





Enlistments And Separations For **November Listed**

he trmed forces reported 3,988 exans as entering on active duty aring November, while at the ame time reporting 5,368 as beng separated.

According to a report mailed to at onal Selective Service headarters by Brigadier General aul L. Wakefield, state Selective vice director, Texas in Noember inducted 1,027 men into ic army, other states drafting 38 exans on transfer.

The Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, and Coast Guard enisted a larger number of men who call Texas their home statea total of 2,923. More went into the Air Force than any other uniormed service.

According to the reports received from the different services more men were separated from the Army than from the other services. Total separation of Texans in all forces exceeded entries by 1,380 individuals

Texas draft boards sent 2,444 men for pre-induction examinations in November, and the Army turned down 892, or approximately 36 per cent, as unacceptable for service.

"The armed forces makes the decision as to acceptability," General Wakefield commented, "not Selective Service.

Three Texas physicians and two dntists were reported as commissioned in the armed forces in November after an order to report for induction had been issued.

A great many changes have occurred in the world during the past two thousand years and quite a number of them can safely be said to have come about because of the birth of an infant in Bethlehem. At the time of the Christ Child's birth, human rights and dignity apparently were non-existent as far as large numbers of persons were concerned. In far too many instances, poor people were no more than the pawns of the ruling classes, to be treated as the rulers saw fit, sometimes as slave laborers, sometimes as fighters in wars which were fought to perpetuate cruel dynasties or to gain more power and possessions for their masters. If cruelty or battle did not get them, disease and sickness frequently consumed them, because once they fell prey to some serious ailment, their usefulness was gone, so few cared what happened to them-certainly, not their rulers.

As a matter of fact, a study of history would indicate that the lot of mankind continued to be a fairly unhappy one until only a century or two ago. But then, increasing numbers of people began to hear about and to study the teachings of Christ. Gradually, His influence spread until today it is a major factor in millions of persons' lives, and in addition affects many the grocer, the bank teller and is now an internationally-famous others to a greater or lesser extent.

The same, more or less, holds true with nations. There are some in which Christianity has played a vital part, while there are others where it has little impact, sometimes because other religious beliefs already are entrenched, sometimes because the Christian religion is relatively unknown, and sometimes because its teachings have been banned by governments.

The most spectacular outdoor displays in the United States are at the White House and Rockefeller Center in New York. The New York display is possibly the most elaborate in the world.

But it was the small towns that first thought of the idea.

Today, nearly every community in the land has some kind of Christmas decorations. Many communities string colored lights across the street and decorate light posts with evergreens. Many suspend bells and stars at street intersections and have dazzling community trees.

Christmas Candles Are Traditional For Many Peoples

To learn your luck for the year they say, Burn . bayberry dip on Christma:

day.

If the flame burns bright and the light shines clear,
Good luck will be yours through the year."

This old verse is believed in many lands around the world and is said to be one of the reasons that candles in homes are traditional around the world

The custom is believed to have started in Ireland As the Irish put it: "Who knows on som Christmas Eve. Jesus and Mary and Joseph may come again, not to Palestine, but to the Holy Isle on the fartherest edge of Europe And it is the custom that the can dle can only be snuffed by one named Mary

Their first use for Christmas is not recorded in the annals of any nation, but that the "Christ Child Candle," burned in the window on Christmas Eve is, according to an old legend placed there to light His way if He makes an earthly visitation and in atonemen for the night of His birth when there was no room for Him.

Dr. Clement Moore Was Ashamed of His Famous Poem

Dr. Clement Clarke Moore was ashamed of his famous poem, "Night Before Christmas" and would not acknowledge that he

wrote it for more than 20 years. Today, the poem which begins-Twas the night before Christmas, when all through the house

Not a creature was stirring, not is one of the most beloved of all

Christmas writings. Dr. Moore was an aloof professor of Greek and Oriental literature in the Episcopal Seminary in New York. He wrote the poem on Christmas Eve 1822 and read it

to his seven children. He had not planned for the poem to go further than his own family, but a relative who was visiting the Moores put a copy in her diary. The next year the relative's father

sent it to a newspaper. Other newspapers printed the lingles and they quickly became known all over the country. The dignified Dr. Moore was embar rassed and considered it beneath a man of his scholastic standing to be the author of children's fingles.

Twenty-two years later, how ever, he finally publicly admitted authorship of the jingles and it his name for the first time.

Joseph Proved His Love for Mary, Mother of Jesus

Joseph, the bible relates, had to prove his faith in and love for Mary before they were married. It is one of the great love stories of all times.



Cut meat (or break fish) into bite size pieces. Put a layer of meat, chopped onion, grated cheese and corn over bread. Repeat layers. Beat eggs and add salt and milk. Pour over mixture in baking dish. Bake in a moderate oven (350°F.) about 30 to 35 minutes. Serve at once. Six servings.

Tropical Shortcake: Mix a pound can of drained fruit cocktail with a diced banana and a cup of sweetened whipped cream. Cut a can of date nut bread into 12 thin slices. For each serving put fruit mixture between two slices and heaped on top. Six servings.





Christmas Card Idea Originated By Englishman

This simple idea of wishing your triends a Merry Christmas brought honor and knighthood to the originator, Henry Cole, a middleclass Englishman

Cole mailed his cards on a December day in 1846. The cards depicted a Victorian family assemled at the festive board and the traditional Christmas custom of giving to the poor. They also bore the now-classic greeting: "A Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year

He had a thousand of the cards struck off by a lithograph. They were such a success that plain Henry Cole subsequently became Sir Henry Cole.

The cards we send today, however, a far cry from those mailed by Cole. The cards you send and receive this year will be designed by famous names in contemporary

An American shopping for cards this year may select scenes painted by such famous people as Winston Churchill, Britain's prime minister and famed amateur artist, and Grandma Moses, one of America's most famous artists.

This year millions of Amerteans have received a letter from their local chapter of the National Tuberculosis association containing Christmas seals, the seasonal reminder of the never-ending fight to stamp out the disease.

The idea was conceived by a Danish postal clerk He thought of the idea in 1903 while mailing Christmas packages and letters.

The clerk was Einar Holboell He mentioned it to his fellow workers and they decided it would be a great help in defraying the cost f fighting tuberculosis. The idea eached King Chrisian, who apeved, and the image of Queen ourse was paced on the first seals in 1904

Jacob Rits. Danish-born American, heard about the idea and sold it to the American public in 1907 through a magazine article. A Red Cross worker, Miss Emily Bissell, started the first American sales that year
