overseeing inmates who sew clothes and learn to repair sewing machines at the maximum-security Clinton Correctional Facility.

Within the past year, officials looked into whether Mitchell had improper ties to the 34-year-old Sweat, who was serving a life sentence for killing a sheriff's deputy, Wylie said. He gave no details on the nature of the suspected relationship.

The investigation didn't turn up anything solid enough to warrant disciplinary charges against

her, the district attorney said.

"But action, I think, was taken to separate the two of them for a period," he said.

The state corrections department would not comment on the investigation.

Wylie would not specify what contraband items he believes Mitchell supplied to the killers for their escape, except to say that the objects weren't the power tools the two used to cut through steel, bricks and a steam pipe.

Prison contraband can include such things as cellphones, weapons, drugs, tools and unauthorized clothing.

On Thursday, a person close to the investigation said that Mitchell had befriended the two men and agreed to be the getaway driver but never showed up. The person was not authorized to discuss the case and spoke on condition of anonymity.

Wylie said he may charge Mitchell with promoting prison contraband

and hindering prosecution by helping the men escape. Each charge carries up to seven years in prison.

A former slipper-factory employee who won three terms as tax collector in her town near Dannemora, Mitchell has worked at the prison for at least five years, according to a neighbor, Sharon Currier. Mitchell's husband, Lyle, also works in industrial training there.

"She's a good, good person," Currier said. "She's not somebody who's off the wall."

The garment shop is intended to give prisoners job skills and work habits. In general, an inmate assigned to such a job might work several hours a day there, five days a week, meaning he would have significant contact with supervisors.

Mitchell's union, Civil Service Employees Association Local 1000, would not comment Friday on the prior investigation of Mitchell or the current allegations.

### Triple Crown winner American Pharoah jogs at Churchill Downs

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — American Pharoah looked strong and fresh in his first exercise as a Triple Crown champion before meeting a veterinarian who has seen six of his brethren.

After several days of walking around Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert's Barn 33, the bay colt returned to the dirt Friday morning for a clockwise jog before reporters and adoring fans as the sun rose over Churchill Downs.

Like many moments throughout his triumphant run this spring, American Pharoah was calm after the work.

"He still looks like the picture of health," Baffert said of the horse while standing in front of plaques marking his achievement. "He's starting to get better, and that shows what he's made of. He's still happy

and is enjoying the track." American Pharoah is still basking in the afterglow of his achievement.

After getting his public bath before a group of camera-clicking spectators, he posed for pictures with fans young and old and relished the gentle pats and kisses on his cheek.

The horse's laid-back demeanor through all the oohs and ahhs certainly impressed Lexington veterinarian William McGee, 98, who recalls seeing or treating at least six Triple Crown champions in his career.

American Pharoah calmly walked over to McGee's wheelchair and coozied up to him for a pat on the head that confirmed McGee's belief in how special he is. "His temperament is outstanding," McGee said. "Most horses just won't stand for the closeness of people as he did. I look for

the best from him." The public will get its chance to congratulate horse racing's 12th Triple Crown winner Saturday night as American Pharoah parades around the famed track before his connections receive gold and silver trophies for last month's Kentucky Derby victory.

His name has already been added in gold letters to a ring of fame with previous Triple Crown champions in the paddock area, and he wore a Triple Crown blanket before being led back to his stall.

A resident at Baffert's barn since late April, American Pharoah will leave Louisville June 18 to return to California to prepare for his next phase of competition.

Though the trainer said the horse will definitely compete in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland

in Lexington this fall, his summer schedule is undecided.

"The goal is to bring him back healthy," said Baffert, joking that he wants to put the champion "in bubble wrap" to protect him.

"I don't want to get ahead of myself. I just want to see how he responds."

If Friday's brief jog around Churchill Downs offered any clues, American Pharoah seemed to be refreshed from the 1½-mile Belmont Stakes that he won by 5½ lengths. He seemed to glide while going around the outside of the main track in the opposite direction of many horses and looked as if he could've gone farther if asked.

That will come in time for the champion, who just needed to stretch his legs again.

### Porsche chasing first victory in 17 years at Le Mans

LE MANS, France (AP) — Brace for a tough fight between Porsche and Audi at the 24 Hours Le Mans this weekend.

Porsche, the most successful manufacturer at Le Mans with 16 titles, will have its trio of 919 Hybrids on the top three positions of the grid on Saturday after Neel Jani, Romain Dumas, and Marc Lieb posted the fastest time in qualifying.

Audi, which has dominated the world's most famous endurance race over the past 15 years, sealed the next three spots.

"To be in pole position in the 24 Hours of Le Mans, with a mythical brand such as Porsche, is exceptional," Jani said.

With a fastest lap of 3

minutes 16:887 seconds at the 13.6-kilometer circuit, Jani set a new record for an LM P1 car in qualifying, and became the first Swiss driver since Jo Siffert in 1968 to secure pole position at the western France track.

"Now we are aware that the hardest is yet to come," Jani said.

In its return to Le Mans after a 16-year absence in the top category, Porsche missed out on victory last year after its leading car was stuck in the pits because of a mechanical problem as Marcel Fassler, Andre Lotterer, and Benoit Treluyer drove Audi to its fifth straight title.

This year is different, with the three Porsches having improved their reliability,

and said to hold a speed advantage on the long straight lines of the circuit.

"People have great expectations of us, we have a sensational record here in the past," said former Formula One driver Mark Webber, who will drive Porsche No. 17 from the second spot with Brendon Hartley and Timo Bernhard.

Behind them in third will be the No. 19 Porsche driven by Nick Tandy, Earl Bamber and Nico Hulkenberg.

"Porsche is synonymous with success here. It's a great burden for us to carry, we're proud of that, but it's not something that will guarantee us results on Sunday," Webber said.

Behind the two German manufacturers, Toyota is betting on reliability rather than speed to defy the odds, with its two hybrid cars starting from seventh and eighth.

"If we really focused on qualifying we could have been quite a bit closer, but that wasn't the target," said Anthony Davidson, teaming up with world endurance co-champion Sebastien Buemi and Kazuki Nakajima.

## Media group asks judge to unseal former Patriot Aaron Hernandez juror documents

FALL RIVER, Mass. (AP) — A media group has asked a judge to unseal documents relating to a juror in ex-New England Patriots star Aaron Hernandez's recent murder trial in Massachusetts.

GateHouse Media argued Friday before Superior Court Judge Susan Garsh that information about the unidentified juror must be made public, citing the First Amendment. Hernandez lawyer

James Sultan filed papers under seal requesting an inquiry into a juror's "exposure to significant extraneous matter." Sultan hasn't disclosed details about the issue, and prosecutors have

said they don't know, either. GateHouse Media attorney Zack Kleinsasser says Hernandez's attorneys haven't shown why the documents need to be sealed and haven't provided alter-

natives, such as redaction. Garsh took the arguments under advisement. Hernandez was convicted of killing Odin Lloyd in 2013. He was sentenced to life in prison.

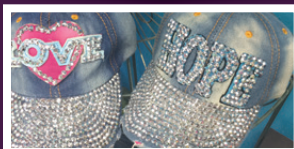
