## BECAUSE . . .

1. The West Ward School building is a fire trap.
2. Too many boys and girls are crowded into a limited number of rooms in this building.
3. The 5 th and 6 th grade pupils should be taken out of Junior High School and placed in elementary schools.
4. All 8th grade students should be placed in the Junior High School.
5. Drinking facilities at the West Ward School building are not adequate for the children.
6. Rest room facilities in the West Ward building are inadequate to take care of the children.
7. Out-moded heating system in building not being used at present. Heat to rooms being furnished by plant in high school building, and relayed to West Ward.
8. Electrical system in this building inadequate and an overloaded condition exists when most of the lights are turned on.
9. Inadequate parking and bus loading space under present set-up
10. Location on main street creates a traffic hazard for the young children.
11. No way to beautify or landscape the building.
12. We think our children are entitled to the modern facilities that other schools provide.
